## GARDENING IN JULY

Well, July is the middle of winter and there is plenty to do in the garden.

Rose and fruit trees can be planted and nurseries stock bare rooted deciduous flowering trees, fruit trees and roses, and this is the best time to plant them.

It is also time to start prune your existing roses and fruit trees too. You will need a good pair of secateurs and the best ones are those with good steel blades as they stay sharp and the blades will not get out of line. Before you prune your roses or trees, have hand a mixture of  $\frac{3}{4}$  bleach and  $\frac{1}{4}$  water to drip your secateurs into. This mixture will sterilize the blades and therefore reduce any disease travelling from plant to plant, doing this is like putting antiseptic on a cut on your own hand.

Remember to cut the middle of the tree out and the branches that are laying across each other or pointing inwards, this way the fruit will be on the outside of the tree and easy to get to.

Vegetables: there are not a lot of vegetables to sow now as the days are short and the nights are cold. You can sow broad beans, peas and all varieties of onions, rhubarb, strawberries and asparagus crowns.

Flowers: seedlings of stock, viola, primula, wallflower, russell lupins, delphiniums, foxglove, poppies, sweet william, calendula, alyssum, snapdragons, verbena, dianthus and sow the seed direct into the soil for Virginian stock which makes a lovely border.

## MULWAREE SHIRE COUNCIL - MEDIA RELEASE 9<sup>th</sup> June

A special meeting of the Mulwaree Shire Councillors on Tuesday evening has returned a unanimous NO VOTE against any amalgamation between the Shire Council and Goulburn City Council.

The meeting was called in anticipation of any formal approach from Goulburn City Council on amalgamation, and to clarify Mulwaree Shire Council's position within the Local Government Act.

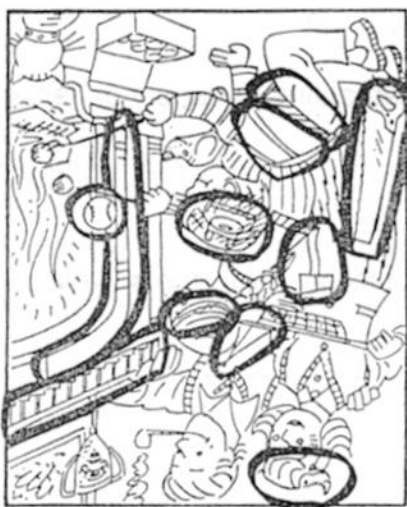
According to the Mayor of Mulwaree Shire Council, Cr Paul Stephenson, 'the subject of an agreed amalgamation is now dead and buried, and council elections will go ahead as normal on September 11<sup>th</sup> this year.

'Mulwaree Shire Council voted unanimously against amalgamation, and even Goulburn City Councillors were split in their decision, which means that out of 15 elected representatives from both areas, only five were in favor'.

'for any amalgamation application to be considered, the application has to be eventually supported by both councils. The Minister for Local Government has also reaffirmed his Governments policy by stipulating there will be no forced amalgamations'.

The meeting also resolved to advise the Minister that there is no further reason to pursue the subject, as there is no possibility of any proposal being acceptable to Mulwaree Shire Council, and that any more resources directed at an amalgamation by either Goulburn Council or the Boundaries Commission would be unjustified.

### JULY 1999 UPDATE.

The Landcare Group has always maintained a high emphasis in revegetation with extensive tree planting to reverse the land degradation of the area. There can be no argument that excessive clearing and land management practices of the past have been very damaging to our fragile environment. A recent publication of the Rural Industries and development looks more closely at the effects of the trees on soils. The main points of this publication are reproduced here:-

\* Extensive clearing of native vegetation in Australia to establish pastures and European based agricultural systems has resulted in a general decline in the condition of our natural resource which include the development of dryland salinity, soil acidification, soil erosion, soil degradation and loss of biodiversity.

\* Under plantation systems, the establishment of monoculture of Eucalypts spp. and Pinus spp. have shown to be able to recycle their own nutrients and maintain a high fertility status on soils that are inherently rich. However, on relatively infertile soils such plantings can have a negative impact on site nutrition and result in a general decline in the fertility. Additions of inorganic and organic fertilisers are required to maintain productivity. Of importance in long-term sustainability of site is the maintenance of soil organic matter through the retention of slash and through limiting site disturbance to a minimum.

