On Friday, 11th. May 28 pupils from **Windellama School** planted 260 native trees along the banks of the Bungonia and Woodwards Creeks. They were supported by their teachers and parents, Greening Australia and the Park Trustees. We all finished the day with a sausage sizzle at the old school.

Rivercare Plan.

The Bungonia Creek is one of the most degraded streams in the Mulwaree Shire. The Park Trust with guidance from the Dept. of Land & Water Conservation is developing a Rivercare plan for the section of the Bungonia & Woodwards Creek that flows through the Park. The long term aim is to remove noxious weeds and exotics from the bed and the banks and hopefully to improve the water flow and quality.

On Friday, 1st June , 7.30 pm at the Village Hall Brad Davies from the Dept. of Land & Water Conservation will give a presentation outlining the causes of the state of the Creeks, some of the effects on the environment and what we should be doing to improve water quality.

All residents are invited to come especially anyone with a frontage onto either creeks or with knowledge or an interest in these problems. There will be time for questions and suggestions and also a cup of tea or coffee.
