GARDENING IN JULY

Well, July is the middle of winter and there is plenty to do in the garden.

Rose and fruit trees can be planted and nurseries stock bare rooted deciduous flowering trees, fruit trees and roses, and this is the best time to plant them.

It is also time to start prune your existing roses and fruit trees too. You will need a good pair of secateurs and the best ones are those with good steel blades as they stay sharp and the blades will not get out of line. Before you prune your roses or trees, have hand a mixture of $\frac{3}{4}$ bleach and $\frac{1}{4}$ water to drip your secateurs into. This mixture will sterilize the blades and therefore reduce any disease travelling from plant to plant, doing this is like putting antiseptic on a cut on your own hand.

Remember to cut the middle of the tree out and the branches that are laying across each other or pointing inwards, this way the fruit will be on the outside of the tree and easy to get to.

Vegetables: there are not a lot of vegetables to sow now as the days are short and the nights are cold. You can sow broad beans, peas and all varieties of onions, rhubarb, strawberries and asparagus crowns.

Flowers: seedlings of stock, viola, primula, wallflower, russell lupins, delphiniums, foxglove, poppies, sweet william, calendula, alyssum, snapdragons, verbena, dianthus and sow the seed direct into the soil for Virginian stock which makes a lovely border.

LOCAL HISTORY

(Extract from "The Southern Observer", Goulburn, dated 19th March, 1863)

Original Correspondence:

To the editor of the Southern Observer

"Sir,

Being a subscriber to your valuable paper, will you insert the enclosed, showing the loyalty of the inhabitants of Bungonia for their country and their Queen.

One of the "loyal and true-hearted Englishmen".

LOCAL HISTORY CONTINUED

I had to go to Bungonia yesterday on business, and arrived there pretty early. A number of large placards were posted about the town, which at once rivetted my attention from the heading; it ran thus:—"GOD SAVE THE QUEEN"

'To all loyal and true-hearted Englishmen and other subjects of our most gracious Queen —'

'Parishioners of Bungonia—

by your loyalty and love for your Queen, by your deep sorrow for her injured son, your Prince, by your gratitude to his merciful Preserver who withheld the injury from being dangerous, you are affectionately and earnestly called, on Wednesday next, at 11 o'clock in the morning, to the Parish Church in Bungonia, to offer your combined prayers and thanksgiving to the King of Kings and Lord of Lords, the only ruler of Princes.'

Edmund B Procter 1 Timothy 2.1.4

"Well, I thought, I have come to the right place at the right time. I am not a parishioner of Bungonia, but I am a loyal subject and a true-hearted Englishman and a member of the Church of England. So I breakfast and go to Church and join my prayers for the Royal Prince's recovery and thanksgiving for his preservation from assassination, with the true-hearted Bungonians.

I hope they will muster a good attendance, but where are they all coming from? I entered the Church, and to my great surprise and joy, there were some 90 persons besides children. I managed, after a little time, to get to the end of a hard wood four legged stool — and it was hard, too, I can assure you — but still I am loyal and I will be as long as I remain an Englishman.

The vestry door opened, the clergyman came in: and then, what I had never heard before in a Church, issued forth the strains of the National Anthem beautifully played on an excellent instrument, which did credit to the people of Bungonia. The clergyman then proceeded very solemnly to the beautiful Church service suitable to the occasion.

I believe that everyone there, with bended knee, did offer up a prayer for the Prince's recovery. Before the clergyman entered the pulpit, he gave out the National Anthem, "God Save the Queen", and that I believe, with all his heart, for I never heard it given out in such a manner before. Well, the Anthem was sung, and that right heartily, by all in the Church. The clergyman entered the pulpit —he gave out no text from the Scripture — he preached on loyalty. I shall never forget it, and I think many others went home that day rejoicing. May God prosper all his works the same. On making some enquiries, a person stated to me that some of the people had come 25 miles to show their loyalty. There was a collection after the Service for the Church Society. I hope next time I go to Bungonia I shall hear of steps being taken for the building of a neat little Church, for that one was really dangerous. I think the pastor is worthy of a good one; and if the Bungonia people put their shoulders to the wheel, with a little help from the Society, they may soon get one built"

Note: the Revd. Edmund Bowker Procter (Pastor mentioned herein) as afterwards instrumental in having a beautiful little stone Church erected in the village of Bungonia.

PRELIMINARY RESULTS OF ACACIA TRIALS

Even though the trials have only been planted 9 months a preliminary form prune has shown some interesting results. All of the 10 species, dealbata, decurrens, mearnsii, falciformis, filicifolia, parramatensis, melonoryton, glaucocarpa, leucolada, silvestris seem to be growing well. Ac.melonoryton shows some tip damage from frost, virtually ruling it out in a severe winter, while no species seems to tolerate the dry silica sands which cross one corner of the trial. Best growth rate and form so far are falciformis and mearnsii.

Euc. Argophloeae (western white gum) are showing early promise both on better and very exposed sites. This species will be closely monitored for farm forestry potential.

Pinus pinaster planted on drier sites with P. radiata are also showing good growth and will be closely watched for farm forestry potential.

REPORT ON P.RADIATA PLANTINGS FOR EROSION CONTROL AROUND THE "GULLY FROM HELL"

First lift pruning of the P.radiata is now in progress. Eight members completed a silvicultural pruning course through A.C.T. Forest Trainers and are now certificated to prune on any plantation. The interesting feature is how the tree plantings have stabilised the gully erosion in just six years. The gully floor has built up considerably and bare areas are completely re-grassed with mainly microleana while individual serrated tussocks are dead. If anyone is still unconvinced on the possibilities of P. radiata commercial plantings for gully control come and have a look for yourself -- results have shown P. radiata will work while natives will not.

EUC. ARGOPHLOIAE

These trials are looking promising on better soil areas. The western white gum is native to Southern Queensland around Chinchella and may well be a very useful species, but only time will confirm this.

Funding for future projects in 2001-2 has been applied for from NHT and Sydney Catchment Authority. Unfortunately funds have been very restrictive this year and do not look like improving. NHT has not delivered what it promised with most funds going to government departments -- this will be even more obvious in the new budget with most funds going to the Murray Darling. Unfortunately this lack of suitable funding will greatly inhibit the Landcare activities at Inverary and similar smaller Landcare Groups.
