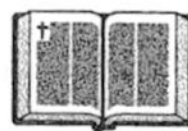

Council Notes

with Cr Inda Evans

Congratulations

Congratulations to Anne Williams who became an official Australian citizen at last month's Council meeting. A proud moment for all of us.

Congratulations also to the whole community on a highly successful Centenary celebrations weekend.

Well done also for the archaeological work at the old inn across from the hall. I'm sure we will all learn of any significant historical finds in due course.

Bushfire Funding

Council is again having problems with funding allocations from the NSW Rural Fire Service. To give you an idea of the scope of the problems I will outline just some of the issues.

The total allocation for Mulwaree Shire is \$964,812. Within this amount, is an allocation for maintenance and repairs which is effectively a reimbursement of moneys already spent in the previous year. This amount has been reduced from the \$93,830 sought (based on expenditure of \$99,342) to \$60,830 leaving Council to foot an excess maintenance and repairs bill of almost \$40,000.

In addition, the Rural Fire Service's "Other Programmes" which constitutes mainly administration costs at Parramatta headquarters, is around 50% of all proposed expenditure and has increased 10%.

All up, Council is being asked to contribute around \$64,000 more than was budgeted without any benefits to our firefighters or their equipment.

In fact, for the whole of the Southern Region, there is only \$4114 allocated for volunteer training. Something has to change.

Development

A religious retreat has been approved in the Mayfield area on the corner of Sandy Point and Silver Stream Roads. The first stage of the development consists of a meditation hall, amenities block and 11 retreat units and up to 200 people are expected to visit the complex during long weekend and school holidays.

A retail facility for rural supplies at Marulan was approved. The applicant proposes to sell a variety of goods such as stock feed, firewood, fencing materials, lawn mowers, whipper snippers, pumps, pipes tanks, animal supplies rural supplies hardware seeds, fertilisers, chainsaws, hire equipment such as cement mixers, etc. Sounds like a facility to service a wide area in the district.

Subdivisions at the last meeting were for 166 lots at Middle Arm and 17 lots at Naranbulla on the Hume Highway.

drumMUSTER

Council has agreed to participate in the drumMUSTER program for a 12 month trial period. The program provides for clean drums bearing the drumMUSTER logo to be disposed of safely by farmers. If you have drums that you want to get rid of, call Council for details.

'Clay Connection' ceramics exhibition

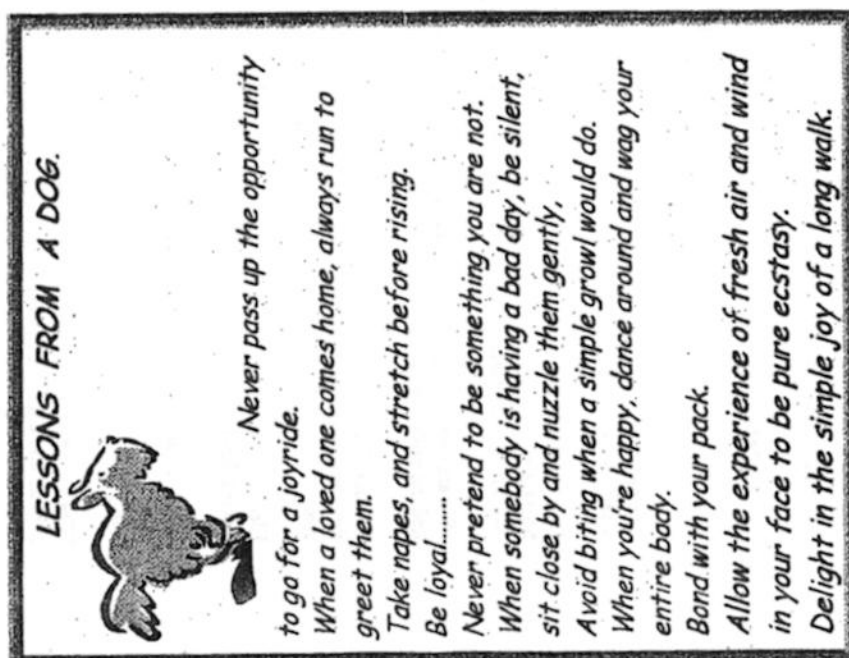
This is the name given to the graduating exhibition of four final year students of the Certificate III Ceramics course at the Illawarra Institute of Technology (TAFE NSW)

NEW DIRECTORS FOR GOULBURN RURAL LANDS PROTECTION BOARD ANNOUNCED

The new Directors of the Goulburn Rural Land Protection Board have been confirmed following this week's statewide RLPB elections.

Local landholders, Charles Jeffreys Prell, Graham Sinclair Murray, Daniel Simon Purser, Grant McMullen, Robin Mary Bell, Rhys Leslie Apps, Felicity Jane Henderson and Susan Jacqueline Armstrong were elected as Board directors for the next four years.

"We are extremely pleased with the results of the Goulburn Rural Lands Protection Board election and the calibre of people elected," Senior Administrative Officer, David Johnston, said.

"I would like to thank those people who stood for election and also all the landholders who took the time to vote and have their say on who would represent them on their local Board," Mr Johnston said.

Elections were held in three divisions (A, C and D) in the Goulburn area; with two representatives elected from each division. Nominees for Division B were elected unopposed.

