GARDENING IN APRIL

Vegetables: Broad Beans, unlike other beans, prefer a cool climate and are ready to pick late winter or early spring when vegetables are scarce. Before planting them, give the soil a good liming and also add some complete fertiliser. They don't like a high nitrogen fertiliser as this promotes leaves at the expense of flowers.

Other veggies to plant are peas, cabbage and onions (mainly white and odourless). Greenfeast peas should be sown in tow rows close to each other for support and if you have a fence or wall which gets plenty of winter sunshine, grow Telephone climbing peas, they produce a big crop and are worthwhile growing. They prefer a soil which has had a light dressing of lime and complete fertiliser.

Flowers: Seedlings available now are Alyssum, Canterbury Bells, Carnations, Cornflower, Delphinium, Dianthus, Hollyhock, Russell Lupins, Pansy, Viola, Primula, Snapdragon, Stock and Wallflower.

Seeds of Sweet Pea can now be sown. Like vegetables, they prefer a soil containing compost, lime and a complete fertiliser. When first planting, give them a light watering and no more until they appear through the ground.

LIBRARY NEWS

The Summer Game : Cricket in Australia: Origins to bodyline

22 April to 6 May 1999.

For 200 years the sound of leather on willow has heralded the onset of summer in Australia. Cricket, Australia's premier summer sport will be celebrated in the forthcoming display at the Goulburn Branch Library.

Drawing on the collections of the State Library of NSW, **The Summer Game** touring display will be accompanied by a collection of local memorabilia, courtesy of the Goulburn Cricket Association, and the Library's own collection of player biographies, cricketing history and anecdotes.

Tracing the development of cricket in Australia from its beginnings in the colonial era to the famous bodyline series of 1932-33, **The Summer Game** will examine significant moments and players in Australian cricket. It will showcase facsimiles of 28 rare works including paintings, letters, cigarette cards, scorecards, photographs, autographs and caricatures from the Library's collections.

The Summer Game will provide a rare chance for lovers of our national game to gain an appreciation of the role cricket has played in Australia's culture and history. It will profile some of the legendary players of the past, the forerunners of today's heroes.

Bush Fire Equipment Bid

Council's Bush Fire Committee is proposing to Council that a bid for \$524,352.00 (subject to Council's agreement at this month's meeting) be put to the NSW Commissioner for Rural Fire Services for the 1999/2000 year.

The bid includes a Category Two tanker for the Bungonia Brigade, valued at \$136,000.00.

Each brigade also receives an allocation for the purchase of small items and this is to be increased from \$1000 to \$1250 for next year.

I would be most surprised if the full amount of the bid were received from the Commissioner, but even so, I'm sure Bungonia's tanker will stay on the list.

It takes a considerable time for the wheels of the public service to turn these bids into reality and this means that next fire season we will still need to make do with the tankers we currently have.

But by the end of 2000, and with some luck much sooner, the tanker should be here.

Noxious Weeds

Council has ratified a series of weed control plans as part of a regional approach through the Southern Tablelands and South Coast Noxious Plants Committee.

Essentially the plans aim to develop control programs over a larger geographic area which would be a more effective approach than the current locally based activities and could attract more funding.

They also recognise that these weeds are costing the State around \$600 million a year in lost production and cost of control while the annual allocation for control amounts to only \$6.4 million State wide.

Anyone interested in more detail can get copies of the plans from Council.

Sydney's Water

Yet another committee has been established! This one includes representation from all Councils within the water catchment areas for Sydney's drinking water and will be participating in the preparation of a regional environmental plan (REP) to protect the catchment.

The entire catchment spans an area of some 15,000 kms² and includes the water supplies of all centres along the way, including Goulburn, Marulan, Bowral, Mittagong, Wollongong and the Blue Mountains.

Mulwaree's representative will be General Manager, Col Wotton.

The Right to Farm

The Minister for Agriculture is considering some sort of official recognition for farmers to have the "right to farm".

Strange as it may seem to those who have lived on the land all their lives, there is some sense in this.

