GARDENING IN NOVEMBER

It is time to fertilise the lawn. Use a good lawn fertiliser and if we don't have a lot of rain, then we need to put plenty of water on them so the fertiliser does not burn the lawn.

Roses should be sprayed with Malathon or Rogor if aphids appear and you can also spray with Zineb or Benlate for Black Spot. If you go to your nursery, they may stock a general rose spray which will treat most things with one chemical. Also, feed your roses with a complete fertiliser.

Plant salad vegetables such as lettuce, squash and cucumber now for a Christmas harvest.

It is also time to watch for fruit fly as well, they are active on developing fruit and tomatoes. Telltale signs are small pockmarks on the fruit. Tomatoes have a small pinprick and the surrounding area stays green. Apply a splash bait made from 7ml of maldison and 50g of sugar, dissolved in 1 litre of water. Splash mixture onto leaves and trunks. Fenthion (Lebayid) and dimethoate (Rogar) will control fruit flies but must be used strictly as directed.

Feed Citrus and other fruit trees with blood and bone or all purpose plant food. Apply as far as the dripline or the extent of branch spread. Soak the area well.

Handy Hints

Clean moss and algae from paths which were in the shade during winter to make your garden safer. The simplest way is to apply neat vinegar or a mix of equal parts water and strong disinfectant. Scrub firmly with a stiff brush, leave for an hour or so and hose off residue with a strong jet from the hose. If the problem persists, repeat the process in one week. This method does not affect the plants and environment the way chemicals do.

Anti-Airport meeting

Congratulations to the organiser, Cynthia Harris! Last month's public meeting saw Bungonia Hall packed to the rafters with almost the same number of apologies from those who wanted to be there but had previous commitments.

There were people from all over the Shire as well as Goulburn so it seems that anti-airport feelings are very rife in the community.

The meeting agreed to form an action group and elected a dozen or so eager committee members who meet on November 1.

A quick whip around resulted in a starting kitty of close to \$500 for fighting this issue.

I expect there will be lots of information flowing from now on and more meetings to go to. Keep up the good work!

Flag

Bungonia Bush Fire Brigade has at last received a banner for the bare flag pole outside the fire shed. It has taken over 12 months but the Commissioner has fulfilled his promise.

I hope the promises regarding training and accreditation for those doing the courses takes a little less time than that.

Talking Waste

A pilot waste management board for the region is being established under the Waste Minimisation and Management Act 1995. Council's representatives on this Board will include the Mayor, Cr Paul Stephenson, and General Manager, Col Wotton.

In the meantime, the North Sydney Waste Board selected Muswellbrook over the Woodlawn Mine site for their waste contract, however, indicated that Woodlawn should be developed as an alternative.

Collex will be going ahead with

their EIS for the site and Council is urging them to consider extending the railway right to the site so that there is no transfer of waste containers from rail to road at Tarago.

The EIS is expected to be on public display, for comment, from about mid-November so if you are interested in seeing the documents, call Council at that time to check out the details.

Building Application

A building application for a house on Mountain Ash Road was refused because the property was much smaller than the minimum 40 hectares required for rural zones.

Although there are several smaller blocks nearby with building approvals, it is the old rules of parish portions and concessional allotments that have allowed this to happen. Council stands firm on its existing policy of 40 hectare minimums for rural housing.

To Your Health

Julien Vanslambrouck of Windellama and I have been appointed to the Southern Tablelands Health Council.

This is an official community advisory group to the Southern Health Service who are responsible for public health facilities from the Southern Tablelands across to the coast and down to the Victorian border.

We have already toured the health facilities in Goulburn and will be looking at a number of issues important to our community.

There are still some positions on the Health Council to be filled. If you are interested in nominating for one of these, please give me a call.

• Women's health nurse, Christine Goodrich, from the Goulburn Community Health Centre will be holding regular monthly clinics at the Marulan Doctor's surgery starting Monday 16 November.

The clinic offers a free, confidential, personalised service and includes pap

smears, breast examinations, pregnancy testing, counselling and information on a whole range of issues for women. Ring 4821 3913 for an appointment.

