GARDENING IN DECEMBER

Time for planting beans, corn, beetroot, spinach, broccoli, cabbage, carrots, marrows, parsley, parsnips, pumpkins, late tomatoes, lettuce and radish.

Cauliflower seed can now be sown. Some of the varieties mature at different times and if you like large cauliflowers, this is the time to sow them for winter. Broccoli can also be planted now and should be ready to cut during autumn.

It is also time to protect your fruit trees from fruit fly. Spray your apples, pears, peaches, nectarine and quinces with Rogor or Lebaycide. These two chemicals are absorbed by the skin of the fruit and is not washed off by rain. It is recommended to spray apples, pears, etc every three weeks and again two weeks before ripening.

If you have roses, and it is hot and humid, spray your roses with Benlate, if its dry, spray with Lebaycide. Fertilise with blood and bone or rose food.

GARDENING IN JANUARY

The late sowing of beans, corn, beetroot, spinach, broccoli, cabbage, lettuce and radish can still be done and there is still time to plant some zucchini seedlings for late summer/autumn.

Sprinkle Sulphate of Ammonia over your lawn and water well.

Keep the soil damp around the base of your roses and pruning out the centre can be done as well.

Mulch your garden beds to keep moisture in to help your plants get through the hot summer heat.

Sow pumpkins for winter harvesting. Traditionally pumpkins take up an enormous area of space but, for small areas, choose 'Butternut' which grows on a trellis. Bush type such as 'Golden Nugget' can even be grown in a large container. Pick fruit when the bush has died down completely.

Check tomatoes and capsicum for fruit fly. Boil infected fruit to kill larvae. Never, ever throw the rotten fruit into the compost or onto the ground.

Virus diseases, spread by insects, can attack tomatoes in hot weather. Wrap infected plants in a plastic bag and seal it, then spray plants with Malathion, using proper precautions.

Fertilise your specimen trees now and try not to touch the trunks when whipper sniping as it will damage the trees.

Dedication of the Styles Headstone.

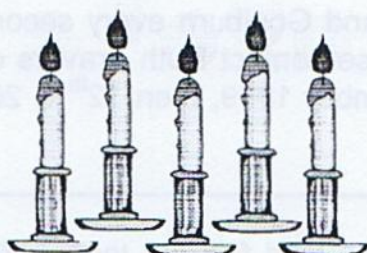
On Sunday 14th. November, about 130 Styles family members and friends gathered in Bungonia to celebrate the placing of a memorial headstone on the Styles family enclosure in the Bungonia Cemetery.

James and Ann Styles settled at Reevesdale in 1821. After Reevesdale was sold in 1897 Charles and Mary Styles moved to the Parsonage and members of the Styles lived there until the death of Jane Styles in 1956. The family made a considerable contribution to community life through business, the law, local government, sport, the school and the Anglican Church.

The day began at Reevesdale, followed by the official unveiling of the headstone at the cemetery (Unfortunately the wind, like De Groot, got there first.). After a picnic lunch at the Hall everyone visited the Parsonage. Many of the family members had spent time at the Parsonage and the memories came flooding back: Aunt Ginna's kitchen, the fig tree, Aunt Kate's room, the bell, the dogs, (Joe and Blue), tennis, swimming etc.

Lots of family history, lots of memories, laughter, photos of the oldest and the youngest, everything contributed to a wonderful day and the culmination of a lot of organization by Sue Tracey.

GOULBURN BRANCH LIBRARY SERVICES

There are many services and facilities available at the Goulburn Branch of the Southern Tablelands Regional Library to cater for the needs of your community

Membership is free to all residents of Mulwaree Shire, all you need to join the Library is to bring in some identification which shows your current residential address. , e.g. driver's licence, rates notice or electricity account. Any person under 18 who wishes to join the library must have a parent/guardian co-sign the membership application. To borrow from the library it is essential to have your library card with you.

There is no overall limit to how many items you can borrow. However, there are some restrictions. At any one time you can borrow a maximum of two videos, 2 information CD ROM's, 2 items from the HSC file, 3 music CD's, and a maximum of two non fiction books on any one subject,

Most items including books, magazines, cassettes, CDs, CD-ROM's may be borrowed for three weeks, and renewed twice. Items which are on hold (reserved for other users), may be borrowed for two weeks only. Videos and HSC materials may be borrowed for one week only, and renewed once.

Renewals may be requested by telephone or by asking at the Loans desk on or before the due date. Items reserved for other users cannot be renewed.

Free Internet access, for up to 20 minutes, for information purposes only is available and black and white printouts are 20cents per page. Email access is \$5.00 per hour and word processing facilities (Word 97) is \$2.00 per hour, printouts are 20cents per page for black and white and 50cents for colour. To use Email or the word processors, bookings are essential and can be made in person at the loans desk or by telephoning the library during opening hours.

These are just some of the facilities and services available at the Goulburn Branch Library, please call into the Library or telephone us on 48234435 if you need further information.

