On the 30th October, 2003, the small Village of Bungonia turned out in force to honour one of their much loved sons, Bert Latham, who had been involved in our little township for most of his long life. He was a life member of the Bushfire Brigade and many of the Brigade members turned out to accompany the hearse from the Church to the grave side, with the fire truck leading the procession. The ladies from Bungonia CWA prepared a luncheon at the commuty hall for the family and mourners to relax and socialise after the ceremony.



Some of us older residents will always associate Bert with the announcement "Take your partners for the Monte Carlo". He was M.C. for the dances at the Bungonia Hall when the prizes were cigarettes and chocolates and you bought tickets giving you so many chances when you were cut out. Bert always kept an eye open for those couples who crossed over after the cut. He was a life member of the Progress Association, Captain of the Rifle Club, a Deputy Captain of the Bush Fire Brigade, a Park Trustee, a member of the Cemetery Committee, the Combined Churches Organization, the Tennis Club, the Back to Bungonia Committee

His great love was the Rifle Club and this year he gave the History Society a guided tour of the old Rifle Range. Thankfully, a couple of people had tape recorders so that the information about the range, the competition and the equipment has been preserved.

Bert was a member of a family that participated in and contributed to community life and he followed the family tradition. Thank you Bert for your years of service and your friendship.

### Betty South

Betty South, a long time resident of the Bungonia district, was buried at the Bungonia Cemetery in October. Betty was born in Queensland and moved to Bungonia after she married Ken. To-gether they developed their property and took an active part in the life of the village. Betty was a life member of the Country Women's Association and was Treasurer for 26 years. Betty and Ken always attended the village dances and other social functions. She was an inspiration to all of us in the way she rehabilitated herself after a debilitating stroke. Betty moved to Goulburn to live when they sold their property.

### ANNUAL REPORT 2003

All ground work has been limited by lack of funding for any major projects, but the year has seen the completion of the "GULLY FROM HELL", project started in 1995. The final stage completion of p. radiata plantings of approx 15 hectares, the trialling of p. brutia and planting of a wildlife native corridor connecting the catchment of Spring and Bungonia Creeks with 3000 native species and direct seeding. The final stages funded by a small grant from STFFN and by S.C.A.

The earlier plantings, now 7-8 years old have been pruned and thinned to a stand density of 4 - 500 stems per hectare. This management regime of planting at 1000 per hectare allows for some failures and removal of low grade trees. The goals of erosion control and reducing of serrated tussock spread have been successful. The whole area is now revegetated with forest and a complete ground cover of native grasses. We welcome any visitors to see what has been achieved in 7-8 years.

The next 12 months will see some big changes in Landcare and Natural Resource Management in NSW. The Premier has recently announced a major overhaul to cut red tape, provide more funding and hopefully make it easier for farmers to carry on with their work. This historic agreement between farmers, Government and environmentalists is aimed at stimulating environmentally friendly farm practices to improve a degraded landscape. Funding will be directed to and controlled by local communities instead of being lost in bureaucracy.

The present 72 boards and committees including 19 Catchment Boards, 20 Vegetation Boards and 33 water Management Committees, will be replaced by 13 Catchment Authorities. In this area we will be included in Southern Rivers--an area South of Sydney to the Victorian Border, amalgamating the Southern and South East C.M.B.

The primary role of the Catchment Authorities will be to act as a support resource for farmers, offering information and advice. By January 2005 CMA's will oversee on farm consent issues and resolve local disputes via consultation and collaboration. Each C.M.A. will be made up of a maximum of 7 board members with agricultural, scientific, environmental, economic and local Government expertise drawn from the area with an independent chair appointed by the Minister.

Just how all this will evolve should become clear in the next 12 months and hopefully the work of Landcare will become more significant. In our own small area much of the necessary work has been completed and I see our future role more as an educational one involving more use of the Resource Centre and building on what we have already done. Farm forestry will continue to be significant environmental tool to achieve better catchment, as well as an economic incentive to farmer. Unfortunately there will still be a bias toward anything native, as opposed to any exotic tree farming which in our area has a lot to offer. Any revegetation and catchment improvement policies must consider the economic and social aspect as well as environmental goals --- I feel we have achieved this at Inverary Creek Landcare.

My thanks to the committee and all those who have supported Landcare during the year/ I hope we can have the same commitment for 2004 and that some financial assistance is forthcoming to continue our work. Funding has been requested to monitor and publish results of all trial plantings of natives since 1986 which should be very helpful to any locals thinking of future tree planting.

