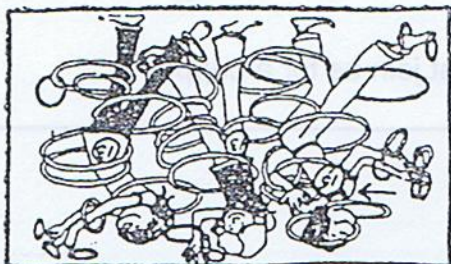

GARDENING IN NOVEMBER

It is time to fertilise the lawn. Use a good lawn fertiliser and if we don't have a lot of rain, then we need to put plenty of water on them so the fertiliser does not burn the lawn.

Roses should be sprayed with Malathon or Rogor if aphids appear and you can also spray with Zineb or Benlate for Black Spot. If you go to your nursery, they may stock a general rose spray which will treat most things with one chemical. Also, feed your roses with a complete fertiliser.

Plant salad vegetables such as lettuce, squash and cucumber now for a Christmas harvest.

It is also time to watch for fruit fly as well, they are active on developing fruit and tomatoes. Telltale signs are small pockmarks on the fruit. Tomatoes have a small pinprick and the surrounding area stays green. Apply a splash bait made from 7ml of maldison and 50g of sugar, dissolved in 1 litre of water. Splash mixture onto leaves and trunks. Fenthion (Lebayid) and dimethoate (Rogar) will control fruit flies but must be used strictly as directed.

Feed Citrus and other fruit trees with blood and bone or all purpose plant food. Apply as far as the dripline or the extent of branch spread. Soak the area well.

Handy Hints: Clean moss and algae from paths which were in the shade during winter to make your garden safer. The simplest way is to apply neat vinegar or a mix of equal parts water and strong disinfectant. Scrub firmly with a stiff brush, leave for an hour or so and hose off residue with a strong jet from the hose. If the problem persists, repeat the process in one week. This method does not affect the plants and environment the way chemicals do.

Year 2000 Millennium Party

As advised in earlier issues of your newsletter, Mulwaree Shire Council and Goulburn City Council were supporting a jointly funded Year 2000 Celebration in Goulburn's CBD.

While the financial contribution from both Councils was significant, the success of the proposed function depended on a substantial amount of money being raised from the local business community. Plans included closing a number of streets, and providing varied entertainment including live music, street theatre, children's entertainment, and a fireworks display, all free of charge for families attending the event.

However, despite the assistance of both Mulwaree Shire Council and Goulburn City Council, as well as other promised contributions, the organising Committee felt they could not guarantee the quality of the function without a greater level of support from the local business community. This had not been realised.

At the meeting held on Thursday 14th October 1999, the Committee for the Millennium Party voted not to proceed with the planned public celebration.

This, of course, won't disappoint those among us who claim that the "millennium doesn't finish until the end of the year 2000, anyway...." So, maybe it could be organised for next year!

Meanwhile, several community groups in the Shire, including Windellama, Taralga and Marulan, are planning local functions for their areas, which most certainly will take place.

In Council with Inda Evans

The New Term

The new term of Council started with the September meeting and welcomed incoming Councillors John Reynolds and Denzil Sturgiss who are representing B Ward.

I congratulate both on their election wins and wish them a very fruitful and effective time on Council.

I'm sure we will all work together as a team for the benefit of the community and I look forward to being able to report on further improvements each month.

I will be continuing as Council's representative on the Southern Tablelands Library and Bushfire committees as well as maintaining my interests in regional arts and health.

Woodlawn Inquiry

The proposal for a waste management facility on the Woodlawn mine site was being investigated last month by a Commission of Inquiry set up by the Minister for Urban Affairs and Planning.

This is a quite common procedure when a major development is proposed where the Minister would be the approving authority.

The Commissioner heard submissions from a wide range of organisations and individuals. The next step will be "submissions in reply" which should be heard this month.

The Commissioner will then assess the proposed project and make recommendations to the Minister and this is expected to happen before Christmas this year.

The final say is, of course, with the Minister and there is no time period identified for his decision at present.

Developments

- A poultry farm for seven sheds on Glynmar Road has been approved.
- An application to rezone the Bishopthorpe property near Goulburn for the kennelling of hunting hounds will go on exhibition for public comment. The property already has approval for development as a country guest house.
- Council agreed that, in general, rural residential cluster developments or community title developments were not suitable for the Shire. There may, however,

be some locations, such as near villages, where this type of development could be considered, but any application would need to be considered on its merits.

Community title developments work on a similar principle to strata title units with common property managed by all owners. The housing side of such developments is usually clustered in one part of the subdivision instead of being spread across it at the normal rate of one dwelling per one hundred acres.

Threatened Species and Water Catchments

A number of State Government authorities jointly prepared a draft revision of the Threatened Species Conservation Act, sent to Council in early September for comment by 27 September. Given that Council's September meeting only took place a couple of days before the deadline for comments, we were effectively given no time at all for comment.

Given the State Government's current penchant for environmental protection, I would have thought they would prefer to consult with Councils and local communities to get them on side rather than trying to push through amendments that affect the way locals may deal with threatened species in their areas.

Along similar lines, the Department of Urban Affairs and Planning released a proposed Regional Environmental Plan for Sydney and Regional Centres Drinking Water Catchments. They called a workshop in Goulburn in mid September which was poorly advertised and poorly attended. Will they now infer that we are not concerned about our drinking water?

On both issues, Council will be expressing its concern about inadequate processes and demanding proper consultation.

BUNGONIA RESOURCE CENTRE OPENED BY FORESTRY MINISTER

A new landcare resource centre at Bungonia was officially opened yesterday by Kim Yeadon, Minister for Forestry, Minister for Information Technology, Minister for Energy and Minister for Western Sydney.

The Inverary Landcare Group Resource Centre took six months to build and was a joint effort by many volunteers, according to Kevin Cooper, President of the landcare group.

"The next phase for landcare in the district is an educational one based on the forestry trials we have undertaken over the last decade.

"We needed a central place to store the group's equipment, and somewhere to host displays, meetings, field days and visiting groups such as university students. This resource centre is the result," Mr Cooper said.

Kevin and Beryl Cooper have trialled nearly 100 species of eucalypts and now grow around 10 species for seed collection and sale. They have also planted nearly 300,000 radiata pines as a commercial venture and to reduce the effects of dryland salinity and acid soils in the catchment.

"There is a big future for farm forestry in the area, with owners of smaller blocks able to make some use of their properties," he said.

Officially opening the centre, Kim Yeadon commended the Inverary Landcare Group members, and the Coopers in particular, on their pioneering work in farm forestry.

"This is one of the places you can come in New South Wales and see visionary work that will provide us with an extraordinary amount of information as we continue to undertake farm forestry and plant trees for a whole range of benefits," Mr Yeadon said.

"The government can't go out and buy the sort of support and commitment given by the Coopers and the other group members. The work they've been doing constitutes the first phase in New South Wales of an explosion in farm forestry."
