## GARDENING IN MARCH

This is most likely to be your last chance to plant your cauliflowers, cabbage, brussel sprouts or broccoli. Don't forget to use some liquid fertilisers to get these plants started. Other plants to be planted now are lettuce, turnips, radish and white onions.

Flowers: seedlings that can be planted are alyssum, pansy, viola, stocks, poppy, calendula, carnations, dianthus, polyanthus, larkspur, wallflower, sweet William snapdragon, statice, verbena and for an attractive border in the spring, Virginian stock directly into the garden. This dainty spring annual has small flowers in white, cream, soft pink and lavender and when the buds start to appear in early spring, give them a feel of liquid fertiliser. They also look attractive in tubs and pots.

This month also, insects such as aphids and various caterpillars can appear on roses. Spray them with Malathion or Rogor 40 and Lebaycide. Black aphids on chrysanthemums can be controlled by spraying them with malathion. Make sure you don't use Rogor or Lebaycide as these systemic chemicals can burn the new plants.

March is also a good time to fertilise your lawns with a complete lawn fertiliser to brighten them up as well as strengthen the lawn through winter. This helps to keep it looking good through winter too.

If you like propagating, this is the month to take cuttings of geraniums, fuschia and hydrangeas. Put the cuttings in a terra cotta pot 10cm across, this will take approximately 10 to 12 cuttings and making sure they are planted around the edge as they get more warmth. Using a mixture of 1 part coarse sand and 2 parts peatmoss, have at least 2 eyes in the mixture and 2-3 eyes out, making sure the mixture does not dry out.

## LIBRARY NEWS

### Library Links - 31 January 2000 Great Reasons to Come to the Goulburn Branch Library

If you are a student studying for your Higher School Certificate, the Goulburn Branch Library can help you find the information you need to complete that assignment.

There are different information resources available for in-library use as well as resources that can be taken home including:

- HSC File – contains a range of resources including Infocus, Hot Topics, Issues for the Nineties/Issues in Society.

Infocus is an initiative of the State Library to provide students with current information on all HSC subjects. The information comes in the form of articles taken from books, magazines and newspapers.

Issues for the Nineties/Issues in Society are educational resource books about contemporary Australian Social Issues. The information comes from government reports and statistics, newspaper reports, magazine articles and surveys, Internet web site material, literature from lobby groups and charitable organisations. Issues covered include bullying, unemployment in Australia and suicide.

Hot Topics are booklets of current legal issues in plain language produced by the Legal Information Access Centre. Issues in Hot Topics include Firearms, Native Title and Relationships.

All material from the HSC File can be borrowed for a one-week loan period.

- Subject Collection – Books on an extensive range of subjects including Ancient and Modern History, English, English Literature and Biology are available for loan. Study Guides on a number of HSC Subjects are also available for loan, including Excel HSC Legal Studies, Excel HSC Drama, Excel HSC Modern History and Excel HSC Society and Culture.

If you need assistance writing essays/reports check out the following: Essay writing made easy, Writing as essay: How to improve your performance for coursework and examination and Writing made easy : an extensive guide to writing for English students.

To find specific titles take a look on the library computer catalogue or ask a staff member for assistance



All books in the subject collections can be borrowed for a three week loan period.

- Reference Collection – Is a collection of dictionaries, atlas's, encyclopaedia's, fact books, daily newspapers and information books that are available for in-library use.
- The Legal Tool Kit is a series of legal books and pamphlets in plain English that is part of the Reference Collection. The books cover a range of legal issues from being arrested to understanding the law.
- The Internet – Is available for use for free for up to 20 minutes on five of the public access computers. From the Southern Tablelands Regional Library Home Page, (<http://www.goulburn.nsw.gov.au/library/>) you can access Search Engines and information links to other Internet resources. Printouts can be obtained for 20cents per page.  
A feature of the library homepage is "Have A Question?" If you have a reference query and are unable to come to the library you can send your question via email. The library can help you with any questions that can be answered using the library collection and/or the resources available on the Internet.
- Previous HSC exam papers (1997 – 1998) are located on five of the public access computers. The CD-ROM published by the Board of Studies covers all HSC subjects. Printouts can be obtained at 20cents per page.

To find out more about resources and services come into the Goulburn Branch Library and have a look.

If you are need of help to locate information always ask a library staff member for assistance.

**MARCH REPORT**

Ground preparation for 2000 should now be well underway. The DLWC ripper /moulder has already prepared over 40 hectares in our area in February. A recent walk through 1995 plantings, where mounding was first used, shows a dramatic difference between mounded and unmounded areas. The mounding process not only enhances ripping, but increases water retention control run off and makes weed control easier. As well as having ground preparation underway trees should now have been ordered, not relying on late supply – that may be hard to get later.

