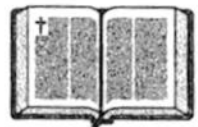

Tree planting is well underway as I write this months report and the question of whether to plant or not because of dry conditions arises once again. If the ground preparation has been adequate there will be at least some moisture in the rip lines, so I consider planting should go ahead, despite the risk.

I had the pleasure of attending Peter Simpson's retirement night and would like to express the best wishes of the Group to Peter in his retirement. Peter has been an ardent supporter of Landcare in particular tree planting projects and farm forestry and will remain an active member of STFFN. His final report in Guide to Graziers raises many relevant issues on natural resource management which all the public should consider not only land managers. The first issue concerns BIODIVERSITY.

The term BIODIVERSITY to most of us embraces all living plants and animals and their interaction with the environment, but has a different impact on different peoples attitude. As in Peter's example Inverary Landcare has promoted extensive tree planting, retained remnants, treated saline areas, better farm design, soil erosion works and general rehabilitation of degraded lands. This has involved, apart from some grant money, a lot of time and effort. The results have been quite amazing in many areas--- birds have returned, kangaroo numbers have exploded, foxes are more evident, hare and wallaby numbers are at an all time high and even a few feral cats, dogs and goats have caused problems.

The return of all the wildlife may give a warm fuzzy feeling of well being, but who pays. Because of re-forestation and other environmental, the recent kangaroo population has exploded say from 50 to 500. As an adult kangaroo eats as much as an adult sheep, in the above example we are grazing an extra 450 kangaroos (not to mention the nightly agistment of the National Parks population) this equates to a financial loss of approx \$11,000 ---who of the readers of this article is willing to contribute --I do not mind feeding the original 50.

To maintain native pasture and vegetation it is important to control grazing pressure. Stock movements can be controlled, but no one can control native animal movements. Maintenance of fences is always a high cost item --now this has increased dramatically by the damage the roos, wombats and wallabys -- again who is willing to help pay.

The question of dramatic increase in kangaroos is even more annoying when landholders in this area are not allowed to cull and harvest this resource. Yes , you can obtain a permit to cull, but are supposed to leave the carcasses to rot. If we lived west of the magic line across the State it is legal to harvest and utilise a resource, which after all we are maintaining --- difficult to understand.

Back to biodiversity. Over 90% of all living things created on Earth over millions of years of evolution became extinct naturally. Why then do we become so emotional about threatened species. There will always be winners and losers. When any species of plant or animal is threatened it is part of natures change, where a less well adapted species will succumb and become extinct. Why try to defy nature. You might also consider next time you browse the supermarket shelves, how much we spend on domestic pets. Pet cats alone probably have the largest impact on biodiversity when many birds and small mammals will become extinct due to their predation .

Now are you prepared to pay for biodiversity.

## *Gardening in August*

Its time to begin preparing both flower and vegetable gardens for spring. If you have supplies of compost or any clean animal manure, dig it into the soil with generous handfuls of complete fertiliser and lime per metre. Growing vegetables and flowers can naturally be a drain on the soil, so for a successful and rewarding garden, make sure you have fertile soil.

This month you can sow carrot, parsnip, lettuce, asparagus crowns, rhubarb crowns, silver beet, onions and peas. You can also plant out seedlings of cabbage, lettuce, silver beet and onions.

You can put your petunia and phlox seeds in this month and seedlings that are available at your nurseries will come into flower quickly as the days get longer and warmer. Pansy, viola, stocks, snapdragons, aquilegia, carnations, dianthus, primula, dwarf sweet william, alyssum, poppies and larkspur.

Roses and fruit trees can still be pruned as well.,

Spray apple, pear, plum, quince and your roses with Winter Oil, this controls mite and scale.

If you have had trouble with black spot on apples and pear, roses or leaf curl on peaches and nectarine, spray with Lime Sulphur or Bordeaux. With peach and nectarine, make sure they are sprayed no later than pinking of the buds. If it is a wet season, you should spray these trees with Benlate which is a Systemic Fungicide.

## ADVANCING BURRINJUCK

A monthly report on State Parliamentary matters by Katrina Hodgkinson MP, Member for Burrinjuck.

20<sup>th</sup> July 2002

Parliament has risen for the Winter Recess and will resume for the Spring Sitzings on 3 September.

On 21<sup>st</sup> June I attended the funeral service for Doug Moppett in Coonamble. Doug was a long serving National Party member of the NSW Legislative Council who passed away after a battle with cancer. His many years in the NSW Parliament were characterised by an unwavering dedication to the public good. His passing will be a sore loss for the people of NSW.

I was back in Sydney for the last week of Parliament between 24<sup>th</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup> before returning to the electorate. The following Saturday morning I joined Geoff Frost and Dorothy Horseman on Yass FM 100.3 and then attended the Boorowa Lions Club Changeover Dinner that evening. On Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> I attended the farewell service for Father William Crahan at St Augustine's in Yass.

After a very busy Parliamentary Session I immediately recommenced my electorate duties with constituent interviews in Yass, Goulburn, Crookwell and Tumut the following week. On Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> July I had the great pleasure of attending the 102 District Masonic Debutante Ball in Goulburn. The following Monday I attended the funeral for Jack Shaw in Gunning. Jack was well known and a much loved and respected Gunning identity who had served many years as Shire President for Gunning.

On Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> July I hosted a meeting in Yass between local sheep producers, the Yass Rural Lands Protection Board and the Shadow Minister for Agriculture, Ian Armstrong MP to discuss their concerns about the regulation of ovine Johne's disease. On the evening of Monday 15<sup>th</sup> I hosted a very successful meeting in the Goulburn Soldier's Club to discuss the formation of a Regional Consultative Group to work towards the establishment of a University Campus in Goulburn.

I returned to Sydney for a function with prominent British Parliamentarian, Patricia Hewitt, on Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> before holding more constituent interviews in Goulburn the following Wednesday and Thursday.

### Parliament

In Parliament this month I led for the Opposition in a Matter of Public Importance debate on ovine Johne's disease. It is good to see that the Labor Government has finally realised that their draconian regulatory approach to disease control is wrong and they have begun to increase the trading and vaccination options for affected producers. I raised a Notice of Motion about the possible closure of the Wee Jasper Reserves on the floor of Parliament and I also spoke in response to the Premier's statement marking the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Gundagai flood. In the last sitting week of Parliament I also raised my concerns about safety at the Tallong Railway Station, the nursing restructure at Goulburn Base Hospital, irrigation licences in the upper Yass River, the condition of the Gocup road, Rural Fire Service Tankers, the need for an Assembly Hall at Yass Public School and the closure of the Tarago General Store.
