Fire Fighters ask for more Equipment

Bungonia firefighting Captain John Edwards is working with East Group Deputy Group Captain Ian Mills to implement an improved method of allocating Bushfire funds and equipment to the firefighters in rural New South Wales.

They will coordinate a list of the many property assets in the district which are thought to be in need of protection from bushfires. The information collected will form a data base in Sydney, with each Brigade given an equipment score, indicating how much equipment it should have to protect the assets in its area. Assets would include houses, sheds, petrol stations, crops, livestock, machinery and vehicles.

John and the Brigade Captains will then put together a list of the bushfire equipment they think should be included in next year's State government budget. John has said that he would welcome ideas from local residents about the level of fire protection in the local area, as well as suggestions for equipment to provide this protection.

The church has applied for a grant from the Heritage Committee to renew our floor as it is in bad need of serious repairs. We hope to hear by the end of June.

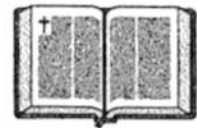
If we are lucky enough to receive it, it will be all hands on deck (or floor) to replace the old flooring with new flooring plus a few other minor jobs to be done along the way.

Gardening in July

Well, July is the middle of winter and there is plenty to do in the garden.

Rose and fruit trees can be planted and nurseries stock bare rooted deciduous flowering trees, fruit trees and roses, and this is the best time to plant them.

It is also time to start prune your existing roses and fruit trees too. You will need a good pair of secateurs and the best ones are those with good steel blades as they stay sharp and the blades will not get out of line. Before you prune your roses or trees, have hand a mixture of $\frac{3}{4}$ bleach and $\frac{1}{4}$ water to drip your secateurs into. This mixture will sterilize the blades and therefore reduce any disease travelling from plant to plant, doing this is like putting antiseptic on a cut on your own hand.

Remember to cut the middle of the tree out and the branches that are laying across each other or pointing inwards, this way the fruit will be on the outside of the tree and easy to get to.

Vegetables: there are not a lot of vegetables to sow now as the days are short and the nights are cold. You can sow broad beans, peas and all varieties of onions, rhubarb, strawberries and asparagus crowns.

Flowers: seedlings of stock, viola, primula, wallflower, russell lupins, delphiniums, foxglove, poppies, sweet william, calendula, alyssum, snapdragons, verbena, dianthus and sow the seed direct into the soil for Virginian stock which makes a lovely border.

Statistics Again

The Australian Bureau of Statistics has released figures from the 2001 Census.

The number of persons counted in the Shire on Census night was 6,834 which included 23 overseas visitors. Males numbered 2,724 and there were 2,572 females. 57 people identified as Aboriginal.

The age break up indicates 5,296 of us were aged 15 years and over while 815 were aged 65 years and over. Presumably this means that 1,538 people were under the age of 15 years.

The ABS population growth figures for 2000/2001 I quoted in the May edition of the *Bungonia Times*, projected a population for 2001 of 6,438. Looks like the Shire grew a little more quickly than the ABS thought we would.

No doubt, there will be plenty of number crunching going on over the next few months to analyse all possible combinations of the figures, compare with other regions, plan for the future, etc.

Internet Courses

According to the ABS, only 1,893 people in the Shire use the Internet at home or at work. So now might be the time for you to have a dabble for free.

A mobile van fitted with lots of computers will be in Marulan Monday to Wednesday, July 1 – 3 and sessions are available for mornings, afternoons and evenings.

Courses range from Internet basics for beginners to building Web pages for community organisations. A great way to give Bungonia a presence in cyber space!

Medical Services

A couple of years ago, through a community survey, Bungonia residents expressed interest in medical services being available in Marulan.

You may therefore be interested to know that Dr Kellett now operates the Marulan Medical Centre which is open Mondays and Wednesdays, including Public Holidays. Dr Kellett bulk bills and has both Pharmaceutical and Pathology services available for his patients.

Further services are expected to operate for the district from Marulan shortly. These include outreach services from Goulburn Community Health Centre, such as a women's health nurse, visiting on a regular basis.

Funding has also been granted for a youth program to be established through Southern Area Health but this may be some time away yet while details are worked out.

Playful Colts



Colts are not unlike teenage boys, there comes a time in their lives when they want to show the world how big strong and independent they have become. Authority is something to be questioned, rules will be tested and life becomes a mixture of fun and fight.

Colts need to be handled with an attitude of strict rules and heaps of affection, colts tend to be very affectionate and respond well to tender loving care. Always be consistent, if you give in and let your rules be broken without reprimand; your colt will believe that he can do what he wants. Which is often dangerous to you the handler, just for point of argument lets say that the young fellow has decided to rear up and strike above your head. Needless to say this situation has to stop, and just to make the situation harder to deal with he does this when loose in his paddock at feed time.

This colt is in fact treating you as he would another colt of his own age. His nature is telling him that he has to be the 'top colt', after all the strongest colt will be able to successfully fight and win his own mares. This doesn't mean he imagines you as competition, but he is going to try and prove his independence.

What to do about the situation, chances are that this colt is still growing up and is basically in his paddock and not doing any work. You may now be thinking that this horse is too young to work and is not broken in, which of course is the case.

Now is the time that you have to show your authority, and to do this time must be spent with the said colt. This colt has been weaned and taught to lead. This is the place to start, make a regular time to spend working with him. He can be made to lead around properly, seeing new places whilst behaving in a calm and acceptable manner. He can be taught to lunge, introduce him to as many new activities and places as possible. While you are working him he is getting both the authority and attention he needs and his behavior will improve.