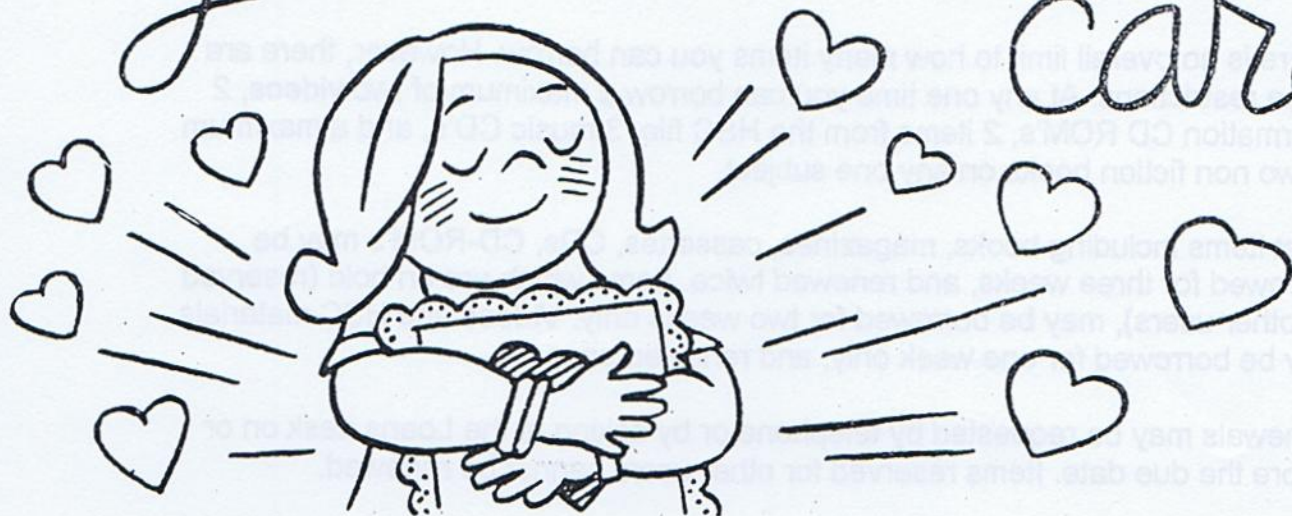

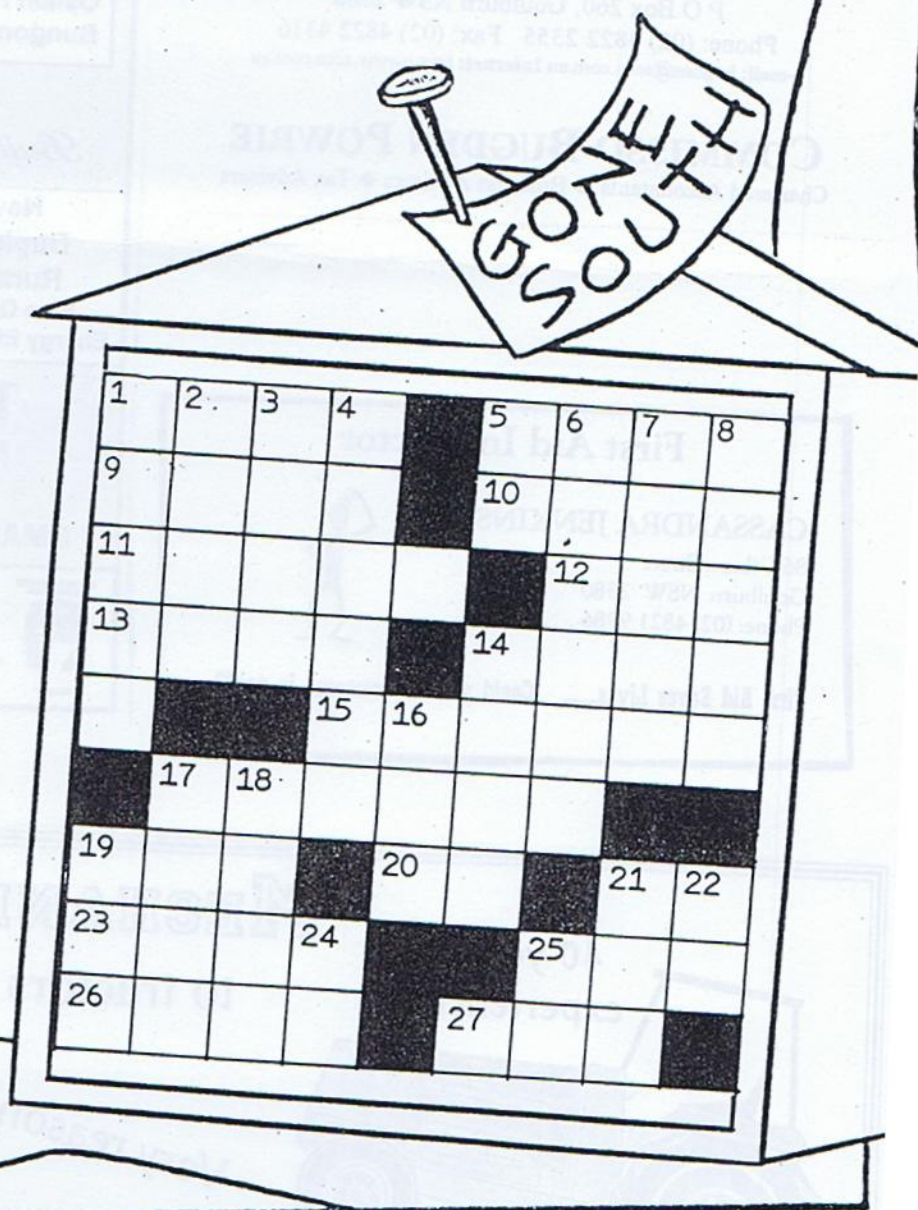

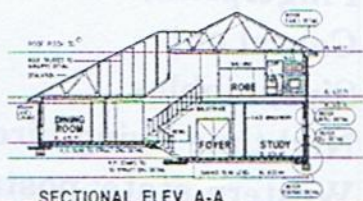