\* In low input agricultural systems where inorganic fertilisers are avoided, the introduction of selected species may be the only practical manner in which the nitrogen status of the soil is increased and recycling of nutrients from depth ('biological' pumping) are achieved.

\* Trees are successfully used in the reclamation of saline/sodic soils. There is evidence to show that significant increase in soil pH and electrical conductivity and increase in soil organic matter effected through the establishment of trees.

\* Of concern in the implementation programs to establish trees on farms, and particular the establishment of pure stands, is the lack of information on the best species and provenances for specific sites, market prospects for produce, risk analysis and long-term effects on trees on soil and catchment. Along with economic uncertainty and up-front cost, this results in a lack of confidence by primary producers in the prospects of growing trees on farm.

Soil acidification is caused by nitrate leaching from introduced legumes and use of fertilisers resulting in several nutritional problems, including P and Mo and Al and Mn phyto toxicity.

Trees may play a role in reversing these effects through development of deep root systems that are capable of taking up bases such as calcium and magnesium from deep in the profile and returning them to the soil surface as leaf litter containing organic anions. This would have a similar effect to liming on the surface. However it should be noted that increases in pH on the surface would be at the expense of acidification elsewhere in the soil. With these points in mind the Landcare trials under Acid Soil Action Programme will be carefully monitored.

We have already shown in earlier trials that *P. radiata* will grow quite successfully on our poorer soils. Contrary to the fallacy that pines acidify soils and use all the nutrients, they are in fact beneficial. We can expect even better growth results in a second rotation or if we wish to revert to pasture there would also be beneficial results. One of the best pasture sites I have ever seen is on the site of an old pine forest near Rosewood. The local district has a large area of relatively infertile acid and sodic soils that are every day degradable and erosion prone. these soils cannot be used sustainably for conventional grazing, but can well be utilised for farm forestry. This is a win win situation -- sustainable production over a 30 year rotation with control of land degradation -- this can be then extended with even better results in consequent rotations or return to pasture if required.

## LIBRARY NEWS

This is a particularly exciting time at the Goulburn branch Library. The library will be host for three fascinating exhibitions, as well as a range of activities for children during a very special week for libraries, Childrens' Book Week.

The NAIDOC 99 local exhibition, entitled "Respect", will be launched on Friday 25<sup>th</sup> June, at 5 pm for 5.30 pm at the library. This exhibition has been organised by the Goulburn Regional Art Gallery and has been assisted by Arts Council of NSW and the NSW Government Ministry of the Arts. This exhibition will run until 11<sup>th</sup> July, so please make sure you take the opportunity to view these wonderful works by local artists.

Local Government Week this year will be celebrated with an exhibition from the Australian Bureau of Statistics. This exhibition highlights the role of the ABS in providing information to our local community, particularly through our Library Extension Program collection. The exhibition will be on display in the library from 26-31<sup>st</sup> July.

Goulburn Branch Library will be "Weaving the Book Web" during Childrens' Book Week, which runs from 21-27<sup>th</sup> August. The library will have a display featuring the theme of the week, and various events and activities will be held to involve young readers in this annual event. Forty colourful exhibits from the Embroiderer's Guild NSW Touring Exhibition 1999 will be on display in the library from 30<sup>th</sup> August until 24<sup>th</sup> September. Among the pieces on display will be framed pictures, soft furnishings, garments, mats, bags and sewing chatelaines, all embellished with the exquisite handwork of guild members. This exhibition features both traditional and contemporary pieces and is sure to generate a lot of interest in this region.

# In Council with Inda Evans

## Quarry - Landfill

Last month Council approved the extension of an existing quarry on Oallen Ford Road as a landfill operation to take solid non-putrescible wastes, concrete, bricks, asphalt, tiles etc and paper pulp. Materials such as asbestos are specifically excluded.

A long list of conditions has been imposed, including the installation of a weighbridge and establishment of an environmental monitoring panel.

The decision was a difficult and complex one but, in the long term, I believe the right one.

I would be happy to discuss any issues relating to this development if you would like more detail.

## Locality Review

Naming, identifying boundaries and signposting localities throughout the Shire were the first stages of the rural addressing scheme.

As expected with a new scheme, some anomalies and problems have been found.

If you are aware of a problem, or think that some boundaries or names are wrong, please let me know as soon as possible so that your comments can be incorporated into any adjustments.