It's around to tree planting time again, in a very dry season. Experience from previous years has shown the importance of good preparation to in part compensate for the lack of rainfall. As well as the conventional ripping and mounding we now recommend that the rip lines which often are quite rough and cloddy are disced and then remounded. This will make planting easier and conserve what little moisture there is available. For those who still have not ordered trees radiate pines are available from STFFN at very reasonable prices. (Phone 62072494)

PRUNING COURSES.

A successful tree pruning and thinning course was held at Inverary, under the guidance of Wayne Lemke, A.C.T., Trainer and FAFPESC Accreditor. I would again emphasise the need for pruning to ensure a good return from farm forestry. Anyone can have a look at a recently pruned forest along Bungonia Road 5 kms from Bungonia. Private pruning courses can be arranged with the Landcare President.

Radiate pines should be thinned to 5-600 per hectare and pruned to 2.3 metres at aged 5-6. Delay in pruning is more costly, while an unpruned stand is virtually worthless. Contract costs will vary depending on the age and site, but a rough cost could be \$500-\$700 a hectare --not expensive compared to an estimated final value of \$15-20000 per hectare.

STFFN FIELD DAY.

This was held at Inverary for over 30 participants who were shown the Nelder Wheel Trial, now being pruned and measured, Xmas Tree pruning and maintenance, P.pimaster Trials, established forestry and young pines around the Winston Gully (Gully from Hell). All were very impressed with the extent of farm forestry in this area and it's rapid growth rate.

NHT ENVIRO GRANT.

These have been called for under the revamped Mark 11 version of the National Heritage Trust. Inverary has applied for extensive planting of P.radiata along the Northern and Western Boundaries of the Winston to stop the spread of Serrated Tussock to remnant vegetation areas and to increase biodiversity with mixed plantings. Even though some of the guidelines have been changed there is still a bias against anything not native and reluctance to fund any work on private land. The latter is very worrying for rural Landcare Groups whose main focus are problems on private land, after all the public lands are the responsibility of organizations such as NPWS, who have other funding sources. The application has the backing of DLWC, Dept Agr, ACT Forests and STFFN, but in my opinion very little has changed in NHT who will continue to cost shift to various Government Departments at the expense of individual Landcare Groups.

Future funding.

This may be available through Catchment Management Boards, who once the Catchment Blue prints are signed by the Minister, will have to compile a budget to hopefully target the Catchment problems. The main problem facing the local CMB and any area s in the East is that most of the funding will be directed to the Murray Darling to combat salinity. Another problem locally is that the majority of the population and Landcare Groups are Coastal our CMB extends from Cronulla and Port Hacking to Burrell Lakes and inland to include the Shoalhaven, so basically the population of 380,000 is Urban concentrated in Southern Sydney and Illawarra. Hopefully the Sydney Catchment Authority will continue to be generous and support Catchment Enhancement projects, such as the two we have completed on Spring Creek.

FUTURE OF LANDCARE.

Inverary is very much hinging on future fundings. We have successfully held over 40 field days and have more than adequately catered for the locals in knowledge and experience. I feel as a Landcare Group we have done more on the education side with field days and the Resource Centre than any other group, yet we were denied funding on the last educational grants -- maybe it is high time the funding bodies of Government and NHT put their money where their mouth is and get serious

Police Report by Senior Constable Mark Wall

This is the first time that I have prepared a report for the Bungonia Times. For your general information I have been stationed at Marulan since March this year after spending six years at Fairfield in Sydney's west. It's quite a change, however I would not go back for a million dollars.

Recently in the Bungonia area there was a number of break, enter and stealing offences reported. These incidents all occurred over a couple of days and appear to have been committed by the same people. Myself, Senior Constable KEMP at Tarago Police Station and Police from Goulburn are currently working on identifying those responsible. As you could imagine it is a large area that I have to cover and I can't be in all places at all times. Therefore, I rely on the community to assist me in reducing crime mainly by reporting anything that appears suspicious. It doesn't matter how trivial something appears it could be the vital piece of information Police are looking for. By looking out for each other, keeping an eye on your neighbour's properties and reporting any suspicious people, vehicles or events, crime can be reduced and it may be your property that is saved from being robbed.

I hope that it doesn't sound like Bungonia is the break and enter capital of New South Wales as it is far from that, but by working together hopefully there won't be any break and enters in the area at all.

On a lighter note, School Holidays are around the corner again and hopefully everyone will remain safe throughout. Remember when driving around the area that there may be a few more kids walking around and playing throughout the day so driving a little slower and more cautiously could prevent an accident. If anyone is going on a driving trip remember to stop, revive and survive every two hours and prevent driver fatigue.

I have had a few reports of people driving recklessly on their way into and out of Bungonia on Friday and Sunday evenings. The Highway Patrol at Goulburn have been notified of this and will increase patrols especially around the village area and Jerrara Road. If you witness anyone driving erratically, attempt to gain a registration number and description of the vehicle and pass it on to me. I'll follow it up and take the appropriate action.

Apart from a young boy injuring himself in the national park whilst on a school camp there have been no other incidents reported in the Bungonia area over the last month or so. I look forward to writing a monthly report for the Times and advising of any Police matters. I also look forward to meeting some of you whilst in my travels.
