GARDENING IN FEBRUARY

This is the month that bulbs start appearing in nurseries. They can be planted in moss, rockeries or pots, in groups. Fruit trees should be watched for fruit fly which can be controlled with Rogor or Lebaycid. Plan for a continuous supply during winter of cabbage, cauliflower, broccoli and brussels sprouts to enable them to get well established before the cold weather. They need plenty of compost and well rotted animal manure plus lime before planting. Carrots, parsnips, celery, kolrabi, lettuce, parsley, radish and turnips may also be planted. Mildew on marrow, cucumbers, squash and zucchini can be controlled by spraying with Zineb or Benlate.

LOOKING BACK INTO OUR PAST

NOTES ON THE CONSTRUCTION AND OPENING OF THE BUNGONIA WAR MEMORIAL

A Public Meeting in 1948 decided to erect a Memorial in memory of the local boys who paid the supreme sacrifice in World War II, in conjunction with a Roll of Honour for those who served in the services. A voluntary collection was taken throughout the district to raise the necessary funds.

The base of the memorial was completed by voluntary labour.

The Memorial was purchased and erected by J.Turner and Son. The Official Opening was April 30, 1949. G.Ryan was Chairman and the Official Speakers were Mr.P.R.D.Hollia (Mayor of Goulburn), Mr.G.Goodhew (President of Mulwaree Shire), The President of the Goulburn R.S.L, and ministers from the Church of England and Catholic Churches.

Mr.L.J.Tully, M.L.A., performed the Official Opening.

The Goulburn R.S.L. Band was in full attendance and there was a very large gathering of people.

THIS WAS THE FIRST OPENING OF A MEMORIAL ANYWHERE IN THE GOULBURN DISTRICT AFTER THE 1939-45 WAR.

Welcome to our Landcare report for 1998.
There has been quiet a lot happening since the last report, so I will provide you with an update.

IBIS AWARDS.

Inverary was nominated for the prestigious Commonwealth Bank IBIS Award for achievement in Landcare, won the Southern Division and will be represented in the final State Award presentation at Harold Park at a dinner presentation on Tuesday, 20th January.

N.S.W. INDIVIDUAL LANDCARE AWARDS.

Achieved a Silver Award for INDIVIDUAL LANDCARER for 1997.

N.S.W. TREE FARMER OF YEAR

Runner up for 1997. We hope as an active Group to keep up this standard in 1998.

PROJECTS FOR 1998

A P. radiata trial of 5 hectares will be planted at Carne to investigate the effects on serrated tussock control. Ripping and mounding for this and at Inverary, G. Burkitt and P. Broadheads has already been completed for planting in June.

A grant of approx \$5000 has been promised from the Dept of Agric to look at commercial pine planting on acid soils on the head of Bob's Creek Catchment. Prof John Fields from A.N.U. will be involved with his students on monitoring this trial.

Another funding approved includes \$19000 for more reclamation of Inverary Creek in Guy Burkitt's. Earthworks, ripping and mounding have been completed.

One exciting announcement is the possible involvement of corporate sponsorship in Farm Forestry development for erosion and Farm Forestry. If this eventuates more hectares will be planted on Bob's Creek. With the decade of Landcare coming to an end in 2000 I feel it is essential we start looking at corporate funding.

A special funding meeting held on November 3rd set priorities for grant application for 1998-9. These include:-

- * Continuing work of Inverary Creek.
- * Sub catchment Plan for Spring Creek and Washedaway.
- * Remnant vegetation.
- * Erosion control on Washedaway.
- * Acid soils and farm forestry.
- * Eucalypt and Acacia trials.

Projects on the will be prepared for the NHT round of funding closing in March. We are also approaching LAWC for trials to be funded by Sydney Water Catchment Protection Scheme.

Welcome to 1998 and it's back to news, views and reviews, and hopefully a productive year for all.

Council Meeting Dates

Meetings start at 9am and are open to the public. Everyone who would like to listen to Council's decision making process is welcome to attend.

On occasions, there may be some confidential issues, such as legal matters, to be discussed and would take place first. As a result, the open meeting could be delayed a while but this is usually no longer than 15 or 20 minutes.

Rural Addressing

The road names for our area submitted, so far, to the Geographical Names Board are:
Goulburn-Bungonia Road -
Mountain Ash Road
Tarago-Bungonia Road - Lumley Road
Bungonia-Marulan Road - Jerrara Road
Bungonia-Windellama Road -
Oallen Ford Road

When the names are finally gazetted by the Board, the next

stage of the rural addressing program will be able to commence ie numbering properties along each road.

But don't hold your breath - that's not likely to happen next week or next month. I'll keep you posted.

Medical Services

The doctor who visited Marulan every Wednesday morning from the Goulburn Medical Clinic will no longer be coming to Marulan.

At a public meeting last month, the town's residents unanimously voted to find a replacement and expand the service. This will not be easy as suitable premises need to be found.