There have been several significant announcements relating to Farm Forestry already in 2000. Kim Yeadon, Minister for Energy and Forestry introduced the Biofuels Bill in November to facilitate the development of a biofuel industry as part of the greenhouse strategy. This will enable power generation from small wood fired generators feeding into the grid, using waste biomass from forest industries. This will not only provide cheap, clean electricity generation, but will use the biomass instead of it decaying away in landfills, generating methane. The proposal of course angers the greenies, who see it as vandalising our native forests to produce power. This shows just how shallow and uninformed their ideas are. By using wood chip, saw dust, forest and mill waste, the outcome is to produce some CO<sub>2</sub>, but reduce the large methane emissions from normal decay. Plantations to feed the biofuel power stations will of course help in soaking up huge amounts of carbon emissions.

Also in the news has been the announcement of large tree plantings by Japanese power utilities to off set their carbon dioxide emissions. Tokyo Power will plant 1000 hectares per year of Eucalypts and Pines for 10 years. Shikoku Power will plant 10,000 hectares in Victoria, while other companies are considering planting in Ausrtalia, where land is available. This is good, because after all much of the coal and gas causing emissions in Japan come from Australia. It is not clear when individual farmers with smaller plantings may benefit from Carbon Trading, but it will come in the future. Carbon trading will commence on the Sydney Futures Exchange in 2000.

Sydney Catchment Authority will no doubt have a big impact in this area on future land use. They do not oppose forest development, but see some problems in use of exotics and in harvesting forests. We hope to have a big impact into their thinking on this matter in the near future. Forest plantations if established correctly can improve water quality and will not impact on yield, unless whole catchments are planted. By having young, actively growing forests of natives or exotics will ensure high rates of carbon sequestration and provide biomass energy for electricity production. Forestry development can reduce erosion, prevent siltation of dams, reduce the blue green algae problem, be very environmentally desirable by reducing greenhouse and still provide a sustainable land use into the future.

The message is then to plan your plantations now and be ready for the expansion of Farm Forestry in the next few years.

# In Council with Inda Evans

## Water

The State Government has issued a "White Paper" on its proposed new water legislation and is inviting comments by the end of March.

The proposed legislation covers a huge range of water issues, including harvestable rights, the farm dams policy, new licensing arrangements and restrictions, groundwater use, etc.

Although it claims to be State-wide legislation, the big cities – Sydney, Wollongong and Newcastle – are not included in any restrictions. In fact, there is other documentation from the Sydney Catchment Authority which clearly indicates that in dry times (when the bush and farmers need water most) Warragamba Dam would be supplemented by 15% extra water so that the city can be water restriction free.

To obtain a copy of the White Paper, call the Department of Land and Water Conservation on 1800 353 104.

This proposed legislation will affect us all and I urge you to take an active interest.

There will be a public meeting at the Goulburn Soldiers' Club on Tuesday 14 March, starting at 7.30pm. Make every effort to be there and voice your concerns.

## Training Accreditation for Fire Fighters

Following a long and drawn out battle with the NSW Rural Fire Service, Mulwaree has finally been accredited to provide training for Senior First Aid as well as basic and advanced fire fighting, Crew and Group Leader, and village fire fighting.

The accreditation provides State wide recognition for these courses and makes Mulwaree a leader in training in the Southern Region.

Congratulations to all involved!

Welcome also to Tim Street from Support Brigade, who takes over as incoming Bush Fire Training Co-ordinator.

## Rubbish and Recycling Bins

For a trial period, a rubbish bin has been placed in the truck turning bay on the corner of Marulan South and Jerrara Roads.

This was done to try to reduce the amount of rubbish strewn by passing traffic around the turning bay and the

cemetery on that corner. The bin is not intended for household rubbish – please take yours to the tip. Indeed, if the bin is used primarily for household refuse, it will have to be removed.

The containers for recyclables at Bungonia should be used only for that purpose – please keep rubbish out of them.

The recycling containers at Marulan (on the corner of Thoroughfare Street and Post Office Lane) have been removed as there was regularly a large amount of rubbish mixed in. Please do not leave any recycling material on this corner – take it to the tip instead.

Sunday 5 March is Clean Up Australia Day and it would be great to see our roadsides rubbish free again. If you can spare an hour or two to get involved, call Cr Maureen Eddy who is co-ordinating this effort.

Perhaps groups of volunteers could assign themselves a portion of road side to clean up near their homes or properties. Don't forget to bring along your gloves and wear sturdy shoes or boots.
