**War Memorial:** Work has begun on the Memorial garden.

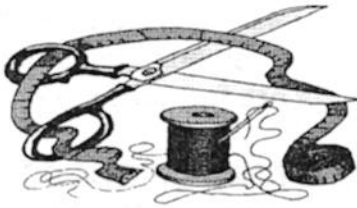
# Patchwork & Quilting Classes

### PLANTATIONS NOT HARMFUL.

A three year study into the impact of pine plantations in north-eastern Victoria has found they have no more harmful effects on water supply than native forests.

The study was carried out by the Co-operative Research Centre for Catchment Hydrology at Melbourne University's Department of Forestry and funded by the Forestry and Wood Products Research and Development Corporation.

It compared the effects of radiata pine plantations and native eucalypt forests on three water catchments West of Mount Buffalo between 1997 and 2000.

It measures water quality, nutrient levels and stream flows in catchments in the Cropper Creek area, where radiata pines plantations have been established since 1980.

The results were compared with those from neighboring catchment covered by native forests and with data collected before the pines were planted.

Water quality was constant with little difference in water use between the two types of trees, while soil erosion and stream turbidity were also similar.

Leon Bren of Melbourne University's Department of Forestry, who led the study with peter Hopmans, of the Centre for Forest Tree Technology, said all the evidence pointed to the fact that there was little, if any, impact from radiata pine plantations compared to eucalypt forests.

"The studies also show that the amount of water used by radiata pine at about 20 years old is approximate to that of native forests."

Chairman of the Forest and Wood Products Research and Development Corporation, Thorold H. Gunnerson, said the outcome sent a clear message that conversion of forest to radiata pine met modern criteria of sustainable land and water use and that radiata pine could be a viable, sustainable industry.

Earlier plantings at Inverary, around the infamous "gully from hell" are now showing positive results from extensive use of radiata pine.

Slowly all the misconception about pine plantations are being disproved by irrefutable scientific studies. Much of this recent research has been aimed at the implementation of The 2020 Vision to treble Australia's softwood plantations by 2020 making us self sufficient.

In badly eroded, dispersable soils around the Inverary gully system, the radiata has shown many more positive results. The very active gully heads are becoming stable and the whole area between the pines is now covered in a complete canopy of native grasses preventing any further surface erosion. Run off after a major event is slowed and regulated.

This research work in Victoria, supports earlier results from the Mt. Gambier region. Now we can say for sure pines do not adversely affect water quality on run off and in effect regulate it.

# Council Notes

## Technology

Did I say last month that I had solved the "technology" problems? Well, the quality of last month's column proved me wrong – it still has me beat!

But, is this month a better job? Let's see.

## Growth and Development

The Australian Bureau of Statistics has had Mulwaree Shire at the top of the ladder for some time now – highest growth rate outside N.S.W. (Newcastle, Sydney and Wollongong metropolitan areas). I am looking forward to the details of the last census to become available later this year to prove the point. Meanwhile, Council continues to consider a whole swag of development applications each month.

Among the applications considered at the January meeting were

- ! two log cabins for tourist accommodation at Lake Bathurst,
- ! a new business offering janitorial supplies located on Tiyces Lane
- ! a turkey farm at Windellama and
- ! a small (garden shed size) equipment shelter vault on the Federal Highway at Wollogorang.

An application to develop a property north of Goulburn for rabbit farming (no, not the feral paddock variety of rabbits) led to Council deciding to review its existing policy on this activity, given that the standards and requirements appear to have changed and improved since the policy was first developed.

These approvals are in addition to the large number of approvals for dwellings, additions, garages, sheds, small subdivisions, and the like that are received every month and delegated to Council staff to assess under Council's guidelines.

## Expansion and Vision

An unfortunate fire that destroyed a business in Tarago recently has become the catalyst to providing bigger and better things for the Tarago community.

