Greed should not be involved with the sharing of this vital life giving natural resource. Human beings have to share fresh water with all other forms of life, such as, animals, birds, plants, trees etc. and most importantly, the soil.

Since the beginning of all life on this planet, there have been and will continue to be so ; disputes involving water.

Our own local dispute with the possible development of the Ardmore Park quarry, should not overlook the significance of the copious quantities of water that would be needed to process the product of this operation.

Next Meeting : Monday 14th. August. 7. AGM followed by a general meeting

Ardmore Park Quarry.

At the very well attended meeting on 2nd. July (given the short notice) a motion expressing opposition to the Ardmore Park Quarry was passed unanimously.

The meeting was advised of the importance of responding to the letter received from the Department and to ring Louise, record the reference number on the letter received and then respond by letter. Numbers of responses matter. It was considered important that each individual be prepared to support their own submission.

We will advise you of any developments in the next Bungonia Times or by letter drop if necessary.

Progress have organized a bus to take those interested to Sydney to the Land & Environment Court hearing.

It was suggested that the Court case could go about 3 days and that there could be an ON-SITE INSPECTION. It was thought that it would be a good idea for people to write to the Department to ask for such an inspection.

We will advise you of any developments in the next Bungonia Times or by letter drop if necessary.

Progress have organized a bus to take those interested to Sydney to the Land & Environment Court hearing.

Multiquip Quarries have appealed against the Minister's decision not to allow the Ardmore Park Quarry to proceed. The letter from Dept. of Planning states:

- That the Court is now the consent authority and will consider the evidence & submission made from the parties prior to determining the DA.
- The written submissions made about the DA during the exhibition period will be provided to the Court and will form part of the Court's consideration when it determines the application.
- If you wish to give evidence at the hearing in support of your submission on the DA please contact Louise McAndrew in the Department's Legal Service Branch 9228 6326.

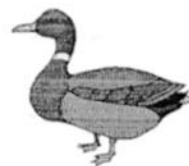

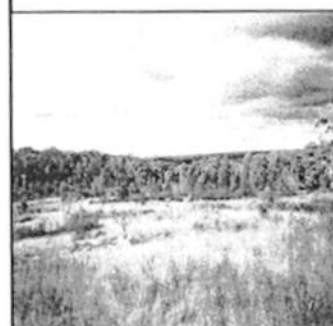

INVERARY CREEK LANDCARE NEWSLETTER – AUGUST 2006

AUGUST REPORT

PLANTING TIME - Soil moisture should be excellent on ground already prepared earlier in the year, giving the best prospects for planting in several years. If the ground has not been prepared already, it is too late for winter plantings of *P. Radiata*, but o.k for spring plantings of natives. Weed control has not been a big issue in dry years but if we get normal spring rains this year, it will be essential to control weed competition.

WEED CONTROL -There is often a misunderstanding on the use of some weedicides. I recently saw a paddock of dead and dormant native grasses being sprayed with 'Round-up'. This is a waste of chemical and time – you cant kill grass that is already dead and 'Round-up' being a contact herbicide, has no residual effects. On the other hand, serrated tussock spray such as 'Taskforce' is a residual and will remain in the soil for some time.

While on the subject of weed control, I noted in a C.M.A contract aimed at managing native remnant vegetation that *Phalaris* and *P.Radiata* are both mentioned as weeds. My definition of a weed is a plant in the wrong place. There are winners and losers in any plant community, but to class *Phalaris* as a weed!, doesn't show much knowledge on weed control.

If we are to limit the use of chemicals, the only method of control of weeds such as serrated tussock, is by competition with a more aggressive species – a winner in this situation. *Phalaris* is an ideal competitor; controls soil degradation and provides good pasture. *P. Radiata* in the correct location can halt the spread of tussock seed and make control so much easier. The message is – don't be too narrow minded on weeds.

PLANTATION CONTRACTS WITH A.C.T FORESTS – Several local growers had contracts with the former A.C.T forest, which no longer exists. All records were lost in the 2003 bushfire. S.T.F.F.N will now take over the former contracts and growers will be contacted by Ian McArthur. If S.T.F.F.N has missed anyone please contact Ian on 0412 195 499. If anyone has plantations ready for pruning Ian will come and inspect and arrange for contractors to complete any work.

ARDMORE QUARRY – NOT AGAIN??? –Inverary Landcare has already lodged objections on several environmental grounds and will be prepared to appear before the Land and Environment court to give evidence. While I have not seen the new proposals, it is hard to believe they will be changed very much in terms of water use and environmental issues. It is interesting that the large industrial development planned by Mariners for the Windellama and Mountain Ash roads will be self sufficient in water – a lesson here for the Ardmore proposal. Bungonia district residents should be united in their opposition to this shoddy planned development, which will directly or indirectly adversely affect all those nearby or on the transport route.

