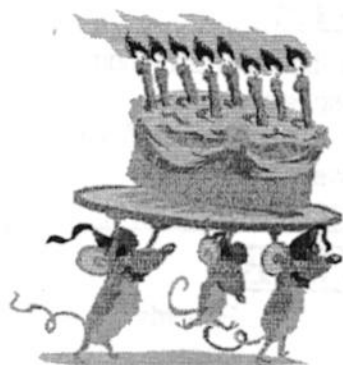

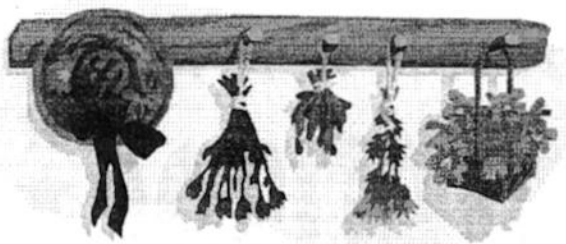

Gardening in December

Time for planting beans, corn, beetroot, spinach, broccoli, cabbage, carrots, marrows, parsley, parsnips, pumpkins, late tomatoes, lettuce and radish.

Cauliflower seed can now be sown. Some of the varieties mature at different times and if you like large cauliflowers, this is the time to sow them for winter. Broccoli can also be planted now and should be ready to cut during autumn.

It is also time to protect your fruit trees from fruit fly. Spray your apples, pears, peaches, nectarine and quinces with Rogor or Lebaycide. These two chemicals are absorbed by the skin of the fruit and is not washed off by rain. It is recommended to spray apples, pears, etc every three weeks and again two weeks before ripening.

If you have roses, and it is hot and humid, spray your roses with Benlate, if its dry, spray with Lebaycide. Fertilise with blood and bone or rose food.

Summer Reading Safari

The Goulburn Branch Library is holding a Summer Reading Safari for children 5 to 12 years of age. The Summer Reading Safari involves reading a minimum of 4 books at the child's reading level over the duration of the safari. All books must be borrowed from the Southern Tablelands Regional Library. For all participants reading commences on Monday, December 23 and hand in your completed reading log on Wednesday, January 22 to be part of the presentation morning to be held Friday, January 24 at 10:30am.

To participate in the Summer Reading Safari all parents need to do is come into the library on December 23, or during the week before to register their child and pick up the Summer Reading Safari bag, which also includes the reading log.

For every book a child reads they can come into the library with their reading log to have it stamped and pick up some more activity sheets that will be found outside of the Kids Zone.

The Goulburn Library is also inviting young adults along to the library. If you are starting Year 7 in 2003 the library is offering an introductory session into how to succeed at school assignments by learning how to carry out research. Young adults are also invited to help us choose young adult fiction and non-fiction to be added the library resources. Bookings will be required for both sessions.

