## BUNGONIA PARK TRUST

### THE PRESIDENT'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDING JUNE 30th 2001.

This year has again been a very successful one, but one which is satisfyingly unusual in one respect. At last we have visible evidence of our work: the children's play equipment, the new trees along the creek, the trees planted in the park in conjunction with the Progress Association, and the removal of some of the willows and hawthorns.

The year began with our receiving a grant to remove willows from Bungonia Creek north of the bridge. That was done.

The "Clean Up Australia" day continues to stimulate us to remove rubbish from Woodward's Creek. To that end, we have received a grant from D.L.W.C. to fence off that creek to prevent dumping.

We also received a grant from the Department of Sport and Recreation to help us buy and erect the children's play equipment to replace that which many previous trustees had put up but which later had to be removed, (a thoroughly disheartening experience for all of them). We intend to buy more equipment.

Renovation of the War Memorial continued, and Ryan and Mitchell raise the National flag on important national days, as Allan Moran did at the very moving service on Anzac Day.

The barbecue area continues to be a popular lunch-time spot for tourists and working folk.

For the first time, the park was given over to a public event: the Great Windellama vs Bungonia New Year's Cricket Match which, miraculously, both sides managed to win. We hope that this will become an annual event. That's what the park is for.

Perhaps the most significant occasion in the year was the generous work done by the children of Windellama school, who, with their parents, the principal, Rosemary Chapman and her staff, cared for some 300 tube-stock trees which had been provided by "Greening Australia" and then planted them in one afternoon along the bank of the creek in the park. Most of them by far are thriving.

All of us who enjoy using the park, or even simply enjoy looking at it, owe gratitude to many people who are not trustees: David Byrne, Rod Fabri, Bill Feeney, Greg and Judy Gibbons, Alan Travers, Col Phillips, for example, and in a particular way, to Maureen Eddy and Inda Evans who so ably support us in the Shire Council, and Inda especially who guides us with expert and kindly advice. We thank, too, the Council and its officers for their mowing the park which saves us a great deal time and energy.

Lastly, I have to commend, and express my gratitude to, every one of my fellow park trustees, who have worked so hard writing submissions, attending meetings, dealing with public servants, mowing, planting, watering, and removing unwanted plants and noxious weeds. In short, they have laboured mightily for the park and the village.

### JACQUA CREEK LANDCARE GROUP INC

In November Jacqua Creek Landcare Group targeted a section of the creek on Ken & Dianna Morans property. They viewed the area planned to be revegetated & fenced and examined the erosion. In particular there are two heads needing urgent attention. The lower one was badly eroded in recent heavy rains and will need extensive work to prevent further erosion, the upper one could be stabilised with a couple of truck loads of heavy stones. By stemming erosion we stop good soil washing down stream, which in turn improves water quality. It takes a community effort to help one landholder but the benefit flows to everyone. The 'Weeds Won't Wait' seminar on noxious weeds will be held in the Bungonia hall on sat 2<sup>nd</sup> March. This is a free seminar and should be of interest to land holders large & small. ### **SPRING / SUMMER LOTS OF Paddock FEED!**

It's great all that lovely green grass, drops the feed bill down a lot too! Unfortunately for a lot of equine owners it is also a worrying time, some horses and a lot of ponies are quite inclined to grow overweight. Once overweight the potential of the equine to founder (Laminitis) is of concern to its owner.

If your horse or pony is too fat, control the amount of paddock feed it has access to, and cut back (or out if very fat) its hand feed. If your pony is obese you may have to keep it in a pasture free area, only feeding a small amount of hay until it has lost its extra weight. Remember to always have water available. Prevention is the best policy, as founder can cause permanent damage and in some cases may lead to death.

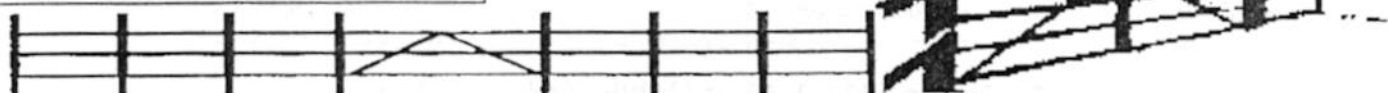

## Gardening in December

Time for planting beans, corn, beetroot, spinach, broccoli, cabbage, carrots, marrows, parsley, parsnips, pumpkins, late tomatoes, lettuce and radish.

Cauliflower seed can now be sown. Some of the varieties mature at different times and if you like large cauliflowers, this is the time to sow them for winter. Broccoli can also be planted now and should be ready to cut during autumn.

It is also time to protect your fruit trees from fruit fly. Spray your apples, pears, peaches, nectarine and quinces with Rogor or Lebaycide. These two chemicals are absorbed by the skin of the fruit and is not washed off by rain. It is recommended to spray apples, pears, etc every three weeks and again two weeks before ripening.