COMMERCIAL PLANTATION POTENTIAL – With the demise of A.C.T forests the importance of private plantations is increased. Local mills will still need mature logs which will now be sourced more in private plantations. While not a major employer, the socio economic benefit of plantations should be considered. With the sub division of larger farms to 25 – 100 acres lots, a small pine plantation is an attraction to new landholders for long term or retirement plans. The time rotation is 25-30 years which may seem a long investment, but once planted and with a little maintenance, any plantation is a good future investment.

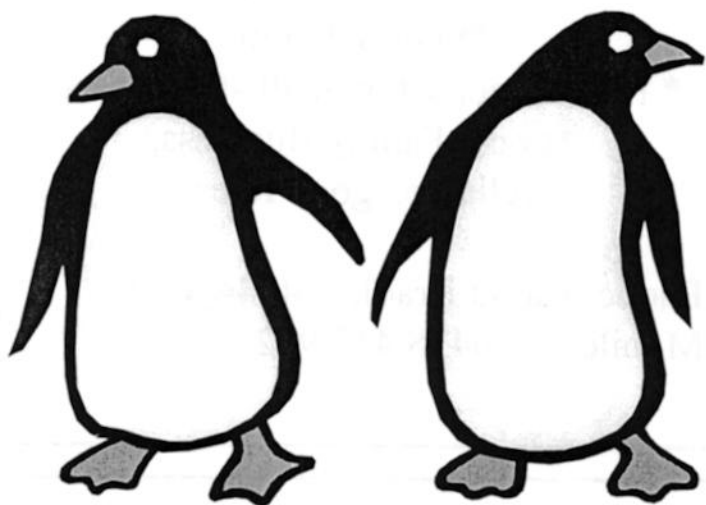

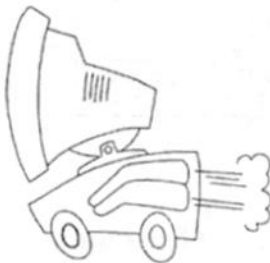

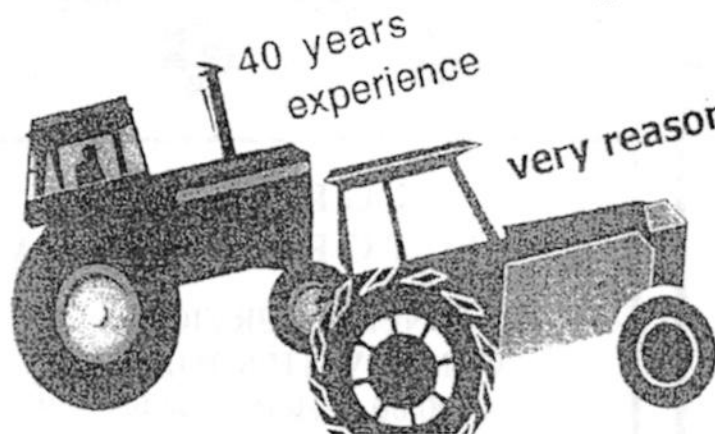

Regional Sports Facilities Grants now open

Katrina Hodgkinson, Nationals Member for Burrinjuck said today that the Guidance Notes and Application Forms for the 2006/07 Regional Sports Facility Program are now available.

The program, which is run by the NSW Department of Sport and Recreation, provides funding to enhance the range, availability and quality of sport and recreational facilities throughout NSW.

"Local Councils and 'not for profit' sporting or recreational groups can use this funding to construct facilities like a new cricket ground or to upgrade existing sporting recreational facilities," Ms Hodgkinson said.

"Grants of between \$30,00 and \$200,000 are available under this program on a dollar for dollar basis."

"The closing date for applications is 31 August 2006."

"Application forms and guidance notes can be obtained by phone by calling 131302, through the internet at www.dsr.nsw.gov.au or by telephoning my Electorate Office on freecall 1800 002580" Ms Hodgkinson said.

Bioreactor staff have been **working hard on removing odours & nutrients** & have been gradually implementing appropriate treatment processes.
- ✦ Council has accepted a **\$50,000 funding offer for public consultation from the Water Smart Australia Program**. The desired outcome of this consultation process will be a sustainable long term solution to secure Goulburn's water supply.
- ✦ **Some Goulburn Sporting Fields reopen**. As a result of recent good rainfall, moisture levels have improved at Eastgrove South, North Park & Seiffert Oval and so these grounds have been reopened for winter sports.

Horse -ing Around.

Keeping your horses and ponies safe and sound. Part one - paddock care.

***Housing** - The place you keep your horse is very important. If your horse is kept in a paddock, good fencing is needed to keep them safely off roads and out of dangerous areas. Check your fences regularly, as native animals tend to weaken them and stock lean and scratch on posts often knocking them over. They like company and do better with a buddy. If no other horse is near a cow, goat, sheep, alpaca or donkey will buddy up. Donkeys carry lungworm and pass it to horses so you need to use a wormer to cover this when worming time comes around. If you don't live near your paddock it's a good idea to have a neighbour or friend keep an eye on your horse. Horses may be big and strong but can get sick and die without care and injure themselves in 'a padded room.' They are a bit like children and need constant supervision.