If you think about all the subdivision of lands and diversification that has been steadily taking place throughout the country, and couple this with new settlers who move out to the bush for some peace and quiet, you can see potential for conflict.

Mulwaree Council has been one step ahead of the Minister in its policies and has been developing guidelines for exactly that purpose.

Some examples are the recent spate of applications for poultry farms. Here Council has set minimum standards so that the properties are large enough to allow an adequate buffer between the farm operation and neighbouring properties. Environmental controls and landscaping requirements also minimise any perceived ill effects.

Woodlawn Mine Site

You will recall some months ago

that the Woodlawn site was proposed for landfill and waste management centre by Collex.

Several other sites around the State were also on the drawing board. Now, after several hitches, Woodlawn is back in contention.

We have studied the documentation, inspected the site, and received the Environmental Impact Statement, and the Minister for Urban Affairs and Planning (who will be the ultimate consent authority) has established a Commission of Inquiry into the proposal.

Council is supporting the proposal and, if it goes ahead, will apply to the EPA to be the supervisory licence holder for the facility. (Supervision is required under the Waste Minimisation and Management Act.)

Proposed Road Names

Council has adopted draft names for two unnamed roads in the Bungonia area:

- Oak Valley Road - off Jerrara Road, 6.2 kms from the Hume Highway
- Eliza Champion Street - leading north off King Street, Bungonia

Compensation

In two consecutive years (June 1997 and August 1998) the Shire's roads took a hammering in severe storms and flooding.

The RTA have finally come good with some funding for restoration works. Naturally, we'd like more, but here is what we got:

Local roads (1997) \$82,855
Regional roads (1998) \$25,197
Local roads (1998) \$85,953.

VISIT BY INDIAN DELEGATION WITH MELBOURNE UNIVERSITY.

Inverary hosted a group of Indian delegates interested in Landcare and Farm Forestry. It was certainly interesting to compare their conditions with ours.

VISIT BY SHOALHAVEN C.M.C.

A bus load of C.M.C. members from Upper Shoalhaven and South Coast spent a couple of hours seeing first hand several tree plantings and erosion programmes in the Winston paddock on Limekiln Creek. The group welcomed the chance to show off the ground work completed with grant funds.

NATIVE VEGETATION INCENTIVE SCHEME.

Two members will be using this scheme to fence out and manage significant areas of native vegetation. This scheme is offered to all landholders willing to fence out and manage native vegetation under an agreement with DLWC. This will be covered in a later field day. Grants of up to \$10,000 are available for selected projects.

RESULTS OF FARM FORESTRY WORKSHOPS.

These were conducted by Bureau of Resource Science at Tumut showed at last the government is moving more quickly towards the 2020 Vision of trebling forestry plantings by 2020. The main recommendations enforces our own idea that at present we are over regulated. The problem of satisfying council D.A.'s is compounded by Native Vegetation Act, Sydney Water Act, EPA, Cultural Heritage, Endangered Species as well as NPWS etc. The workshops endorsed a policy of one department handling forestry and that farm forestry on private land should be treated as another farm crop with no approval needed. A second meeting at Goulburn will again discuss the promotion more relevant to this area.

VISIT BY TASMANIAN C.M.C. OFFICAL.

Again this gave us a chance to show some of the impressive land reclamation project in the "Gully from Hell"

MULWAREE SHIRE -- FORESTRY POLICY.

Any forestry development over 5 hectares now requires Council approval -- get full details from the Council.

LANDCARE RESOURCE CENTRE.

Work has already commenced on a 12x6m lock up shed to house all Landcare equipment as well as a venue for field days and visiting groups. When complete it will be used for all meetings and field days.

LOWER RAINFALL FORESTRY SPECIES.

Funding has been requested to include lower rainfall species such as P. pinaster, P. brutia, P. halponsis and other Mediterranean species in future plantings. These can be assessed against P. radiata and local eucalypt species for their suitability as a plantation species.

FIRST FIELD DAY FOR 1999.

