GARDENING IN AUGUST

Ensure that all your roses and fruit trees are pruned and sprayed. Finish transplanting shrubs and prune philadelphus, dutzia, weigela and may, and plant out water lilies and gladioli. Divide and plant out perennials such as chrysanthemum, michaelmas daisy, helenium, rudbeckia, phlox and lupins. Sow seed of alyssum, virginian stock, nemesia, mexican poppy, nemophila and other annuals for summer flowering. In your vegetable garden plant potatoes, onions, jerusalem artichokes, shallots and three varieties of peas to mature at different times.

Access to the Fire Shed

The sloping section of land between the fire shed and the road badly needs to be sealed to stop mud slides into the new building every time it rains.

I have requested that Council staff look at the job and provide some advice and costings to the brigade for work to be done when the appropriate equipment is in the area.

With a joint and co-operative approach, we may be able to get the job done at minimum cost to everyone.

Road "Swap"

Several months ago, the Classic Riders Club of Goulburn requested some land on the old Bungonia Road to erect a monument. The site is the starting point for the first Australian Motor Cycle Grand Prix held in 1924.

The land is owned by the RTA who were not willing to part with it without payment.

Since then, the RTA has requested that land adjacent to the Hume Highway south of Tiyces Lane and owned by Council be handed over at 'no compensation' as it is needed for highway improvements.

Council has advised the RTA they will agree to a 'swap' of the highway land and old Bungonia Road site so that the Classic Riders Club can go ahead with a monument.

Developments

- A subdivision of land has been approved at Jacqua and

Bungonia-Windellama Roads to enable an engineering business to be established there.

- An animal farm for tourists has been approved on Boxers Creek Road. Once it becomes operational, I would strongly encourage visitors to use the Rosemount Road entrance to Boxers Creek Road as the highway turnoffs do not at present provide for adequate deceleration lanes, especially for traffic heading north.

Landcare

Windellama Landcare has been permitted to put up five signs. These will draw attention to their projects so highlighting some of the excellent community activities taking place in our area.

Recreation Grants

Application forms for NSW Department of Sport and Recreation grants are now available and will close on 31 August - that means they have to be in the Department by then. They usually involve only 50% funding with the community putting up the remainder of funds.

New play equipment for the park may be a suitable project or you may have some others in mind.

In either case, please let me know urgently so that the applications can be arranged in time.

Rates

Council's 1997/98 budget has now been adopted and includes the State Government's allocated rates rise of 3.1 per cent. This will add only a few dollars to the minimum rates.

JULY 1997. UPDATE.



COWHOLE CREEK REPORT.

Further extensive earthworks carried out by Braidwood LAWC have been completed in a section of the Cowhole Creek above Hillydale. The large dam diversion banks and flume will help control water run off and will stabilise this section of the Creek. The area will be hand seeded with native trees along the gully walls, fenced out and planted with a mixture of native and pines later this season, completing Stage 4 of the Cowhole restoration.

VISIT BY LAWC with a Group from NATIONAL RESOURCE MANAGEMENT.

This bus group of 20 were shown restoration works in Wilduk and our famous Gully from Hell. This visit by the policy makers enabled us to voice our opinions on various aspects of the present funding guidelines. At present all Landcare funding is biased towards native vegetation at the expense of exotics -- an anomaly I will do my best to correct. As pointed out to the group by various speakers, the future in this low rainfall area of poor soils is to concentrate on *P. radiata*, as well as natives which provide a financial incentive for planting trees. I feel sure we got some of our message home.

FIELD DAY BY A.C.T. FORESTS.

This was organised for all those intending to move into commercial pine plantings in this area. The guest speaker, Robin Trewin from New Zealand Forest Research gave a fascinating talk to the 20 participants, with slides and field displays on correct planting techniques. Now we have had adequate rain, we can go ahead with the planting of 80,000 *P. radiata*. The message was to plant correctly, if you want the best results.

SMALL GRANT FROM UPPER SHOALHAVEN C.M.C.

\$3,000 has been allocated for another *P. radiata* trial. This time at Carne. This will be a highly visible trial including Eucalypts on Serrated Tussock degraded land. Detailed trials in the Bathurst / Oberon area have shown *P. radiata* will successfully control tussock. We are confident of same results here. *P. radiata* plantings can offer farmers on severely affected land, both effective tussock control and the prospect of economic return. No chemical spray can offer this on poorer sites.

SOUTHERN TABLELANDS FARM FORESTRY NETWORK.

The Network meeting and field day held on 14th July demonstrated the new ripper/moulder purchased by LAWC. This machine will make ground preparation much easier and more effective. At an approx cost of \$150/hectare it can rip and mound to a minimum depth of 60-70cms. Start thinking about tree planting now for next year. With the recent heavy rain the ground is too wet to prepare this winter.