A brief report for you at this time. We have little factual information to give at this time although the rumour mill is rife! These range from sale of Ardmore Park to the continuation of the EIS for the chicken industry. I myself rang Mr. Mikosic to ask him when the water testing may be done as it will affect us personally and we wanted to ensure that we were present at testing. He stated to me that his hydrologist would be contacting me the following week. This did not eventuate!!!

We are however told on good authority that the EIS for the chicken industry at Ardmore Park has been withdrawn, and we are further informed that an application is in progress for a Rock mining and sand quarry to be followed by a rubbish dump is in the pipeline. This new rumour if it is correct will still present the traffic issues of which we are already aware and may still include major water issues. This as we say is yet to be confirmed. We will keep you advised as more information becomes available.

May we also take this opportunity to wish everyone a safe and festive season and we hope that the New Year brings a positive resolution for all of us.

## Clean Up Day

Council's Annual clean-up in village areas will take place on Monday 15 December 2003.

Please make sure your rubbish is put out early, securely tied, and bundles able to be picked up by one person. Please don't leave out large items that should normally be taken to the tip for disposal.

If the material is not picked up on the Monday, please be patient as delays could be experienced if there is a large amount to be collected throughout the Shire.

If in doubt, call Council and check on details. But above all, please co-operate as this is a valuable service and we do not want to jeopardise its future.

## No to B-Double Route

At the October Council meeting (too late to include in the November Times) Council refused an application for a B-double route along Jerrara Road, through the village and along Oallen Ford Road to Ardmore Park.

Judging from the number of photographs included with the application, the proposed route had been checked out. Our view, however, was that the route was a country road quite unsuitable for the type of vehicles proposed.

Over the whole period of my time on Council, I have received constant requests for road improvements, including requests for line marking along Jerrara Road.

Line marking has not been possible primarily because the road is too narrow for this and would require widening along its entire length. In addition, I successfully sought advisory speed signs along that road where bends reduced visibility.

Under such conditions, I believe it would be totally irresponsible to consider allowing B-doubles access. We have enough issues with increasing traffic as it is.

## Rural Watch

Congratulations to Bungonia's

Rural Watch group.

This is the only one of its kind in the Shire at present and has attracted Council's attention through its work. To help give them a boost towards fundraising, Council has given them a grant of \$200, presented last month by Deputy Mayor, Maureen Eddy.

Rural Watch operates in conjunction with the police and is a neighbour-help-neighbour group looking out for each others properties. And Council encourages more such groups to be established throughout the Shire.

## Development Control

At the November meeting, Council resolved to convert their guidelines for Poultry Farm Development, Dwelling Houses & Class 10 Buildings and Rural Subdivision for Dwelling Houses to Development Control Plans which give the documents legal status. They are therefore currently on public exhibition for comment.

## On Exhibition

A revamped plan for Section 94 development contributions will be on public exhibition this month. If you are thinking about subdivision or other development, you may be interested in having a look and commenting.

The purpose of the contributions is to ensure that developments that contribute to increased population, greater road usage etc, also contribute to the increased costs of maintenance and provision of public facilities.

## Amalgamations

Professor Daly has presented his report to the Minister who has passed it on to the Boundaries Commission.

More information is coming through virtually daily, however, as the Bungonia Times goes to print, the situation is as follows.

Daly has recommended "super

councils" formed roughly along water catchment boundaries.

This makes for a Southern Tablelands council incorporating most of Mulwaree Shire, some of Gunning Shire, a tiny bit of Yass Shire and the whole of Crookwell Shire and Goulburn.

Some of the proposed elements include a total of nine councillors (including the mayor) for the entire region divided (in the first instance) into four as yet undefined wards and a mayor to be elected by popular vote. Based on a total population (in round figures) 34,000 of whom 7000 would be Mulwaree residents, each ward would need to encompass 8500 people. That means that the entire current Shire could end up as one ward with a maximum of two elected Councillors to represent them all.

Another super council is recommended south of us which would merge Queanbeyan, Yarralumla, Tallaganda, the rest of Yass and Gunning and some of Cooma-Monaro.

Daly's recommendations have been passed on to the Boundaries Commission. If you have access to the internet you can view them on the Department of Local Government's web site. Follow the prompts through to Boundaries Commission and Mergers & Boundary alteration proposals.

It must be noted that Daly's proposals appear on that site as proposals put forward by the Minister himself. Given that slant, what hope is there for the Commission to view all submissions in an unbiased way?

It seems more and more likely that the State Government has made up its mind to have just a few huge Councils throughout the State and does not care what you think or what you want from Local Government.

To help you win the best possible results for your future, I encourage you all to unite as one strong community, when the time comes, to elect those you believe will best serve your needs as well as the needs of the whole region
