JULY REPORT
FARM FORESTRY TRAINING

I am delighted to announce that Nationally Accredited Farm forestry training has commenced at Inverary. The training will be conducted by New South Wales Timber Industries Training Company (TEMS) in conjunction with Inverary Creek Landcare Group and S.T.F.F.N. and funded through the NSW Department of Education and Training.

Training will be provided in the following competency areas:

- Trim and Cross Cut felled Trees
- Fall Trees Manually
- Prune Trees
- Plant Trees by Hand
- Plant trees Mechanically
- Fertilise Plantation Trees
- Release Trees/Control Weeds
- Prepare and Implement a Plantation Establishment plan
- Undertake Brushcutting operations
- Manage Stand Health

Plans are underway to organise the training in one to two day blocks, probably on weekends. The first training commenced in mid June with various competencies offered through the second half of 2000. It is anticipated that much of the training will be conducted by 'experts' from the district. Wayne Lunke of A.C.T. Forests has already completed the first 2 days course with 8 participants on Chain Saw competency.

The training will be based on the recently released Forest & Forest Products (Forest Growing Management) training package and designed to meet needs of:

- Farmers wanting to move into farm forestry
- People looking to work in the forest growing area
- People using chainsaws for farm forestry or other farm use
- Experienced farm forestry workers and farmers wanting to gain competency accreditation for employment or quality accreditation purposes

The commencement of this training is a further indication of the development of farm forestry as a serious enterprise in our district.

This I believe is a first for Landcare showing the Inverary group continues to keep abreast with landcare needs.

I believe this will be of great benefit and as the numbers of places in each course will be limited I encourage you not to miss out.

The HSC is Coming

With HSC final exams only a couple of months away now is the time for all students to keep themselves informed with the school syllabus and other study support material held by the Goulburn Branch Library.

The library has Board of Studies materials covering all HSC subjects including English, Ancient History, and Food Technology. These documents are great for students and parents, as facilitate a better understanding of the learning outcomes and assessments for each subject. Board of Studies materials are available for loan and can be borrowed for seven days.

Also check our range of Excel Study Guides that are available for loan. They cover all the major subjects including English, Drama, Modern History, Society and Culture, Chemistry, 2 Unit Maths, Economics, Biology, Physics, Maths in Society. The guides offer practical help by providing topic summaries, sample questions and answers.

GARDENING IN JULY

Well, July is the middle of winter and there is plenty to do in the garden.

Rose and fruit trees can be planted and nurseries stock bare rooted deciduous flowering trees, fruit trees and roses, and this is the best time to plant them.

It is also time to start prune your existing roses and fruit trees too. You will need a good pair of secateurs and the best ones are those with good steel blades as they stay sharp and the blades will not get out of line. Before you prune your roses or trees, have hand a mixture of $\frac{3}{4}$ bleach and $\frac{1}{4}$ water to drip your secateurs into. This mixture will sterilize the blades and therefore reduce any disease travelling from plant to plant, doing this is like putting antiseptic on a cut on your own hand.

Remember to cut the middle of the tree out and the branches that are laying across each other or pointing inwards, this way the fruit will be on the outside of the tree and easy to get to.

Vegetables: there are not a lot of vegetables to sow now as the days are short and the nights are cold. You can sow broad beans, peas and all varieties of onions, rhubarb, strawberries and asparagus crowns.

Flowers: seedlings of stock, viola, primula, wallflower, russell lupins, delphiniums, foxglove, poppies, sweet william, calendula, alyssum, snapdragons, verbena, dianthus and sow the seed direct into the soil for Virginian stock which makes a lovely border.