Council made a special effort to quickly determine an application for an extended service station, renovated store, office and post office at Tarago. The proposed development is likely to significantly enhance the services available at Tarago and the process was an excellent example of the way your Council operates when there is an identified priority need in the community.

The Tarago example shows very clearly that the Shire is looking forward and thinking about the needs of its community.

## Budget 2002/2003

Council will be putting together its budget proposals over the next couple of months. It is expected that bitumen sealing of Oallen Ford Road and Lumley Road will continue.

## Water Management

The draft Water Sharing Plan for the Kangaroo River catchment is expected to go on public exhibition for comment this month.

It affects this region because it is the first of many such plans to come and therefore sets the precedent.

The plan was originally drafted by the Shoalhaven/Illawarra Water Management Committee (of which I am a member) and the Minister's "expert panel" has already made suggestions for amendment.

**It is important that the community takes the opportunity to read the draft and make comments.**

*Weeds won't wait!*  
*A free seminar you can't afford to miss*

The Jacqua Creek Landcare group is hosting an information day to discuss the management of weeds, those along creeks (riparian) and those in pastures. Like so many other landholders in the Upper Shoalhaven catchment, members of the Jacqua Creek Landcare Group have found a common problem in the management of weeds.

**The workshop 'Weeds won't wait' will be held on**

**Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> March 2002**

**Bungonia Hall**

**9:30 am – 12:30 pm**

Presentations and question time will be given by:

- - Paul Brown, Mulwaree Shire Weeds officer, discussing landholder responsibilities to weed control and what the Mulwaree Shire Council are doing to manage weeds;
- - Dennis Ashton, Sydney Catchment Authority, to give advice on the management of riparian weeds and information about the efforts of the Sydney Catchment Authority;
- - Walter Jehne from the Bombay Landcare Group discussing efforts of this group of landholders to manage weeds beyond an individual property boundary; and
- - Representatives from the Rural Training Centre discussing training opportunities for landholders in the safe use of farm chemicals and weed spraying.

Morning tea will be served. If you have a concern about the management of weeds, this is an excellent opportunity to learn about your responsibilities, the work of local authorities and the opportunities Landcare provides to help manage weeds.

## GARDENING IN MARCH

March can be one of the loveliest months of the year. The days are pleasant, and nights cooler and the autumn tones are starting to appear.

This is most likely to be your last chance to plant your cauliflowers, cabbage, brussel sprouts or broccoli. Don't forget to use some liquid fertilisers to get these plants started. Other plants to be planted now are lettuce, turnips, radish and white onions.

Flowers: seedlings that can be planted are alyssum, pansy, viola, stocks, poppy, calendula, carnations, dianthus, polyanthus, larkspur, wallflower, sweet William snapdragon, statice, verbenas and for an attractive border in the spring, Virginian stock directly into the garden. This dainty spring annual has small flowers in white, cream, soft pink and lavender and when the buds start to appear in early spring, give them a feel of liquid fertiliser. They also look attractive in tubs and pots.

This month also, insects such as aphids and various caterpillars can appear on roses. Spray them with Malathion or Rogor 40 and Lebaycide. Black aphids on chrysanthemums can be controlled by spraying them with malathion. Make sure you don't use Rogor or Lebaycide as these systemic chemicals can burn the new plants.

March is also a good time to fertilise your lawns with a complete lawn fertiliser to brighten them up as well as strengthen the lawn through winter. This helps to keep it looking good through winter too.

If you like propagating, this is the month to take cuttings of geraniums, fuschia and hydrangeas. Put the cuttings in a terra cotta pot 10cm across, this will take approximately 10 to 12 cuttings and making sure they are planted around the edge as they get more warmth. Using a mixture of 1 part coarse sand and 2 parts peatmoss, have at least 2 eyes in the mixture and 2-3 eyes out, making sure the mixture does not dry out.

