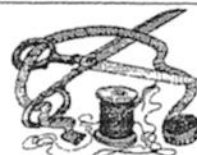

## **GREATER ARGYLE COUNCIL** **2004/2005 DRAFT** **MANAGEMENT PLAN**

In accordance with the provisions of S402 of the Local Government Act 1993, the Council has prepared a Draft Management Plan for 2004/2005 covering the Council's activities for the next 3 years and the Council's revenue policy for 2004/2005.

The Draft Plan includes details of principal services that the Council proposes to conduct, together with the objectives, strategies, projects and initiatives for each service, Council's pricing policy including a listing of all fees and charges to be charged by Council for the 2004/2005 year, the proposed rating structure for the year 2004/2005 and a statement containing a detailed estimate of the Council's income and expenditure for the 2004/2005 year. A map showing the part of the Council's area subject to the Business Town Centre subcategory of the ordinary rate will be displayed at the civic centre over the period of public exhibition.

The Draft Management Plan is on public exhibition for a period of 28 days commencing on Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> May, 2004 until Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> June, 2004 and will be available for inspection at the Civic Centre, Library, Clinton Street office, Marulan Post Office, Tallong General Store and Tarago General Store during normal opening hours.

Submissions in relation to any or all aspects of the Draft Management Plan may be made to the Council at any time during the period of public exhibition and will be considered by Council at its meeting to be held on Tuesday 15 June, 2004.

There will be Public Information Nights on Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> June 2004 and Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> June 2004 commencing at 7.00 pm at the Council Chambers, Civic Centre, Bourke Street, Goulburn.

**JUNE 2004 UPDATE**

**EUCALYPT TRIALS.**

Countless trials of Eucalypt species during 1993-5 are now showing some interesting results which can be used by local landholders thinking of establishing native species for shelter or commercial purposes. These are some of the more promising species which can be seen on Inverary. Euc. benthamii (Camden White Gum). Small pockets of this endangered species, once common along the Nepean River remain around Warragamba Dam. The only other significant stand in the Kedumba Valley was in danger of inundation if Warragamba wall was ever raised as proposed. C.S.I.R.O. seed department collected seed in 1994 for planting trials around the A.C.T. Inverary has 3 hectares of benthamii now producing seed. This species shows a lot of potential overseas as a rapid growing pulp species.

Eucalypt Nitens (Errinundra provinana). (shining gum) A trial of 5 separate provenances showed only one suitable for this area. Growth rate and form are excellent. The interesting point is this provenance is that it loses its blue juvenile leaves very early so is not as prone to Xmas Beetles as other provenances. Nitens is a species which will suffer from dry conditions, so should only be planted on wetter creek flats. However it is worth a trial if anyone is considering a commercial planting.

Eucalypt Kartzoffiana (Araluen Gum) This is another commercial species showing promise. It is quite similar to E. nitens with a slightly better growth rate, but poorer form. A 2 hectare plantation of nitens and kartzoffiana planted in 1995 shows a good comparison.

Eucalypt Aggregata. (Black Gum) ( insect resistance selected). One of the big problems in eucalypt plantations is the devastation by Xmas beetles so it is good to see there are species which will grow well and resist insect attack as well. A small plantation of aggregata can be seen at Wilduk gate. As well as showing insect resistance it grows well, is very frost resistance and has shown no drought effects.

Eucalypt Acaciaformis (New England Peppermint). For non-commercial windbreaks of shelter trees, this species similar to E. nicholii is my selection for this area. It has a dense crown growth right to ground level and is both drought and frost resistance, as well as showing good form and growth rate.

Other species not suggested as worth planting commercially, but excellent in mixed wood lot plots for shelter are E. macarthurii, E. mannifera, E. rubida, E. bosistoana, E. ovata and E. nicholii.

**Australian Forest Growers Conference**

This was held at Ballarat on 3<sup>rd</sup> -5<sup>th</sup> I was fortunate in being able to attend as a delegate from STFFN and will give a report next month. No doubt the whole timber industry is going through bad times, but there is some confidence in the future. Victoria and West Australia seem to have much better promotion and Government assistance, while NSW and S.A. linger a long way behind. Landcare policies and the green agenda in NSW are working against the acceptance of farm forestry as a viable form of agriculture and from what I saw in Victoria since privatisation of State forests the sooner NSW forests are sold off to private companies the better.

Many thanks to my neighbors who kept an eye on Beryl the 5 days I was in Ballarat --their help made my attendance possible

## Forensic Science is Coming to Town

**Southern Tablelands Regional Library** aims to  
be innovative in our approach to science and is  
always looking for new and exciting way to  
introduce scientific concepts to our students.

During the July school holidays the Goulburn  
Library will be hosting the CSIRO's Green  
Machine Science Education Centre's "Lab on  
Legs". While here, they will be presenting the  
interactive science program: **Forensic Frenzy**  
(Art).

In this fascinating introduction to the world  
of forensic science, students will take on  
the role of forensic police as they collect  
and analyse physical evidence to enable  
them to solve a crime. This will be done in  
a series of hands-on activities in the Green  
Machine laboratory. This workshop is a

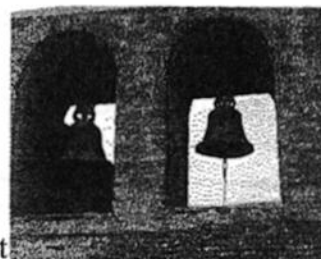

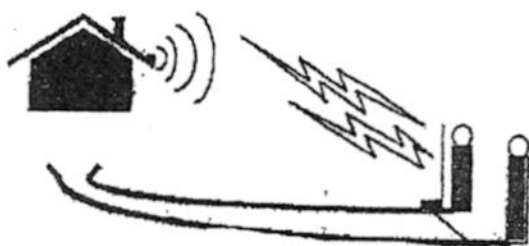

## BUSH FIRE DANGER SEASON

MEASURE

The Bush Fire Danger Season is from October 1 to March 31. This is the time when there are most likely to be bush fires, particularly bush fires that firefighters can not control. During this period there are rules about where and when you can light fires.

Barbecues and camp fires should be lit in a properly constructed fireplace at least 4.5 metres from any log or stump. The ground needs to be cleared around the fireplace of anything that could burn for 1.5 metres. Make sure the fire is completely out before leaving the area.

Anyone wishing to burn off for farming or other reasons needs a permit from their local council. They must let their neighbours know 12 hours before they intend to start the fire and someone needs to be with the fire until it is put out.

Your parents may wish to burn garden or household rubbish. First they must check that the local council allows back yard burning. Use a properly constructed incinerator or burn on the ground with the area cleared for 4.5 metres around the fire. You must light the fire after 7.00 at night and it must be out before 7.00 in the morning.
