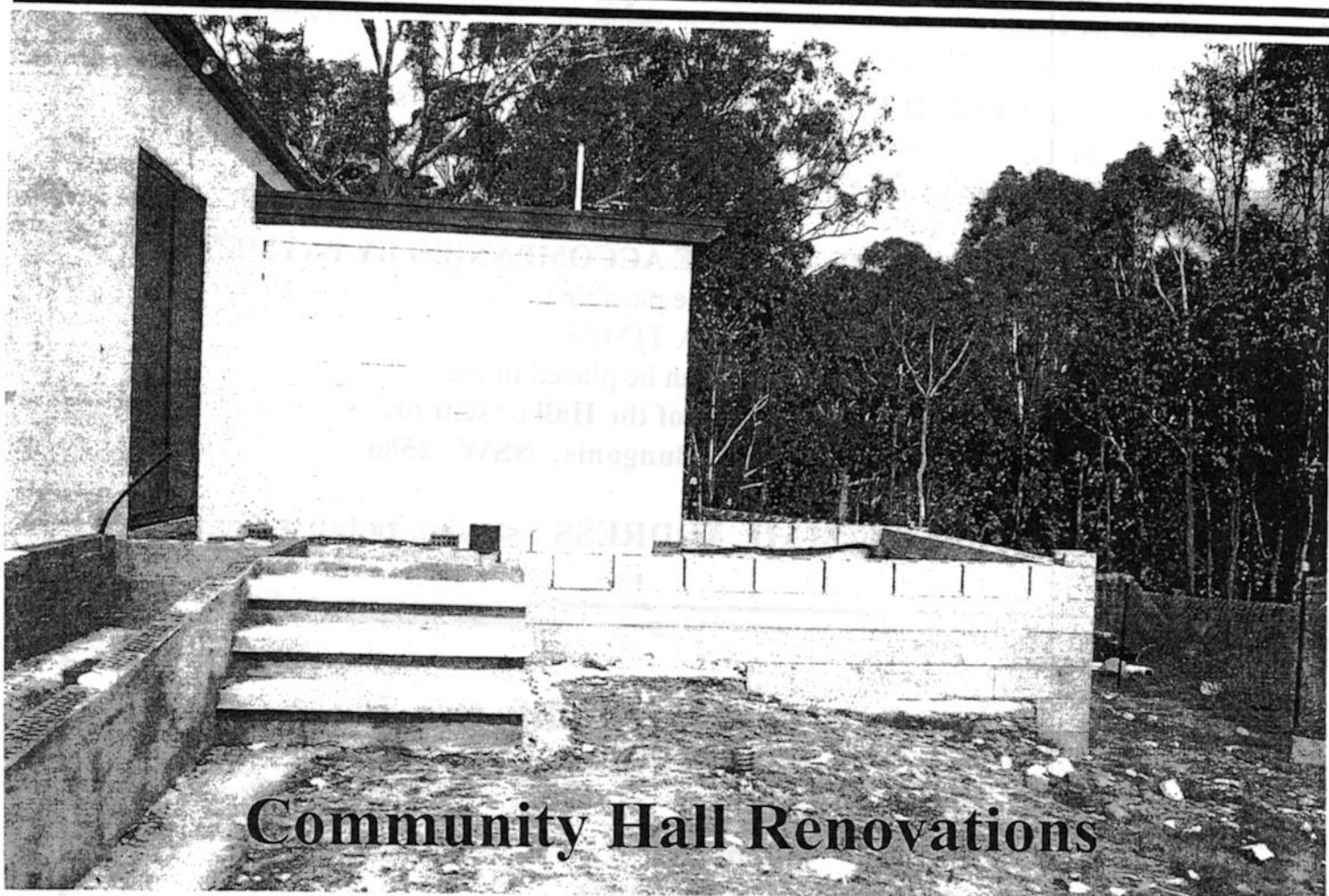

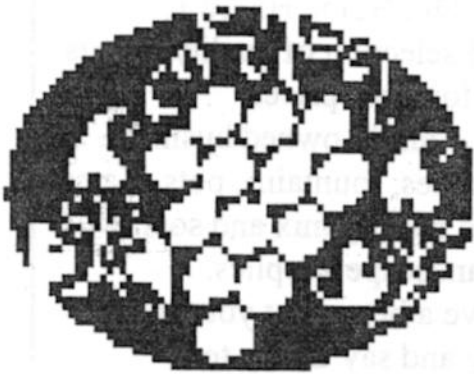

We are already off to a good start to 2006 with intensive work being done by Councillors on our future strategic direction that is critical to our Management Plan that informs Council about high level strategic outcomes to be achieved by Goulburn Mulwaree Council.

Under the leadership of the General Manager, Luke Johnson, your councillors will have (by the time you read this) participated in a workshop that looked at the key planning issues of ensuring that our Goulburn Mulwaree area develops a strong economy, grows a vibrant community, develops quality infrastructure, ensures a sustainable environment, retains our heritage and works to make our council a leading organisation. Council aims to link its corporate & strategic goals with national, state & regional plans & strategies.

- The Goulburn Mulwaree Council organised 10<sup>th</sup> Annual Australian Blues Music Festival is on from 10 –12 February & is well on track to being the most successful yet. There will be plenty of free entertainment in Belmore Park over the weekend plus markets in Montague Street on the Saturday. There will also be buskers throughout the city & in several eateries. The Goulburn Regional Conservatorium is staging performances in St Saviours Hall on the Saturday.
- Goulburn Mulwaree is to be the consent authority for the Kenmore Hospital Redevelopment project and NOT the Minister.
- A draft contribution plan is to be drawn up for Marulan due to rapidly increasing development pressure on sewerage, water & stormwater drainage infrastructure.
- 5 more lots of rural subdivision have been approved for 2361 Mayfield Road, Tarago.
