ANNUAL REPORT 2000 – 2001

I am pleased to present the 59th Annual Report of the Bungonia Rural Fire Service.

This year has been another fortunate year for the brigade with no major call outs to attend to, although, we did have 6 call outs. The call outs were:-

In August: we attended a grass fire at Pegasus Lane

In January: We attended a fire on Jarrara Road
A lightening strike on the Mountain Ash Road
Assisted Marulan at a fire on the Johnniefields property
And we assisted at a fire on the Braidwood Road

We also attended a Motor Vehicle Accident on the Oallen Ford Road which involved one of our own members.

I feel we have been lucky not to have had a major fire, and hopefully we can continue to avoid same.

Some of the other things that have happened this year were:-

- A new office room has been built within the shed.
- We have received a new fire truck (which was much needed and very well received).
- Held a basic training course
- Held a first aid course
- Taken part in 3 fire trail excursions with other brigades (one in Windellama & two in Bungonia)
- Purchased a vacuum cleaner for the office and trucks
- Held a Tupperware party to raise money to purchase a gift for raffle
- Held a raffle which raised just under a \$1000
- Had a donation of just over \$200 from the Bungonia Quilters after holding a quilt display in the shed.

GARDENING IN AUGUST

Its time to begin preparing both flower and vegetable gardens for spring. If you have supplies of compost or any clean animal manure, dig it into the soil with generous handfuls of complete fertiliser and lime per metre. Growing vegetables and flowers can naturally be a drain on the soil, so for a successful and rewarding garden, make sure you have fertile soil.

This month you can sow carrot, parsnip, lettuce, asparagus crowns, rhubarb crowns, silver beet, onions and peas. You can also plant out seedlings of cabbage, lettuce, silver beet and onions.

You can put your petunia and phlox seeds in this month and seedlings that are available at your nurseries will come into flower quickly as the days get longer and warmer. Pansy, viola, stocks, snapdragons, aquilegia, carnations, dianthus, primula, dwarf sweet william, alyssum, poppies and larkspur.

Roses and fruit trees can still be pruned as well.,

Spray apple, pear, plum, quince and your roses with Winter Oil, this controls mite and scale.

If you have had trouble with black spot on apples and pear, roses or leaf curl on peaches and nectarine, spray with Lime Sulphur or Bordeaux. With peach and nectarine, make sure they are sprayed no later than pinking of the buds. If it is a wet season, you should spray these trees with Benlate which is a Systemic Fungicide.

PLANTING YOUR PINE TREE FARM.

"The aim of planting is to return the plant to the ground with as little root distortion as possible" ARD Trewin.

The planting of trees is the culmination of the past six months of preparation where the area should have been firstly heavily grazed, sprayed and then ripped and mounded using the "pattern ploughing" method. The area to be planted should also be fenced to prevent grazing damage by stock

Before planting begins, there has to be sufficient moisture in the soil and squeeze it. If, after squeezing, the soil remains in a ball, it suggests that there is adequate moisture (unless the soil is sandy).

Besides preparing the site by ripping and mounding, buying the best genetically improved seedlings or cuttings available, and delivering these plants to the field with care, it is very important to plant the seedlings or cuttings correctly.

Initial training of those involved in the planting phase is considered mandatory. Untrained labourers are not employed to crutch sheep or drench cattle and the same applies to the planting of trees.

The following points need to be recognised and addressed when planting pines:

1. PLANTING EQUIPMENT.

Good spades are a must for digging well cultivated planting holes. Specially designed spades such as the Atlas Planting Spades have heavy blades that do not flex under pressure. The blade on the spade should be greater than 28cm long- any shorter and it is not possible to open a good deep hole for the correct root placement.

2. CULTIVATION AND PLANTING METHODS.

The hole for the tree must be opened up suitably to ensure minimal distortion of the roots. The old method of 'slit and stuff planting' is unacceptable as air pockets are created causing poor survival and roots are sandwiched in one plane resulting in toppling. Removing soil to create a good sized hole is very labour intensive and in a tree farm situation is not practical.


The most effective planting method is:

- Cultivate a good planting spot. The spade has been designed so that the front of the blade gives the best leverage. Some planters use the spade back to front, however, this reduces the cultivation and is incorrect.
The correct cultivation method is to dig the spade to the full depth, lever the handle back for maximum break up of soil, remove the spade and reversing the blade, dig the spade to full depth 40cm away from the first cut. By pushing the handle away a planting spot is well cultivated.
- Open a good planting slot. After the cultivation, push the spade vertically to its full depth into the centre of the cultivated planting spot. Push the handle away at an angle of 45 degrees so that the spade levers the soil up creating a hole at the bottom. Then push the spade down to anchor the blade tip and pull the handle back to open up a good planting slot. Often the soil is loose and falls back into the hole. If this happens, simply repeat the operation. With practice, this hole opening technique can be completed in less than 2 seconds.
- With the spade still in the hole, a tree is carefully selected from the planting box and placed immediately in the hole. Place the roots at the bottom of the hole. Only one tree is taken from the box at a time and put directly into the planting hole.
- Fill the hole burying the roots deep in loose soil.
- Give the tree stem a positive pull up (a hand width) to straighten any roots that may have been twisted up and to point the lateral roots slightly down. Planting depth should be 10cm above the root collar of the seedling.
- Still holding the tree vertical, firm the soil around the tree by pressing down firmly with the soles (not heels) of the boot, one either side of the tree. Never stomp down with the heel as this crushes and damages roots.

With practice, about 1000 trees can be planted properly per day using the above method. Any one who plants more than 1000 per day is probably planting incorrectly. Incorrect planting methods affect survival and allow young trees to topple in high winds, In recovering from toppling, trees develop butt sweep and this reduces profitability.

Quality checks on any work that is undertaken by a contractor or by staff is critical for a successful operation.

How to make a complaint or offer a compliment

Through our Complaint Handling Policy and Procedures we are seeking to:

- Effectively respond to complaints and resolve them.
- Ensure people are satisfied with the outcome of their complaint.
- Improve our business based on the information we receive from complaints.

Where possible we will resolve your complaint immediately. If this is not possible, we will contact you within two working days (for telephone or face to face contact) or five working days (for written complaints). We will give you a complaint number and a contact name and telephone number.

Where a complaint cannot be resolved immediately we will keep you informed of the progress. After investigating a complaint we will notify you of the solution or action taken.

If you are not satisfied with the solution offered or action taken, you have the right to have the matter referred to a senior manager for review. If you are still not satisfied with the review or solution offered or if the matter cannot be resolved, it will be referred to the General Manager of the relevant SCA Division for further review. If the matter is still in dispute it will be referred to the chief Executive.

Throughout the entire process you are able to pursue the matter through independent external bodies, such as the NSW Ombudsman or the Department of Fair Trading.

If you have a compliment regarding the SCA or any of our staff we would like to hear from you. Knowing that we are doing well also helps us to continuously improve as an organization.