***Water** - Check water supply often. It can spring a leak, dry up or become contaminated. Dams are sometimes polluted, muddy or access difficult and stock fall in or become stuck, bacteria in the mud can infect skin on the legs, (mud fever, greasy heel) so check the dam or waterway for access and condition of water. Also new foals have been found drowned in dams and watercourses. Dams can be cleaned out which gives you more water and better quality but this is costly. Often fencing it off and putting in troughs is the way to go. Horses will use the dams in summer to swim or roll in to keep cool but will use the trough to drink out of if given the option.

***Licks** - A salt / mineral lick is beneficial to animal health but beware that sheep and cattle licks often have urea in them and are dangerous to equines (read the box.)

***Rugs** - It is not a good idea to rug your horse if you can't check it AM and PM. Clips brake and the rug moves. Some horses panic and get into allsorts of strife with flapping rugs over their sides or head. A rug hanging over one side can rub and cut into flesh leaving a nasty wound or a rug may hook up in a fence trapping the poor horse till you find it. A tree break or shelter shed will do nicely and most horses grow a warm woolly coat.

***Feed** - If good pasture is available in your paddock extra feed should not be required unless the horse is being worked often, is in foal, very aged or has lost weight. Then a suitable feed program should be added. There are many good pre made feeds available for horse nowadays and your local produce store should be able to advise you on what should suit your horse's needs. Do not over feed as this leads to allsorts of problems. A good worming program is advised. Always worm new horses to the paddock and worm all horses in the paddock at the same time or reinfecting will occur. Have teeth checked at least once a year. A well horse has a bright eye, clear nostrils, and good appetite is alert, has a shiny coat and its weight is in a healthy range. A good weight is no ribs showing but you can feel them with your hand.

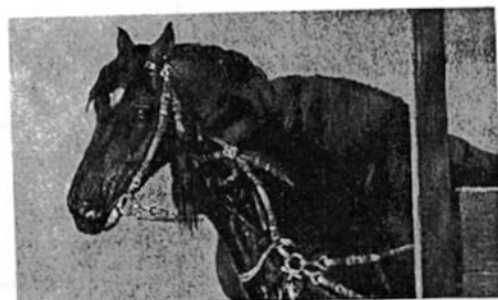
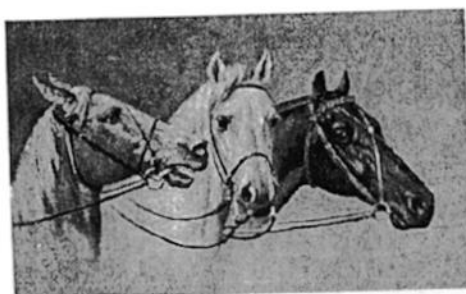
***Hoof Care** - Regular trimming of the hooves by a farrier is needed. You only need to shoe your horse if you are riding on the road or rocky ground often.

***Rubbish** - If your paddock has rubbish in it try to remove it or fence that area off. Loose wire can cause injury, small objects can be eaten and cause colic, the biggest killer of horses. Rubbish is a vermin and snake haven. Snakes being another big killer of horses, stock and dogs over summer. This includes household rubbish, tin, timber, building materials, bricks, old cars and anything else that's not bush or pasture.

***Holes** - Deep holes can be a danger. Wombat and rabbit holes are often the culprit for a broken leg. You can fill them in with rocks or bricks and cover with dirt but wombats are very persistent and an on going war will keep you busy till Mr Wombat gets the message and moves.

***Weeds** - Weeds are a real threat. Common garden plants such as Oleander, Rhododendron and Foxglove will kill a horse. Pattersons' curse, St John's Wart, Black nightshade and many more pasture weeds will kill or make your horse very sick. Different areas of Australia have different weed types so purchase a good weed book and read up on weeds in your area and how to identify them. A really good horse management book with a list of plants that are troublesome to horses is 'Horse Sense' by Peter Huntington, Jane Myers and Elizabeth Owens. TAFE NSW recommends this book with horse courses as a great source of reference. I have a copy and refer to it often. TAFE is also a good place to learn all agricultural skills, from a short weed control class to a yearlong horse management class. You meet new friends who share a common interest and learn new skills.

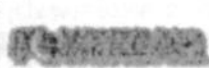

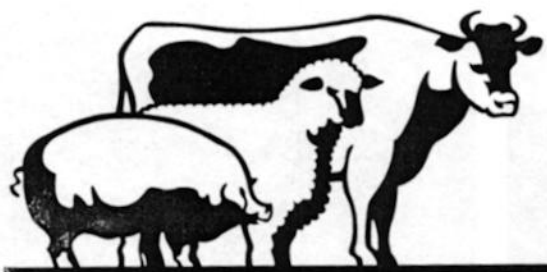