- Significant DAs currently before Council include the Longreach redevelopment of Kenmore; a 29 lot subdivision on 1766 Oallen Ford Road; a 9 lot subdivision at Brayton; a 37 lot subdivision at 6547 Federal H'Way, Wollongorang; 20 lot subdivision at Marulan; 8 townhouses at Ledgeville, Gbn; 118 lot subdivision at lot 1, Clyde St. Gbn; 79 lot subdivision at 13 Clyde st. Gbn & a multi-unit development at 62 & 74 Cowper St Gbn.
- Goulburn Regional Art Gallery has received a \$15,450 grant from NSW Govt Ministry for Arts for an exhibition & residency project at the gallery to be taken up by Michelago artist, Steven Holland with his work *Steven Mark Holland: snake stories*.
- Goulburn Regional Art Gallery has applied to the Mulwaree Trust for \$5,000 to assist with its art education programs with regional schools in 2006.
- Council has adopted the Goulburn Airport Advisory Committee's recommendation to install a (fuel) bowser system that allows a range of normal credit card to be used rather than limiting option to Mobil Fuel Card.
- Also on the Airport, sewer construction is to commence mid January.
- Greg Finlayson commenced in December as Manager Water Services.
- On the rural engineering scene – waterway calculations are complete for Bumana Creek Bridge on Middle Arm Road; preparations are underway to issue EOIs for design of the Komungla Bridge replacement.
- A "Sun Safe & Smoke Free Policy" is being prepared for playgrounds in the Council area – this will include Tarago Park.

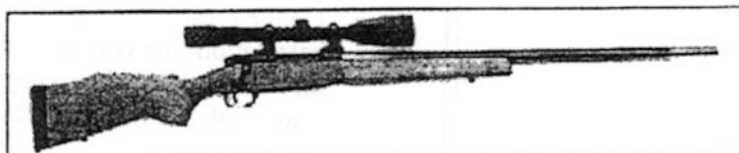

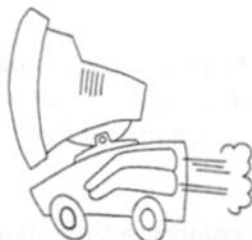

# ADVANCING BURRINJUCK

A monthly report on State Parliamentary matters by Katrina Hodgkinson MP.