AUGUST FIELD DAY SUNDAY 3rd.

This will be the third in recent weeks concentrating on commercial *P. radiata* in this area. We hope to have A.C.T. Foresters present to answer any queries as well as Mike King a New Zealander, a pruning expert to demonstrate all aspects of pruning.

The field day starts at 10.00 a.m. Yellow Dam paddock. 2kms along Inverary Road. EVERYONE WELCOME.

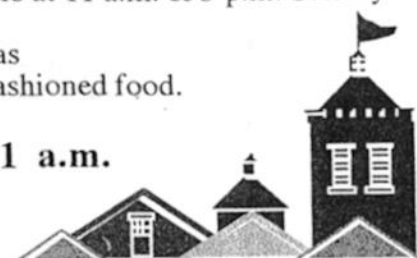

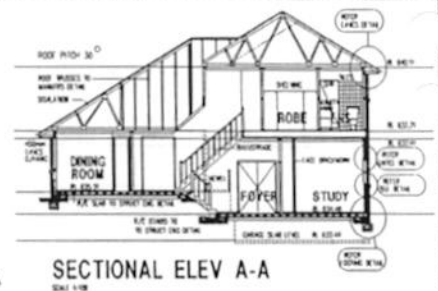

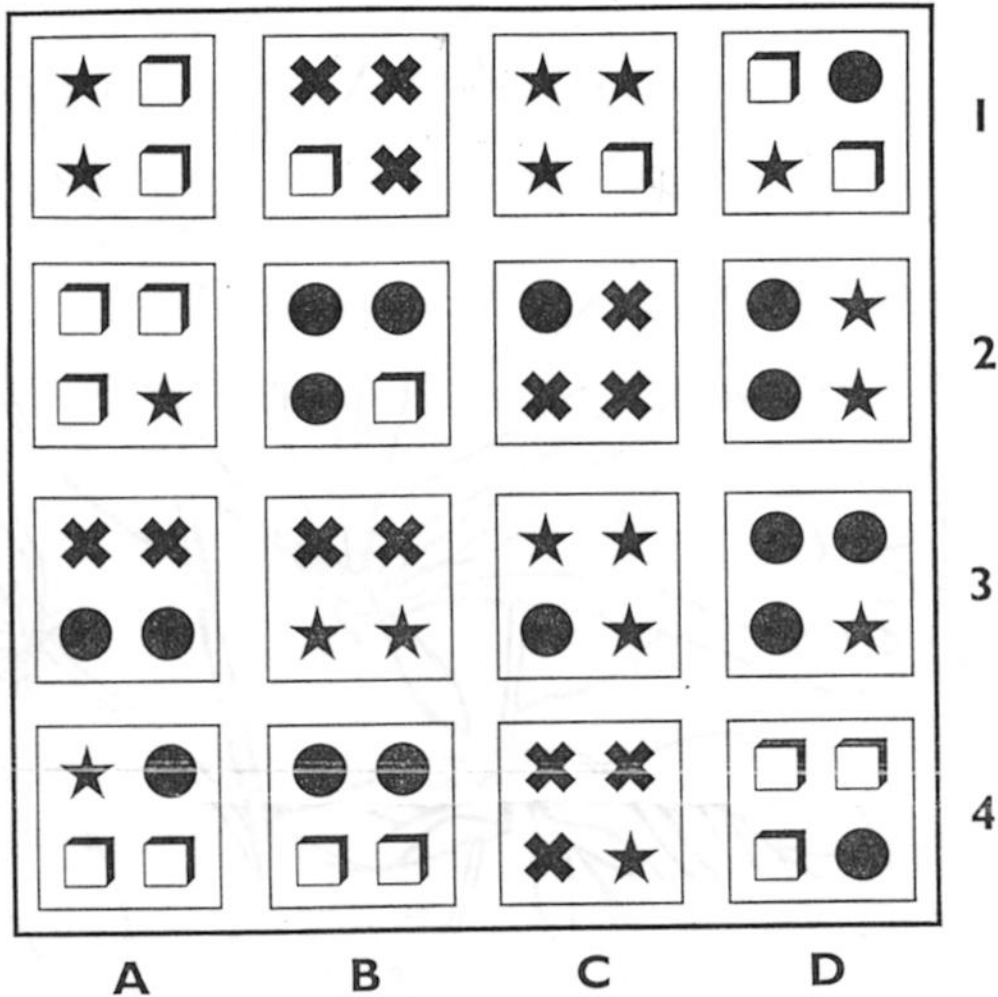