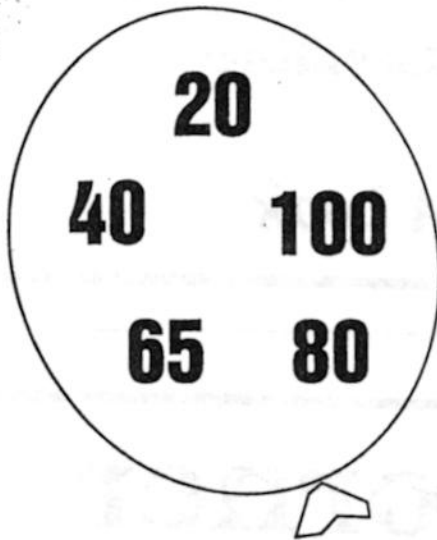

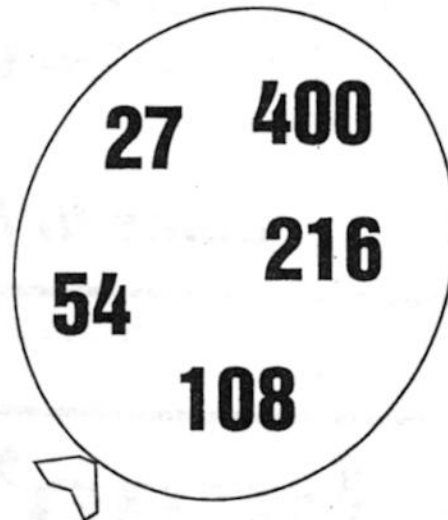

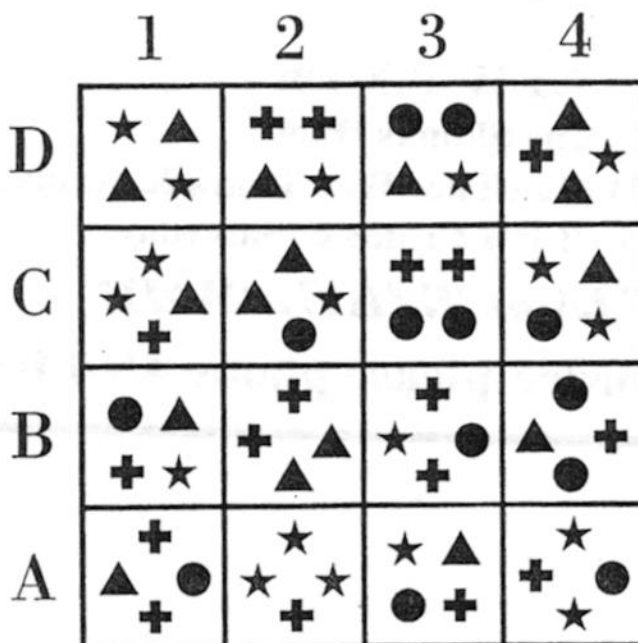

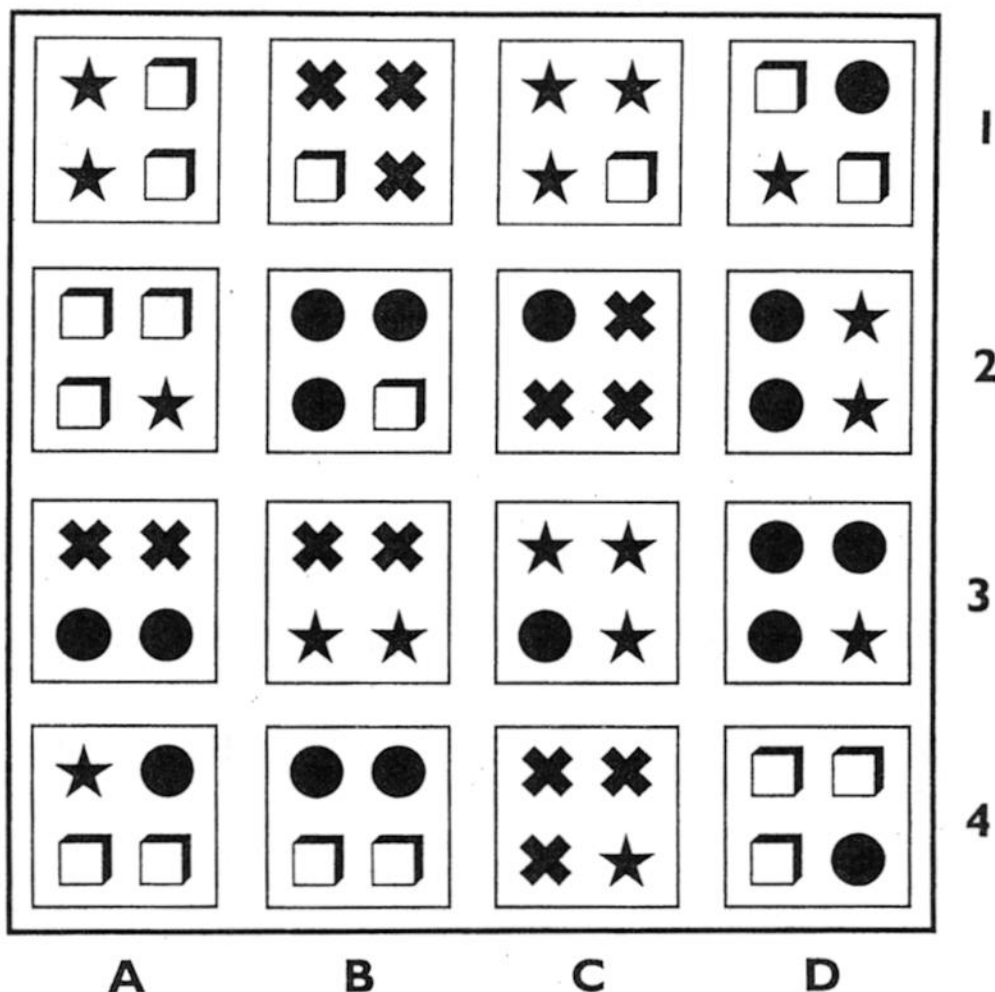

New Environmental Courses

Diploma in Conservation and Land Management

This new course will provide you with a thorough grounding in environmental conservation and land management. It replaces the Diploma in Natural Resource Management. You will acquire a range of broad-based, technical and field skills through practical hands on teaching. It is designed for anyone who would like to be employed in conservation and land or bushland regeneration, park management or wildlife management. Graduates can proceed to university studies with advanced standing.

Classes run for 3 days per week. The course fee is \$710 per year. Students will be expected to purchase a small number of textbooks

Natural Area Restoration (Certificate 3)



This course is for anyone who would like to learn more about restoring and repairing degraded bushland. It is ideal for those who want to work in the bushland regeneration industry, members of Landcare groups or anyone who has their own patch of bush and wants to know how to manage it.

Classes are on Monday evenings for a year. In addition there are four or five field sessions held on Saturday each semester.

Agricultural Courses

Certificate 3 in Agriculture