A monthly report on State Parliamentary matters by Katrina Hodgkinson MP, Member for Burrinjuck.  
20 January 2006

With the approach of Australia Day, it is timely to reflect on our society and our hopes for the future. NSW is the oldest representative democracy in Australia. Our system of democratic representation at both Federal and State levels has stood this nation in good stead in what has been a very turbulent phase of world history.

I believe that we should take great pride that Australia has been able to grow as a strong and stable society despite the many tumultuous events of the last century, which saw the great depression, world and regional wars and revolutions, which have brought about and toppled world powers.

On Australia Day we should all celebrate the many factors that bind us together as a peaceful and open society. This year I will be attending Australia Day celebrations in Yass and Boorowa and I look forward to a great day of celebrations focused on our most fortunate circumstances as residents of this great nation.

\*\*\*This month I invited Shadow Minister for Primary Industries, Duncan Gay, to visit landowners affected by the bushfires near Crookwell and Boorowa with me. Also this month I met with local Mayors in Batlow to discuss concerns about NSW Labor's proposed sale of Snowy Hydro Authority.

I attended Austral's Ground Breaking Ceremony of the new Coles Myer Distribution Centre in Goulburn and I also inspected the existing distribution centre. It was a great pleasure for me to host a presentation by Shadow Minister for Natural Resources and Shadow Minister for Lands, Adrian Piccoli, to Goulburn locals and landholders to discuss issues such as water rights, crown road leases and native vegetation.

I also signed a Memorandum of Understanding with both the Goulburn Soldier's Club and the Goulburn Worker's Club to reduce the tax State burden that is impacting on their support of local community groups. This month I have held constituent interviews in Batlow, Tumut, Gundagai, Boorowa, Crookwell and Goulburn.

\*\*\*Parliament will resume scheduled sittings on 28 February.

## Tax Relief for Clubs

On behalf of a future Coalition Government, I recently signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Goulburn Worker's Club and the Goulburn Soldier's Club to reduce the onerous tax burden that is currently imposed on them by the NSW Labor Government.

There are 17 clubs in the Burrinjuck electorate, which have had their tax rates increased by the NSW Labor Government by 20% over the past 16 months. Local clubs have informed me that this is severely impacting their ability to support community groups. Under the agreement that I signed, clubs in the electorate of Burrinjuck will save \$2.2 million under a Coalition Government. This is money that would be much better spent supporting local schools, sporting clubs and community groups.

## Veterans Affairs – Country Visit Program

The Department of Veterans' Affairs is conducting visits to local areas as part of the Department's commitment to assist Veterans, War Widows, their dependents and carers. Interviews with Veterans' Affairs staff may be arranged by calling Freecall 1300 55 1918. Visits will be held at the Boorowa Ex-Services Club on Tuesday 28 February from 10.30am.

I strongly urge everyone to discuss this important issue with their families. ## \*\*\*Review of Care and Protection Act

## **FEBRUARY 2006 REPORT**

Inverary Landcare has now been operating since 1993 during which time a lot has been achieved in addressing land degradation problems, water quality, revegetation, salinity control, promotion of private forestry both exotic and native and in general aiming at sustainable land management.

We have continued to promote extensive tree plantings as a method to achieve these aims and I feel it is worth a visit to see the results achieved.

**ANNUAL MEETING** - The annual meeting saw the election of the same committee for 2006 with the aim to continue as we have been operating, to put ground works in place when money is available. A grant of \$17,000 from the special drought round of Envirofund will be used to fence out several hectares of wet creek lines and provide alternate reticulated water for stock. This will involve plating out the creek area with several thousands of native trees and some P. Radiata.