## TRACKING GOULBURN'S HERITAGE: GOULBURN AND THE GREAT SOUTHERN RAILWAY

During March, and coinciding with Goulburn's Festival of Heritage, Jazz and Roses, Goulburn Branch Library will be presenting a display of historical photographs, newspaper articles and other resources that focus on the Great Southern Railway and its historic influence on the growth of Goulburn.

'Tracking Goulburn's Heritage: Goulburn and the Great Southern Railway' will include a selection of materials that should evoke some poignant memories and open up new avenues of interest, as it highlights historic moments of the railway in the Goulburn region. Of particular interest will be a collection of manuscripts and original editions, which are being generously lent to the library by renowned local railway enthusiast, photographer and author, Leon Oberg.

For well over one hundred years, while Australia's prosperity rode high on the sheep's back, the Great Southern Railway proved particularly influential in providing direction for Goulburn's future. More than just a southern terminus or a loading dock, it ultimately provided employment and a support network for hundreds of railway workers and their families, as well as an efficient transport system for the valuable products of local farmers and graziers.

Times change, as has the role of the Great Southern Railway. No longer do the steaming locomotives or railway workshops drive Goulburn's future. Throughout its history however, the Great Southern Railway has provided Goulburn with a link to all corners of the globe, and has undeniably shaped both its economic and cultural development. Through this exhibition, you will have the chance to 'track' down and relive the glory days of this historic railway, experience some of the excitement, and maybe even learn something about the people whose lives were shaped by the Great Southern Railway.

# Friendly Frolicking Foals



How did it happen, that sweet soft gangly legged foal that only a few days ago was the reason you got up in the morning is now the dread of your life. Morning feed time is no longer a pleasure, in fact it has become plain dangerous.

This is an all too common problem, which is mostly avoidable. From the time your foal is born it has to learn that some behavior is allowed around people; and other behavior is only used with it's equine friends. This may seem hard when looking at your new born foal but just remember that one day this same foal is going to be a mature large animal. Also keep in mind that there is very little future for an uncontrollable horse. Once undesirable behavior has become a habit it is often very hard to alter. These situations always cause stress to all concerned.

Encourage your foals good behavior, reward it with affection; equines like physical contact.

When a foal is small and cute owners tend to laugh at their antics, but a six-week-old foal that rears up and strikes above your head is not funny, in fact it is dangerous. Just stop and think how you will feel about this little habit when it is 15 hands high, and a lot harder to handle. Don't accept any behavior from your foal that you would not accept in a mature horse.

The type of behaviors that your foal must learn are not to be expressed around people are mostly the type of things a foal does with another foal in play. Your foal has to learn that you are not another foal to play with, that your maturity demands respect. Your foal's dam (mother) doesn't normally play these games either. Foals learn quickly, and are quite happy to please you, encourage your foal to be friendly not dangerous.

Always be safety conscious around foals, they are more agile and playful then mature equines. Foals although small can be dangerous, I know of one girl who was kicked while loading a two month old foal onto a truck. The foal meant her no real harm, but the girl received both hind feet in the chest and was killed instantly.

I know that it is not always easy to make your untouched foal understand what you want from it, patience and persistence pays off in the long run. At the end of the day we all want our foals to have the best start in life, their early training is the building block for their later education.

