### WILLOWS

A weed of national importance. For years now, willows have been used to stabilise stream banks; in fact, they were still imported until five years ago but not any more. The trouble is that they are vigorous colonisers and they have taken over great stretches of rivers and creeks with very damaging effects. This is a summary of information gathered at a recent work-shop on willows, their eradication and replacement with native plants, run by the D.L.W.C. and attended by three members of the Park Trust.

Willows are :-

1. Invasive and very aggressive colonisers. They spread by layering, broken-off pieces taking root (especially crack willows), seed dispersion on the wind - as much as 70 km. away, and upstream too.
2. Bad effects on water quality. In Spring, catkins are dumped in rivers; in Autumn, leaf-fall is all at once. Massive nutrient supply de-oxygenates the water and increases turbidity. (Native plants drop small amounts of leaves throughout the year and provide a manageable, steady and necessary supply of nutrients.)
3. Rapid transpiration. Water used is about 600-700 litres of water, per tree, per day.
4. Displacement of native flora, therefore habitat loss. Willows provide a sterile environment. There are no insects, birds or snakes, for example, within a group of willows.
5. Infrastructure damage: to bridges and pump sheds or any other structure in the path of logs driven downstream by floods.
6. Erosion. Willows grow easily on small islands in midstream which increase in size and restrict the river's width which then increases the speed of the water and increases erosion.
7. Willows are now nominated as "weeds of national importance". In this coming Autumn, the park trustees will begin poisoning and removing willows from the part of the creek North of the road bridge.

The members of the park trust suggest that landowners on the Bungonia and Woodward's Creeks complement the work of the trust by themselves tackling their problems with willows, especially those who are upstream of the park. They would, of course, have to work in conjunction with the Department of Land and Water Conservation.

The good news is that if you have a weeping-willow and want to keep it, you may. It is the only variety which is exempt from condemnation.

DECEMBER REPORTWHAT WE HAVE ACHIEVED THROUGH THE YEAR 2000.

Despite very limited funding, the Group has been quite active. The main achievements have been:-

S.O.C.O.G. OLYMPIC PROJECT.

Associated with the Green Olympics, we were involved in the Gold Tree competition and were funded \$2500 for native tree plantings through Olympic Landcare. Former Olympian and local resident Leisa Lieschki attended the official dedication planting day. The Gold Tree on the Limekiln Hill has certainly attracted some favorable comments. Congratulations to Melissa and Byron for a superb painting job of themselves and the tree. The living Gold Tree represents hope for the future.

REMNAANT VEGETATION.

Another small section of native vegetation was fenced out, seeded and replanted. To date the Group has treated and fenced out 7 areas of native remnant dry sclerophyll forest.

NATIVE PLANTINGS.

Several varieties of Acacias have been planted in an Acacia trial as well as trial areas of E. argophloiae. This particular species, limited to a small area of South Queensland may well have a big potential for landcare. The trial plantings will test it out on several different sites.

FARM FORESTRY.

The main emphasis has again been on the promotion of farm forestry as a landcare tool. Plantings of 5-6 hectares on Spring Creek have trialed P.pinaster as well as P. radiata on poorer acid soils. An \$8,000 grant from the Sydney catchment Authority has funded this trial area, showing their commitment to catchment health and good water quality. We hope to work co-operatively in the future with the S.C.A.

F.A.F.S.P.E.C. TRAINING COOURSES.

The FAFSPEC accredited courses have been very popular. Thanks to Doug Werrin and Wayne Lemke for the Chain Saw Courses. Also held was a planting and preparation course. We see training courses in the future as an important function of the Group.

VISITING GROUPS.

During the year we entertained 2 South African groups, Indian Foresters, Western Sydney University, A.N.U. Canberra, Ultimo Tech, University of Melbourne and Goulburn Tech and other Landcare groups.

N.H.T. FUNDING APPLICATIONS.

These have unfortunately been rejected for 2001. The rejection of funding for the use of the Resource Centre, field days and training courses is very disappointing for those members who have donated their time and energy setting up the Resource Centre.

This seems to go against the whole idea of Landcare to arouse awareness and show what can be done. The options now for 2001 are to cease operation or charge for the use of the resource centre. We will however continue with efforts to achieve funding in the next 12 months.

## GARDENING IN DECEMBER

Time for planting beans, corn, beetroot, spinach, broccoli, cabbage, carrots, marrows, parsley, parsnips, pumpkins, late tomatoes, lettuce and radish.

Cauliflower seed can now be sown. Some of the varieties mature at different times and if you like large cauliflowers, this is the time to sow them for winter. Broccoli can also be planted now and should be ready to cut during autumn.

It is also time to protect your fruit trees from fruit fly. Spray your apples, pears, peaches, nectarine and quinces with Rogor or Lebaycide. These two chemicals are absorbed by the skin of the fruit and is not washed off by rain. It is recommended to spray apples, pears, etc every three weeks and again two weeks before ripening.

If you have roses, and it is hot and humid, spray your roses with Benlate, if its dry, spray with Lebaycide. Fertilise with blood and bone or rose food.