**COMMERCIAL FORESTRY** - The commercial plantings are now well advanced and ready in some cases for a second lift pruning. The aim with pruning Radiata Pine is to produce and market a 6.2 metre clear wood log – that is a log with no defects from knots from side branches. This involves a 3 stage prune over several years to 2.4 – 4.6 – 6.2 metres. S.T.F.F.N at present is trying to get some sensible answers regarding O.H & S regulations to cover contractors working on pruning ladders. Xmas trees were again produced on Inverary with reasonable success despite the prolonged dry spell and have now been re-pruned for next year.

**GROUND WATER** - The ground water flow at the monitoring point is at its lowest flow since measurement started when the big chicken debate surfaced. This proves to me we are not tapping an endless resource of old paleo water, but a resource which is limited and relies on yearly rainfall – in which case its usage should be closely controlled. For every property around here, which is reliant on this wonderful resource, lets hope any Ardmore development is dead once and for all. It was great news to hear the go ahead for the huge Ready Mix quarry at Marulan, which makes sense from many angles – no road problems – rail transport and a huge resource to satisfy the Sydney market, as opposed to a small insignificant quarry which appeared unviable and annoyed the local community. Surely from a land use view we are entitled to keep a peaceful and productive farm environment apart from large scale development which puts too much stress on the community.

**RUNNING ON EMPTY** For those who have Fox T.V the series of programmes on the water crisis by Ian Leslie has been excellent. It is very difficult to reconcile the NSW Government position with their supposedly green credentials. They continue to rave on about protection of native species no matter how insignificant, lowering greenhouse emissions, etc but then promote this concept of desalination for Sydney's water problem. Desalination uses huge amounts of energy which will produce huge amounts of carbon dioxide to further the greenhouse effect – on the other hand building more dams such as Welcome Reef, uses no energy and collects and stores huge amounts of water which can be reticulated by gravity alone – solves both Goulburn's problems and Warragamba as well. If the S.C.A goes ahead with this ill conceived concept they then should fund all landholders in the catchment to plant huge areas of commercial trees such as Radiata to soak up this extra carbon dioxide and not oppose commercial forestry, but don't hold your breath.

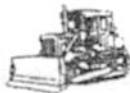

## GARDENING IN FEBRUARY

February can be one of the hottest months in our district, a lot of watering and mulching can be done much the same as January.

With autumn approaching now is the time to start planning your vegetable garden for a continuous supply of vegetable during winter.

**Vegetables:** It is important to start planting cabbage, cauliflower, broccoli and brussel sprouts. This will enable them to get established before the cold weather. They like to grow in well composted and well rotted animal manure, also a light dressing of lime before planting. A side dressing nitrogen fertiliser and liquid fertiliser applied in the cool of the day will assist them to grow quickly.

Other vegetables that can be planted are carrots, parsnips, celery, kohlrabi, lettuce, parsley, radish and turnips.

**Flowers:** If you have a sunny garden facing the north, now is the time to start planting for winter flowers, which is possible in our climate. Plant seedlings of pansies, viola, stocks, poppies and alyssums. Other flowers to plant are calendula, carnations, polyanthus, larkspur, linaria, snapdragons, statice and verbenas.

Also this month spring flowering bulbs start to appear in nurseries and lots of colours are available so your garden can be matched colour wise easily.

**Fruit Trees:** With warm weather still with us, fruit fly starts to appear, so continue spraying apple, pear and quince trees to control these little pests, using Rogog or Lebaycide.

**General:** This month mildew can be a problem as well on some vegetable leaves, this can be controlled by spraying with Zineb or Benlate. It is not a serious problem as the peak of the harvest is nearly over.

Another job is rose pruning. One can reduce the height of the new wood and this will ensure a crop of new well developed roses in the autumn. They will benefit also from a light dressing of complete rose fertiliser.