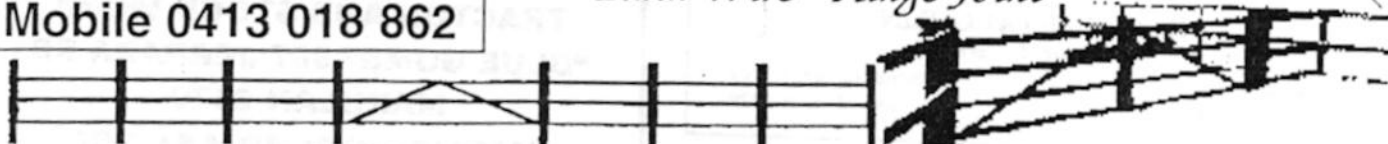

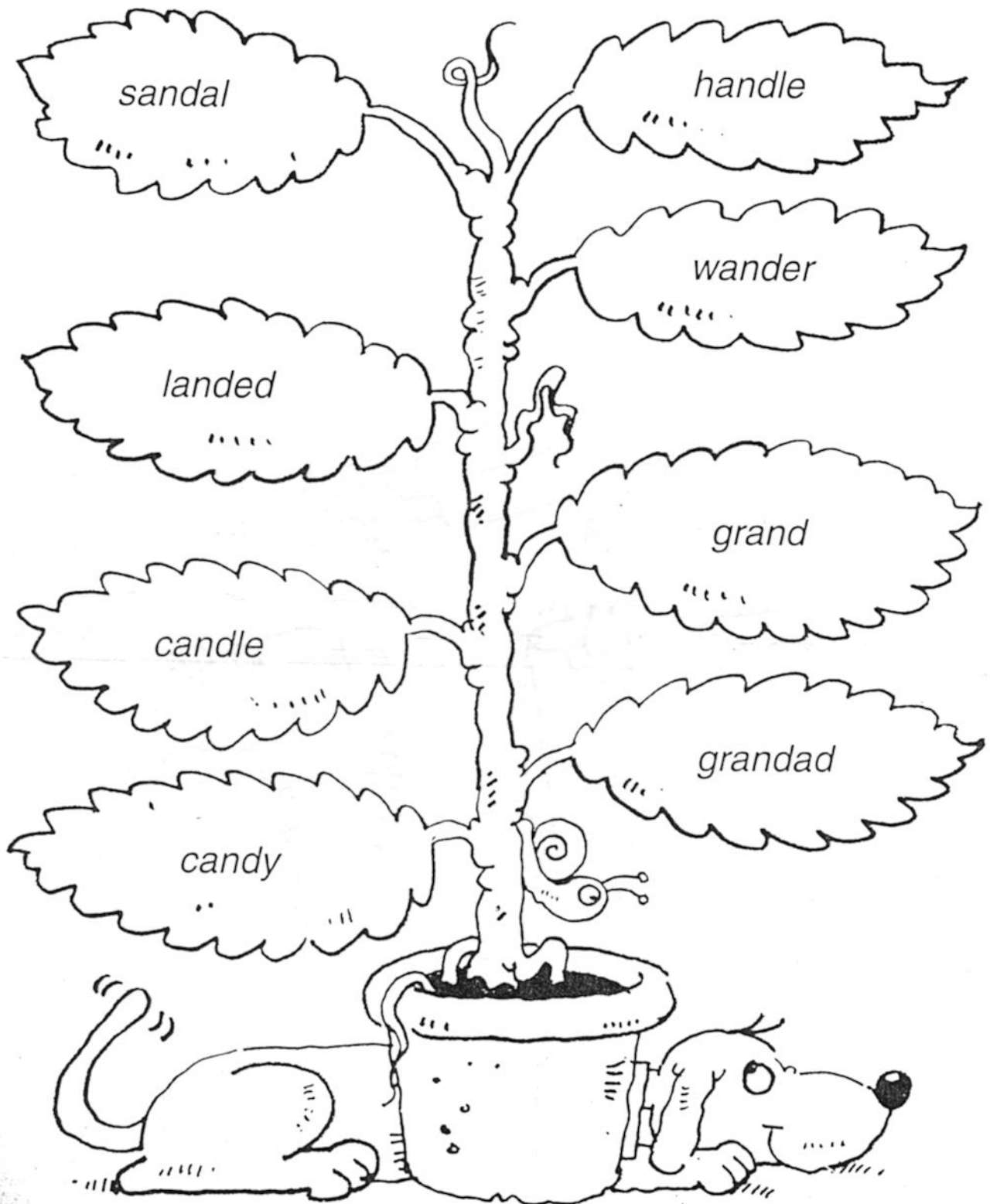