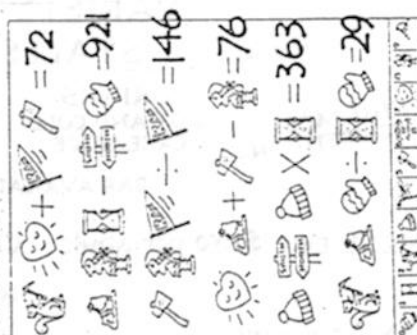

Carbon Credits – Can We Make Money While Our Trees Grow?

"Maybe in the future" is the conclusion made from hearing a number of speakers at a Carbon Credits and Plantations seminar held in Albury recently.

Professor Snow Barlow, from the Bureau of Resource sciences in Canberra was one of the main speakers. He is involved in the international negotiations and regards the Kyoto protocol on Greenhouse gases as a "ground breaking treaty".

The Greenhouse Problem

Scientific evidence is showing that the levels carbon dioxide in our atmosphere have increased around 30% in a century, and unless emissions are addressed, levels will be double by 2040 (within the lifetime of most of us!) and tripled by the end of the 21st century. The consequences of this are increasing global temperatures, with 1997 the hottest year on record and of the last 12 years, 10 were the hottest on record.

The Kyoto Protocol

Global warming is happening, and it is a unique problem in that it affects the whole globe. To start to address it, the developing countries, (known as the Annex B countries which include all the OECD nations and Russia) have got together and started to put some guidelines in place which are "The Kyoto Protocol". This protocol does not become a legally binding, or ratified, document until these 55 countries, producing over 55% of greenhouse gas emissions (in particular the US) have signed. This signing is not expected for 2-3 years, as there is much detail to be worked out and agreed to before nations are prepared to sign.

Australia's Emission Target

So far the countries at Kyoto have agreed to restrict their emissions of greenhouse gases by a certain percentage of their emissions in 1990. Australia's target is 108% of our 1990 emissions.

Sectors counted as emitters are the energy sectors, all sorts of industry, industrial waste, landfill waste, emissions from agriculture (which are mainly methane and

nitrous oxide component of greenhouse gases) and land clearing or deforestation.

On the credit side, afforestation and reforestation occurring since 1990 can be included. Afforestation is essentially a change in landuse, which excludes the cutting down of forest and immediately replanting it. Managed forestry is NOT currently included as a sequester or user of carbon as the protocol currently stands!! The definition of a forest may have major ramifications for Australia. In the Australian inventory, a forest is over 2m high, with 20% crown cover. In Europe a forest is defined as being 5-7 m high!!

Another detail still to be decided is what is reforestation? – how long do you have to be in another landuse before you can reforest it?

What other activities can we count? No-till farming? Natural managed forestry? Managed forestry pre 1990? Conservation-rehabilitation plantings? At present conservation planting post 1990 would count as reforestation provided they meet the definition of a forest, whatever that is!!!

To enable countries to meet their target, flexibility mechanisms have been introduced in the protocol which include a mechanism where countries can trade in emission credits.

It is felt that although there is still much to be decided, the emissions trading mechanism is fairly certain to go ahead, therefore the amount of greenhouse gas emissions and sequestration potential has to be measured by each nation – a greenhouse gas inventory.

Australia's total emissions in 1995 were about 500 million tons of CO₂ equivalent, and this is largely from industrial and energy and transport sectors. Unusually, Australia's proportion of greenhouse gas emissions due to land use change, forestry and agriculture is 35%, much higher than all other countries whose bulk of emissions are from energy and industrial. However Australia is in a unique position to be able to trade carbon credits to emitter countries. But as it has much land available for reforestation Australia is also an emitter and has to meet its own target of only 108% by 2020, so there is going to be pressure from Australia's energy sector to use up only credits available.

Greenhouse Gas Emission Trading

An important aspect of reaching targets is the measurement, particularly where emissions trading is going to occur. Paul Palmer, Manager of Emissions Trading at the Australian Greenhouse Office, explained the Australian government's views on emissions trading at the seminar.

He started by emphasising that the Commonwealth Government still has not made any decisions on the introduction of a national greenhouse gas emissions trading system – it is still examining the feasibility and desirability of such a system. The Australian Greenhouse Office has been established to investigate all the possible mechanisms and co-ordinate domestic climate change policy.

As this article points out Carbon Credits are on the drawing board of the future possibly before 2008. The best advice I can offer any local grower is to keep accurate records of all plantings from 1990 onwards.

If you are considering any large tree plantings for 1999 now is the time to start thinking about ground preparation and order trees early.
