## LOCAL HISTORY

### SCHOOLS IN THE BUNGONIA DISTRICT

The early settlers in the Bungonia District were very strong in their demands for schools in the area. There were a number of half time schools for example Inverary, Argyle and Jacqua , as well as schools in the village. One of the village schools was the Catholic school situated between the creek and St. Michael's Catholic Church. The following is an extract from State Records Reference 4/3293 Letter 55/10326.

Statistics of Schools inspected by the Commissioners appointed to report on the state of Education in the Colony of New South Wales in the year 1855.

Bungonia report was written on 12<sup>th</sup> June 1855.

The teacher was Joseph Carney, a married man aged 36, with two children. He was appointed in August, 1853. Although not examined and not trained he was appointed by the head of the denomination. Prior to being appointed he had no previous occupation. He was paid fifty two pounds, ten shillings per year and forty five from fees. Other than school he was a clerk of the church. His discipline in regularity and punctuality was bad but cleanliness and order were good.

The school was on a crown grant. It was 27 x 17, in a bad state of repair and had been established in 1851. There were no necessary outbuildings. Accommodation was provided for 46 children but only 44 were on the books, 31 Catholic and 3 Church of England. The average attendance was 33. thirty of whom were paying fees of four and a half pence per week. On the day of the inspection 13 boys and 17 girls were present.

The school was conducted on a mixed system. There were insufficient books apparatus and school fittings.

The teacher taught 6 hours per day, had one day off each week and 21 days during the year.

There were five classes taught by Joseph Carney (the only teacher). He kept a D B Roll and was unable to say how long the children remained at school."

The written report accompanying the above report states:

"Bungonia- This school is held in an unfinished slab building of good form and size. There are no outbuildings. It is wretchedly provided with furniture, apparatus and books. The master is obliged to use the school room as a kitchen, having only one apartment for himself, wife and two children. The children read and understand the lesson fairly well and spell well. The writing is good. Little progress has been made in arithmetic, but the upper class have a fair acquaintance with grammar and geography. The attendance of the children is irregular and unpunctual, but they are clean and orderly. The Master is a respectable and intelligent man but his efficiency is hindered by the untoward circumstance in which he is placed."

## GARDENING IN APRIL

Vegetables: Broad Beans, unlike other beans, prefer a cool climate and are ready to pick late winter or early spring when vegetables are scarce. Before planting them, give the soil a good liming and also add some complete fertiliser. They don't like a high nitrogen fertiliser as this promotes leaves at the expense of flowers.

Other veggies to plant are peas, cabbage and onions (mainly white and odourless). Greenfeast peas should be sown in tow rows close to each other for support and if you have a fence or wall which gets plenty of winter sunshine, grow Telephone climbing peas, they produce a big crop and are worthwhile growing. They prefer a soil which has had a light dressing of lime and complete fertiliser.

Flowers: Seedlings available now are Alyssum, Canterbury Bells, Carnations, Cornflower, Delphinium, Dianthus, Hollyhock, Russell Lupins, Pansy, Viola, Primula, Snapdragon, Stock and Wallflower.

Seeds of Sweet Pea can now be sown. Like vegetables, they prefer a soil containing compost, lime and a complete fertiliser. When first planting, give them a light watering and no more until they appear through the ground.

**APRIL REPORT****END OF A DECADE OF LANDCARE ?**

The recent conference in Melbourne with the presentation of Landcare Awards has completed the so called "decade of Landcare". Maybe it is now time to consider on a local basis of what has been achieved in the 90's

The Inverary Creek Group has certainly made an impact on local degradation on our small area with extensive earth works and tree plantings, but when you look at the area as a whole probably we are still scratching at the edges of the problem. There are now almost 5000 Landcare Groups with an estimated 1 in 3 farmers somehow involved Australia wide. These people must be congratulated on what has been achieved with very limited resources, but despite their efforts we have been unable to slow the tide of land, water and biodiversity degradation. The Federal Government has now recognised the problem by issuing a discussion paper "Managing Natural Resources in Rural Australia for a Sustainable Future". They are saying despite all the work that has been done, degradation is continuing, but I suppose they at least have recognised there is a problem, which is a positive.

After battling through the 97 pages, discussing strategies and visions for future management, there seems a very obvious weakness. They fail to recognise landholders, and in particular farmers and graziers as the most important players in any effort to have some impact on land degradation. They are the caretakers of most land and if they are not willing partners in preventing and recovering degradation it won't happen. In the policy document landholders are referred to in a peripheral sense around new regional bodies and strategic plans.

What has happened in our area is a good example. For 3 years we were included in the Upper Shoalhaven, an area extending from Marulan to beyond Braidwood and had local representation. This area was then extended in 1999 to encompass all the Shoalhaven and many small estuarine catchments, which was workable if not preferable. The C.M.C.'s have now been dismantled to be replaced by larger regional bodies -- our area includes the Shoalhaven, Illawarra and Southern Sydney to Botany bay. It is unlikely there will be any local representation at all, hence not much chance of involvement in policy development.

The Government policy document referred to is out now for comment -- it will possibly be adopted and guide future directions for 10-15 years.

**UP DATE ON INVERARY GROUP.**

So far we have been promised a small grant for Acacia trials from S.O.C.O.G. and a C.M.C. grant for farm forestry, which will include trials on *P. pinaster* and *p. brutia*, both species which should be suitable for this area. They can be compared to *P. radiata* which we know will grow successfully.