## New Environment Legislation

The new Protection of the Environment Operations (POEO) Act comes into force on 1 July.

It replaces the Pollution Control Act, Clean Waters Act, Clean Air Act, Noise Control Act, Environmental Offences and Penalties Act, and the regulatory provisions of the Waste Minimisation and Management Act.

There are now not only different licensing categories (what the EPA is responsible for and what Council controls) but there are also new requirements.

The POEO Act provides stronger enforcement powers where anyone is acting in contravention of the Act.

## Companion Animal Act

This new Act also comes into force from 1 July.

Essentially it requires all dogs and cats to be permanently registered via a micro-chip implant.

Details of how it will be implemented in the Shire have not yet been finalised.

Watch this space for more info as it comes to hand.

In the event that the Woodlawn Mine site near Tarago is approved by the State Government as a landfill and waste management centre, Council will receive considerable "royalties".

## Department of Agriculture Presentation

Mr Dick Jane from the NSW Department of Agriculture's Orange offices addressed Council last month on the outbreak of Newcastle disease at poultry farms on Mangrove Mountain.

It was reassuring to learn that the mistakes made there, such as wall-to-wall poultry farms, are not being repeated in Mulwaree and that our guidelines are considered better than the Department's minimum standards.

Newcastle disease is a relatively common virus in all bird species and becomes a problem if it strikes where there is a large population of birds, such as the poultry farm.

Council's guidelines are designed to contain any such outbreak as much as possible on the affected farm so minimising its spread. The recent epidemic at Mangrove Mountain is therefore not expected here.

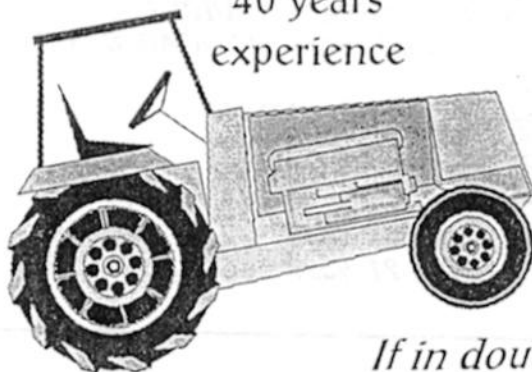

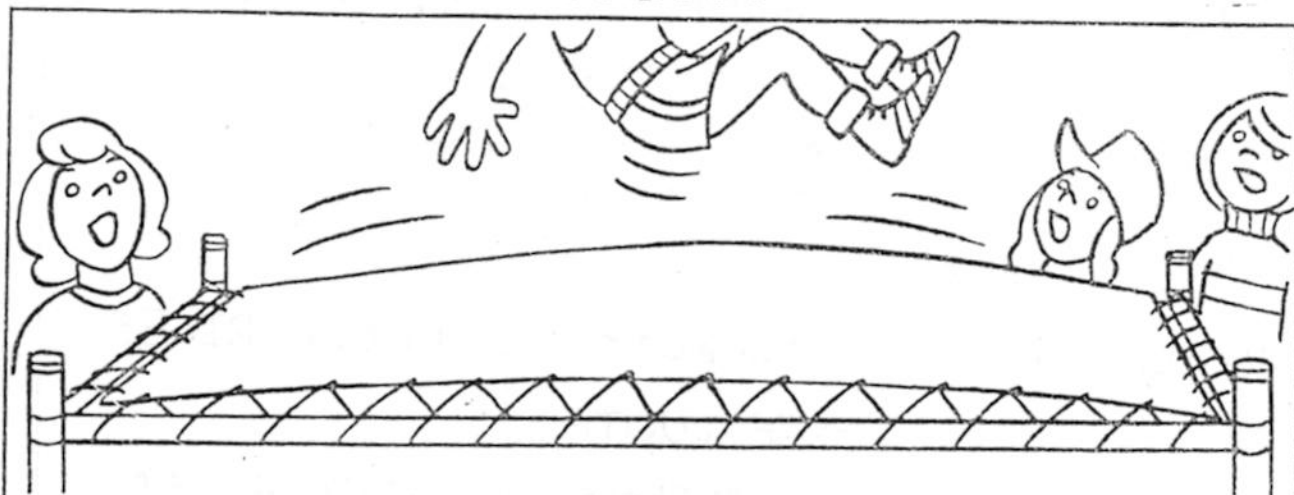