Ideally, a professional centre could be established to provide part time and shared services of doctor, nurse, baby health clinic, solicitor, accountant, etc.

I would be interested to know if anyone in Bungonia district supports such a proposal and would use services located at Marulan. Please let me know.

End to Airport Debate?

I was pleased to hear that the ALP conference in Hobart last month declared their support for Sydney's second airport to stay in Sydney.

It would seem logical that, if neither major political party supports Goulburn's position, it should put a stop to any further lobbying on their part. Let's wait and see.

My thanks to everyone who signed the petition against the proposed "Goulburn option" (and against proposed amalgamation with Goulburn!). Your support has been invaluable and these records will be placed in safe keeping. Be assured - they will be used, if required.

Art & Culture

The local arts community has decided to establish Mulwaree Arts - a group through which applications for funding grants can be made and a centre for networking throughout the area.

Congratulations to them! I hope they succeed in their endeavours to provide locals with arts and cultural facilities as well as attracting visiting performances and exhibitions.

Karen Boland who owns Baldock's Store in Marulan has been elected President of the group and Fay D'Elmaine of Tallong is Secretary (phone 4841 0390). Contact Fay if you would like to join. Membership has been set at \$10 and proceeds of these and any funds raised will go towards more arts activities.

Baldock's Store will house Mulwaree Crafted Arts and will take your goods on commission.

After some renovations, it is expected to be open by Easter. If you can help out on working bees, please contact Fay.

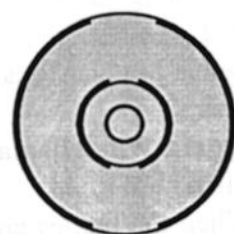

CAPTAIN'S REPORT

Since my last report in November, the Brigade has attended 5 incidents, 1 being a false alarm, in all over 150 man hours have been spent. attending these incidents.

17/12/97 Bungonia-3 and 4 crew members attended a fire at "Strawberry Lane", Windellama Road, Bungonia. (22 1/2 man hours.)

23/12/97 Lot 29 Bungonia Road, Marulan. Bungonia-3 and 5 crew members, together with Marulan-3 attended a false alarm. (4 man hours.)

29/12/97 & 30/12/97 Bungonia-3 and Bungonia-4 attended the Fire at Cullula Road, Windellama. 17 crew members attended. (108 man hours). This was an excellent effort, and both the initial crew and the night crew received considerable praise for their efforts from the South Group and East Group Captains.

1/1/98 Bungonia-3 & Bungonia-4/2 - plus 6 crew - were called out to a fire 1 Km. from the junction of the Windellama-Goulburn Road, on the Bungonia-Tarago Road, this fire was contained before our arrival and we were recalled. (6 man hours.)

1/1/98 Bungonia-3 and 5 crew attended a small lighting strike 1 Km. N.E. of "Brisbane Meadows" homestead, towards the State Recreation Area. (10 man hours.)

My thanks, to all the members who have assisted with the call-outs and truck maintenance in these difficult times. REMEMBER - the worst fires in this area often occur late in the season during March.

CHARLIE KLEIN - FIRE CAPTAIN

Residents may be interested to read the following Rural Fire Service Regulations.

22 Other safety requirements

- (1) A person must not (in connection with any agricultural, pastoral or other land use) drive or use in any grass, crop or stubble land any motorised machine unless:
 - (a) the machine is constructed so that any heated areas will not come into contact with combustible matter, and
 - (b) the machine is maintained in a good and serviceable condition so as to prevent the outbreak of fire.
- (2) A person must not (in connection with any agricultural, pastoral or other land use):
 - (a) drive or use in any grass, crop or stubble land a motorised machine on which it is practicable to carry prescribed fire safety equipment, or
 - (b) carry out welding operations or use explosives or an angle grinder or any other implement that is likely to generate sparks,unless the person carries on the machine, or has in the vicinity, prescribed fire safety equipment and that equipment is maintained in a serviceable condition.
Maximum penalty (subclauses (1) and (2)): 20 penalty units.
- (3) In this clause:
prescribed fire safety equipment means:
 - (a) a knapsack spray pump of 16 litre minimum capacity filled with water, or
 - (b) a fire extinguisher (liquid type) of 9 litre minimum capacity, or
 - (c) a dry powder type extinguisher of 0.9 kg minimum capacity.

June 27 was the wettest day with 129mm

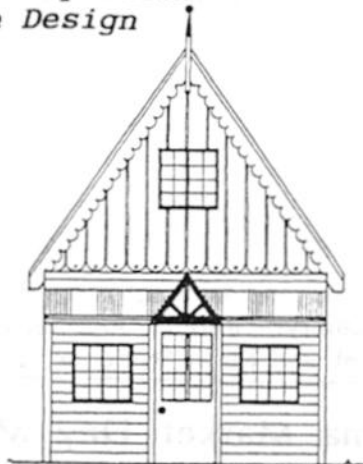