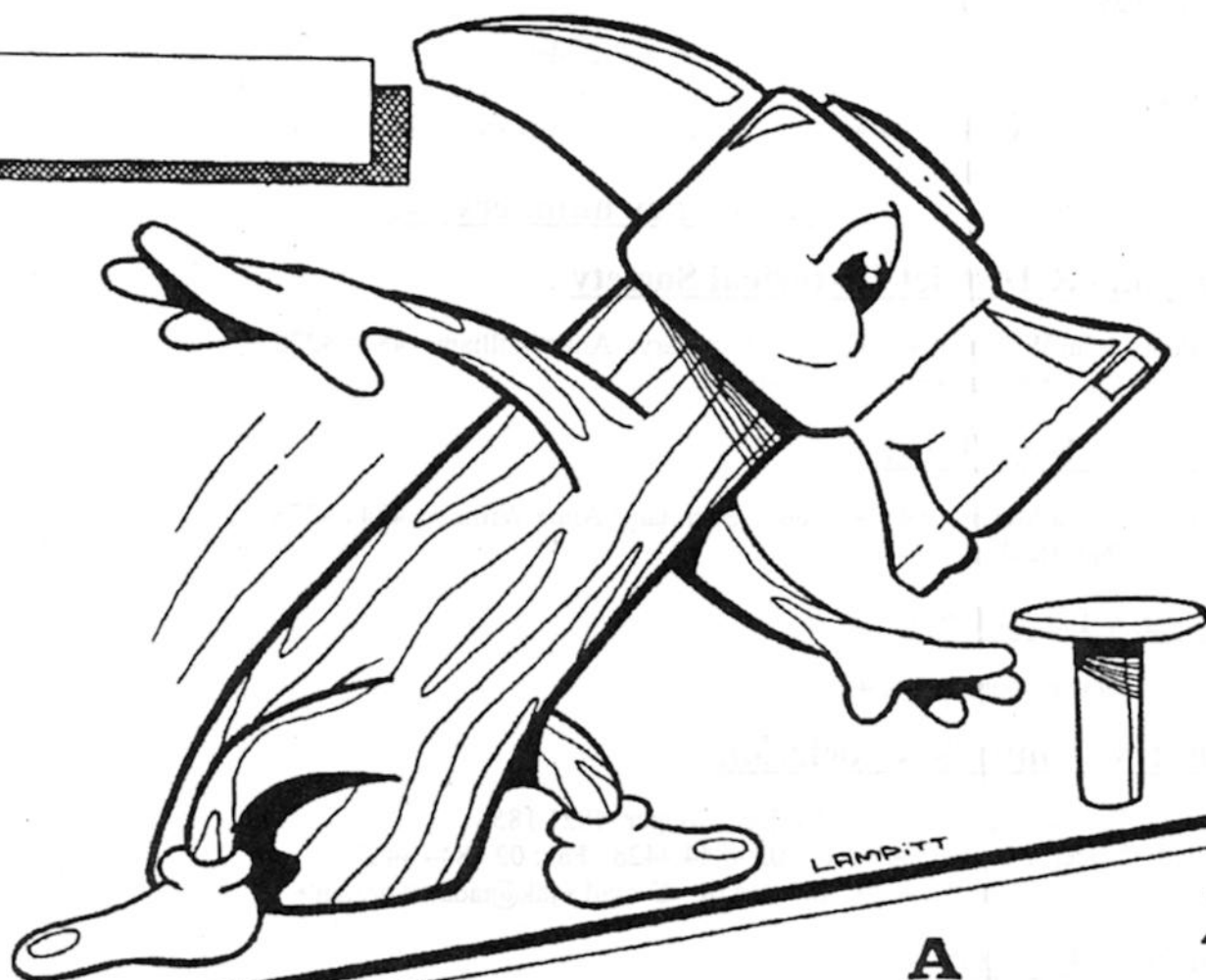