This will be held in the new Resource Centre and will concentrate on all aspects of P. radiata establishment and care.

The date for this will be announced in the next issue.



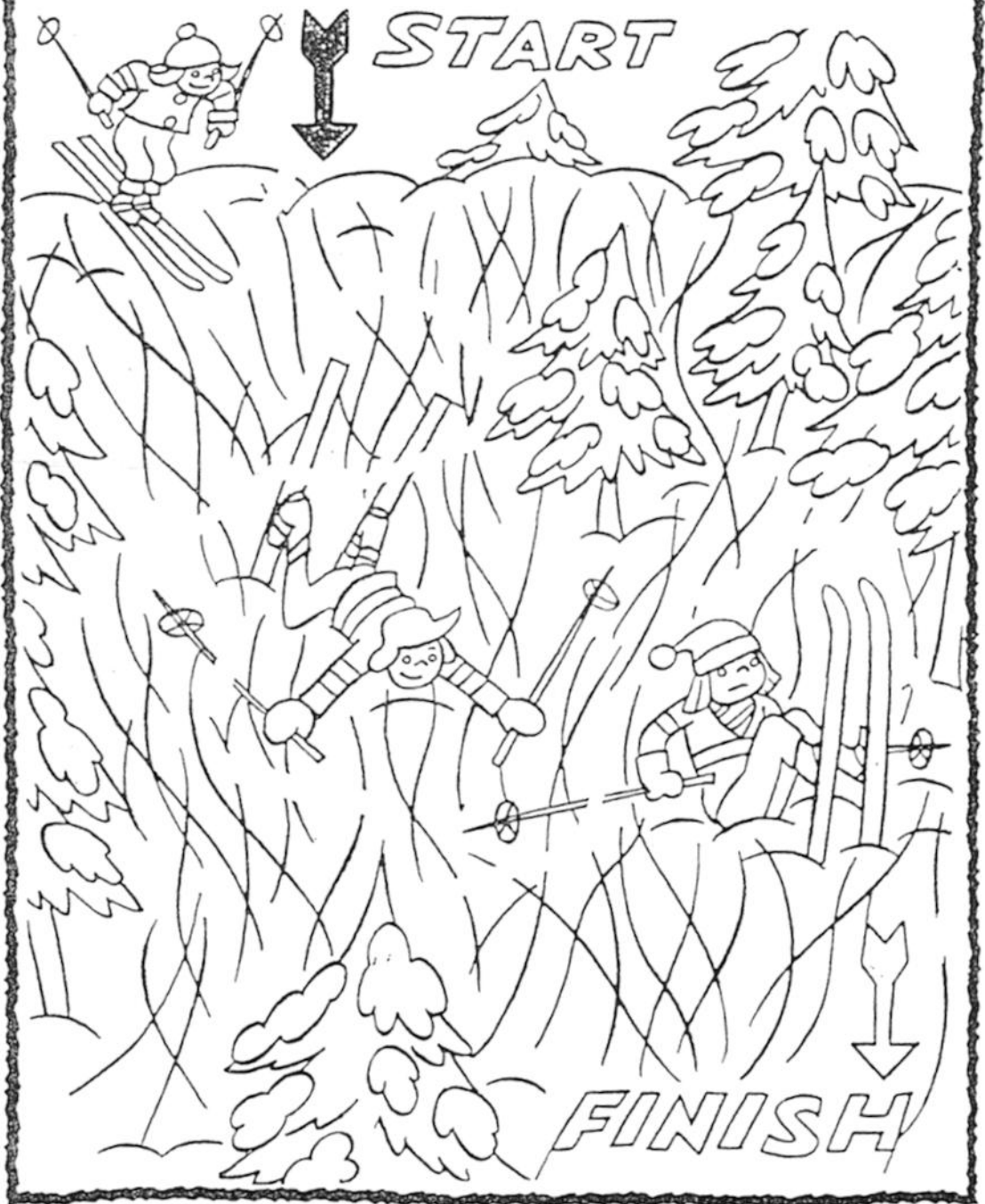
