GARDENING IN MARCH

In March, plant alyssum, violas, stocks, poppies, calendulas, carnations, polyanthus, dianthus, larkspurs, pansies, snapdragons, statice and verbenas seedlings. This is the month for aphids and other bugs, to appear on roses so spray with Malathion or Rogor 40 and Lebaycid. One teaspoon of Vegemite in one litre of water is often effective. Plant lettuce, parsnips, white onions, cauliflowers, cabbages, brussel sprouts, and broccoli. Use a liquid fertiliser on the seedlings. Fertilise your lawns ready for winter.

MARCH 1 - ST.DAVID'S DAY

St.David spent most of his life preaching in Wales during the 6th Century and there are a lot of legends associated with him. He is remembered by the wearing of a leek or a daffodil (the words for both are very similar in the language of Wales). The daffodil is also known as the Lent lily and might have been brought back from Henry V's battles in France. St.David is mentioned as a battle leader as well as a preacher. After having been made a bishop he is supposed to have built the cathedral city of St.David on a remote headland. His tomb and shrine here were important places of pilgrimage.

MARCH 17 - ST.PATRICK'S DAY

St. Patrick was supposed to have used the shamrock to explain the concept of the Holy Trinity, because it was one leaf in three parts. There are many legends about Patrick. He may have been sold in Ireland as a slave, when a youth, and after six years as a shepherd he is said to have escaped to France and entered a monastery. He then dreamed that he was being called back to Ireland to convert the people, amongst whom he died on March 17, AD 461.

LANDCARE

MARCH LANDCARE REPORT FOR 1998.



The visit by a Coach Tour including the Commissioner of Healthy Rivers Commission again raised several questions regarding landcare and ecological sustainable farming. The question of exotics was again raised at the "Gully from Hell" site where both Willows and Cottonwoods have been successfully used surrounded by 50 hectares of *P. radiata* for revegetation.

The very mention of Willows will now raise more than the eyebrows of the dedicated "Greenies". Willows are out -- they apparently after 150 years have become very sexy and now spread by seed. This is the case in some rivers of the State, but surely, Mr. Commissioner, not a care for banning all willows in all situations. How about we consider some of the pluses for the humble Willow. After all it has been growing on Inverary for well over 100 years and never spread to cause any concern. Willows are excellent fodder trees providing drought reserve, they protect and bind creek banks, keep the water cooler and provide habitat for wildlife in shady pools. The two species local Willows have never cross pollinated and never produces viable seeds. Even if they did, a few old wethers would soon solve the problem.

One group member said Willows should be declared a noxious weed and eradicated. I have checked with L.A.W.C. on the removal method recommended. This is by stem injection of Glycophosphate. Can you imagine pushing through Black Snake Cumbungi and 5 metre high blackberries to inoculate every Willow. Maybe the efforts would be better aimed at a real weed problem, such as serrated tussock.

The question of farm forestry and revegetation for erosion control also caused some comments. Why use the nasty "green weed *P. radiata*?" In our situation on eroded sodic and acid soils, we have shown *radiata* to be the only real option. All Native species trialled are either dead or show very poor growth rates. Once the acid soils on old metasediments are cleared and laid bare to erosion, the process soon becomes irreversible. The Winston Paddock is an excellent example. The area has not been grazed since 1980, yet no Eucalypt regeneration is very evident, however the *P. radiata* is thriving. We must use every opportunity to expose the myth of revegetation with natives only is way to go.

Sustainable vegetation management strives to improve the well being of the community now and in the future. To do this we must use both natives and exotics across a broad range of environments to produce a balanced landscape, with both a mix of species and land uses. Farm Forestry can achieve this balance, but to get there, we need the commitment of both the private and public sector. In our situation the pines will improve run off quality, address the acid soil problem, stop the erosion and still produce a very valuable crop. -- a resource we need more of the achieve economic sustainability. Most importantly, we must get through to the Bureaucrats, the need to actively promote this balanced landscape ethos.

The other point is to dispel the concept of lack of biodiversity in *P. radiata*. Recent studies conducted by Charles Sturt University has shown an increase in biodiversity in pine plantings in the Albury area.

If the trip which later included Windellama, Oallen and Bombay did nothing else it may have broadened the minds of a few participants.

N.H.T. funding are now being prepared for 1998 closing in early March. We will be putting up submissions of Acid soils (planting with *P. radiata*), remnant vegetation and restoration of the Washedaway Creek. With the decade of Landcare coming to a close in 2 years, we feel that at Inverary, we have completed most of the restoration needed. We are also applying for funds to complete 2 walking tracks from our Landcare picnic area and for the material to construct a shelter area.

BUNGONIA BUSHFIRE BRIGADE

CAPTAIN'S REPORT

Bungonia Brigade has attended 3 incidents since the last report.

26/1/98 Bungonia 4-2 and Bungonia 8 fire truck and 5 crew members attended a motor vehicle accident approx. 1 km. South of Jacqua Creek on the Windellama Road. 4 people were injured, 1 being trapped until released by Police Rescue. There was no fire so the crew were on standby and assisted where necessary. (10 man hours)

30/1/98 Bungonia 4-2, Bungonia 35, Support 3, and Support 4 and 18 crew members attended a Bushfire at Lot 5 Goulburn Road, Bungonia - Peter Shinfield's place. The fire was caused by a pelican shorting out powerlines, and 2 houses were in direct danger from this fire in rough timbered country. Approximately 3 acres were burnt out before the fire was brought under control. (a total of 54 man hours were put in by all personnel.)

1/2/98 Bungonia 3, with 3 crew members attended a fire at Lot 3 Windellama Road, Bungonia, John Wilkinson's. A campfire that had been lit by some visitors to cook breakfast, and was thought to have been extinguished, re-ignited, burning out 1/2 acre of grass, scrub and timber along a gully. A severe warning was issued to the people responsible via the landowner, who said that it wouldn't happen again, - no further action recommended. (Owner assisted). (6 man hours).

I would like to thank all of the members who have assisted with call-outs and maintenance during this period.

COOKERY CORNER

CHOCOLATE HEDGEHOG (good for microwave)

1 pkt crumbled Arrowroot biscuits
4oz butter
3/4 cup walnut pieces (or crushed) or sultanas
4oz sugar
2 tblspns cocoa
vanilla
1 or 2 eggs (beaten)
375g pkt Nestle's Melts

Heat butter and sugar gently, then add cocoa, beaten egg, and melted chocolate.

Cook one minute more.

Remove from stove, add nuts/sultanas, biscuits, and a few drops of vanilla.

Press into a greased 8" square tin and refrigerate.

Cut into pieces when cold and set. Keep in refrigerator.

This tastes lovely with a mild peppermint icing, or with chocolate icing sprinkled with coconut.

Gravel Roads

Noise Offences

There is new legislation called the Environmental Offences and Penalties Amendment (Noise Offences) Regulation 1997 which provides for some hefty penalties.

Council officers are authorised under the regulations to issue the fines which can be on-the-spot fines of \$200.

Some examples of situations where fines can be issued are:
where vehicles on private land

emit offensive noise

where refrigerated vans left on overnight cause offensive noise and where a vehicle's sound system affects nearby pedestrians