A Field Day on all aspects of farm forestry will be held in conjunction with S.T.F.F.N. on June 11<sup>th</sup> -- everyone welcome so watch for further details later.

Training courses are still being investigated. We hope to begin with pruning and chain saw courses later this year when funding, hopefully will be available. Details on the field day. Anyone with 1994 or earlier plantings should now be looking at the first prune. The 1995 trials on Yellow Dam, Inverary Road, will be pruned in the coming months.

# In Council with Inda Evans

## More on Water

Thank you to everyone who participated in the public meeting on water issues in Goulburn last month, who wrote letters to newspapers and who made submissions to the Department of Land and Water Conservation on the proposed legislation.

A major victory for us, as a result of this action, was that the legislation itself, when tabled in Parliament in June, will be open to public discussion and consultations for a further period and not immediately set in concrete.

The Department also advised that Sydney Water would become a licensed water user but sadly there was no indication that a cap would be placed on the quantities used in the city. The only plus seemed to be in Sydney looking at ways to save on water usage, for example, with some city Councils already allowing the installation of house tanks.

We will need to keep a very close eye on further developments and keep up the pressure.

## Drinking Water Catchments

The Department of Urban Affairs and Planning has changed the definition of "drinking water catchment" to include both the inner and outer catchment areas of the Sydney catchment which now includes almost all of the Shire.

As a result, a lot more development in the Shire will in future have to be "designated" and will require Environmental Impact Statements at additional cost to the developer.

The types of development included in this requirement includes:

chemical industries, chemical storage facilities, coal mines, coal works, composting facilities of any quantity, contaminated soil treatment works, limestone mines and mines generally, intensive livestock industries, livestock processing industries, paper pulp and pulp products that release effluent or sludge, petroleum works, sewerage systems or works, turf farms, waste management facilities and wood preservation works.

While the concerns about pollution are, no doubt, very real in many instances, it is clear that the Department has gone overboard in trying to keep the catchment pristine.

The list applies regardless of scale or quantity so, in effect, your backyard compost heap and the septic system attached to a new home appear to be subject to an EIS.

## Development Applications

- A workshop and spraybooth for motor vehicle repairs has been approved on Jerrara road.

- A request for re-zoning of land for a community title subdivision on Bullamalita Road was refused. Council does not support the concept of cluster style development which result from community title subdivisions in rural areas.

## On-site Sewage Management

Council's inspection of systems in villages and rural residential areas such as Talolong Park Estate has commenced. Bungonia and Marulan should be inspected shortly.

So far, it's good news. The numbers not passing the test are very small and the reasons for "failure" are mostly minor, for example, lids of tanks require re-sealing or replacing.

There is also good news about the proposed one-day seminar for self certification of on-site systems in rural areas. The Sydney Catchment Authority has come good with a grant of \$8000 and Yass Shire Council has joined Mulwaree with a contribution of \$3500 towards the course.

Those who expressed an interest in participating in the course should hopefully hear from Council this month.

If you missed this part of the process, there will still be an opportunity for you to participate.

If you have not yet registered your septic system with Council, please get in touch with the office as soon as possible.

## Serrated Tussock and Frenock

NSW Agriculture is still trying to find a replacement for Frenock which has been unavailable now for some time.

A new herbicide is showing positive results in tests but is not yet at a stage where it can be released for sale to the public. Whatever the end result, it is sure to remain expensive.

In the meantime, keep on trying to control it in every way possible.

Goulburn Branch Library is the home of the Regional History Room, which contains a joint collection of materials owned by the Library and the Goulburn District Family History Society. Within this room, you can discover a mine of local and family historical information about the wider Goulburn area. This includes outlying townships and localities such as Braidwood, Bungonia, Collector, Crookwell, Gundaroo, Marulan, Tarago, Taralga, Windellama, and many more, all of which have played an integral part in the development of the Goulburn region.

If your interest is in local history, there is a wealth of books, pamphlet materials, and local newspapers to satisfy merely a passing interest, or to assist with more detailed research. Discover for yourself, evidence of the vast growth of this region, from agriculture through commerce and industry; the various social and cultural changes that have occurred; and the people that have made it happen.

For those with a yen to delve into discovering their family's roots, the Regional History Room is the repository for the Goulburn District Family History Society's collection of family history resources. These include microfiche and microfilm copies of births, deaths and marriage records; also Church records; cemetery transcripts; electoral rolls; shipping and immigration records; convict, and other archival records of early Australia.

During May, the Regional History Room will also acquire an additional range of archive resource materials from the State Records Office of NSW as the Library takes on the role of community access point for a State Government initiative: Access for All. This project will see the Archives Resource Kit, much of which is already held in the Library, supplemented by access to new CD-ROM and internet resources.

Goulburn Branch Library would also like to forge closer links with regional Historical Societies, so this may be the ideal time to come in and introduce yourself to the new Local/Family History Coordinator, Lynn Bonomini.

If you would like to experiment with the past, come on in. The Regional History Room is open to the public whenever Goulburn Branch Library itself is open, so you can get access to these historic materials 52 hours per week. Just sign the Visitor's Book each time you use the Room.

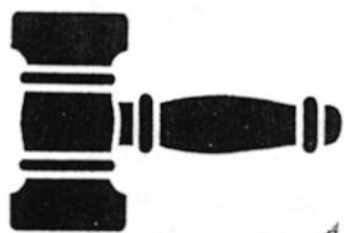