If you have roses, and it is hot and humid, spray your roses with Benlate, if its dry, spray with Lebaycide. Fertilise with blood and bone or rose food.

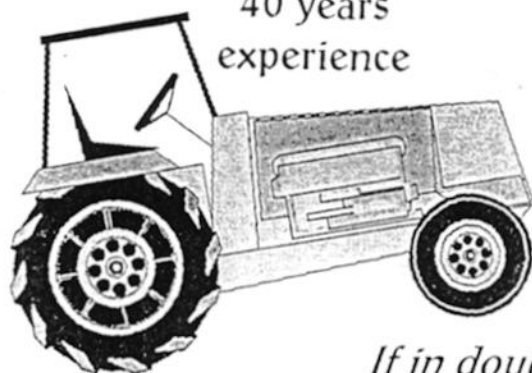

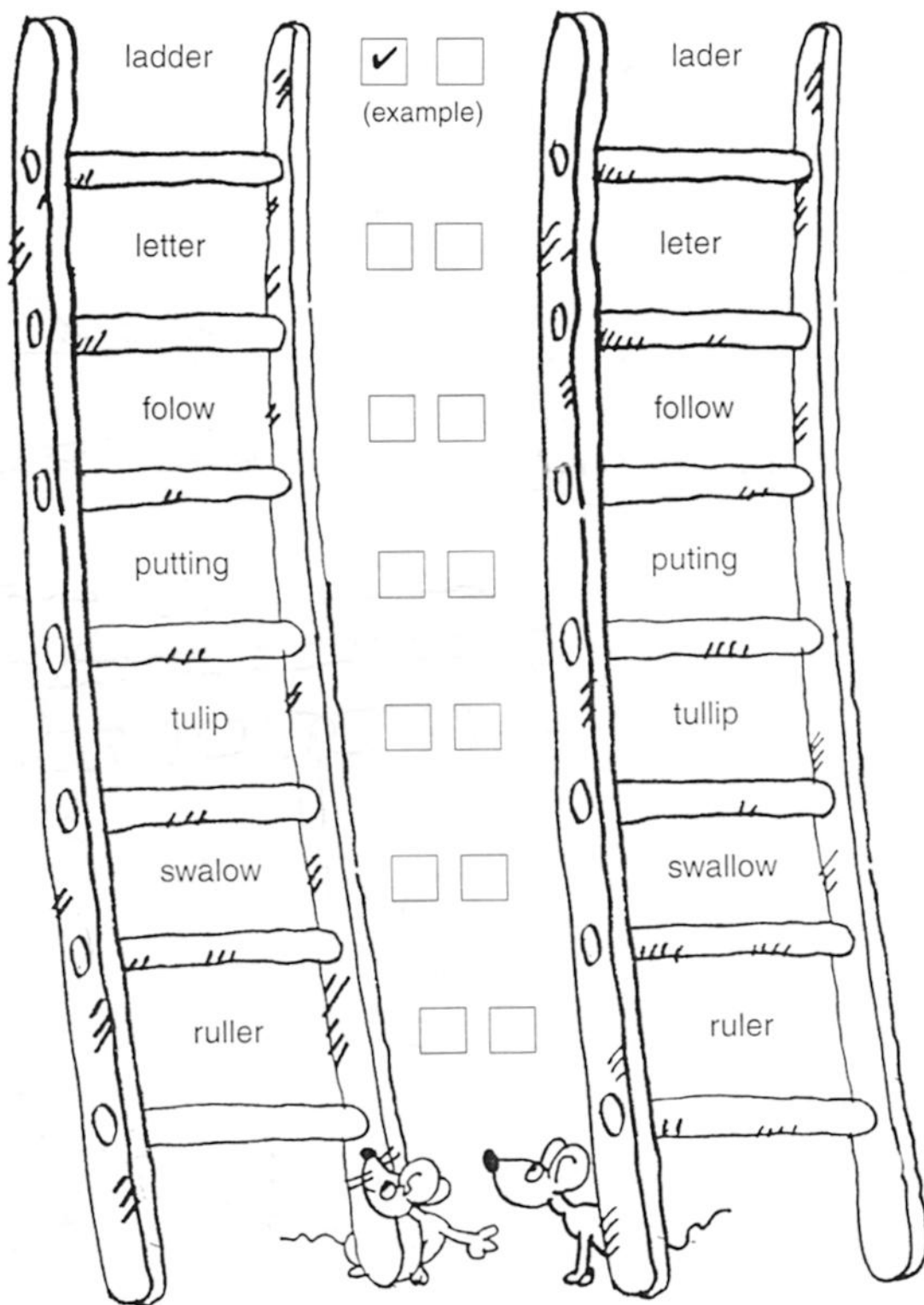