"Each of our new Directors will have decision making power and the ability to allocate resources to help support and protect local farmers and ensure the sustainable growth of the Goulburn area," he said.

"The Directors will be responsible for making decisions on how best to manage animal health issues, prevent and control disease and how to coordinate pest animal management strategies."

"We are confident that the next four years will see an increasingly innovative Goulburn Board, with greater diversity and new ideas to take the region further forward," he said.

The new Directors will commence office on the 1 October, 2002.

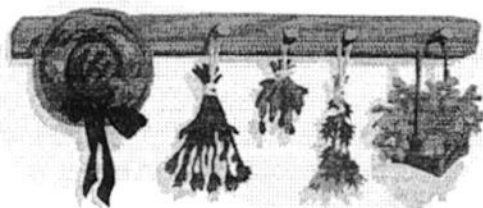

Historic 'Glenrock' will open its garden for the first time to the public on Saturday and Sunday 9th & 10th November this year, also April 26 & 27th next year as part of Australia's Open Garden Scheme. 'Glenrock' is situated on the Highland Way between Tallong & Marulan. Opening hours 10am to 4.30pm, admission \$5. **Caution:** Ungated railway crossing on property driveway so look out for trains.



Gardening in November

It is time to fertilise the lawn. Use a good lawn fertiliser and if we don't have a lot of rain, then we need to put plenty of water on them so the fertiliser does not burn the lawn.

Roses should be sprayed with Malathon or Rogor if aphids appear and you can also spray with Zineb or Benlate for Black Spot. If you go to your nursery, they may stock a general rose spray which will treat most things with one chemical. Also, feed your roses with a complete fertiliser.

Plant salad vegetables such as lettuce, squash and cucumber now for a Christmas harvest.

It is also time to watch for fruit fly as well, they are active on developing fruit and tomatoes. Telltale signs are small pockmarks on the fruit. Tomatoes have a small pinprick and the surrounding area stays green. Apply a splash bait made from 7ml of maldison and 50g of sugar, dissolved in 1 litre water. Splash mixture onto leaves and trunks. Fenthion (Lebayid) and dimethoate (Rogar) will control fruit flies but must be used strictly as directed.

Feed Citrus and other fruit trees with blood and bone or all purpose plant food. Apply as far as the dripline or the extent of branch spread. Soak the area well.

Handy Hints: Clean moss and algae from paths which were in the shade during winter to make your garden safer. The simplest way is to apply neat vinegar or a mix of equal parts water and strong disinfectant. Scrub firmly with a stiff brush, leave for an hour or so and hose off residue with a strong jet from the hose. If the problem persists, repeat the process in one week. This method does not affect the plants and environment the way chemicals do.

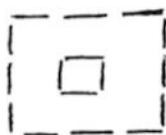

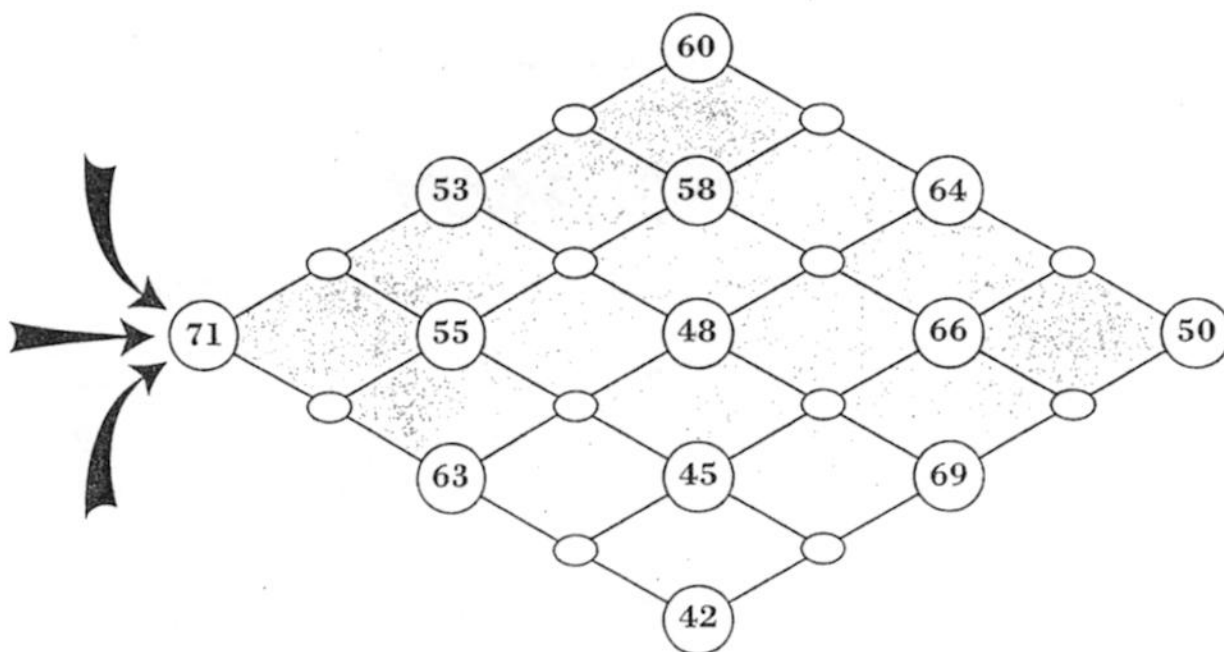

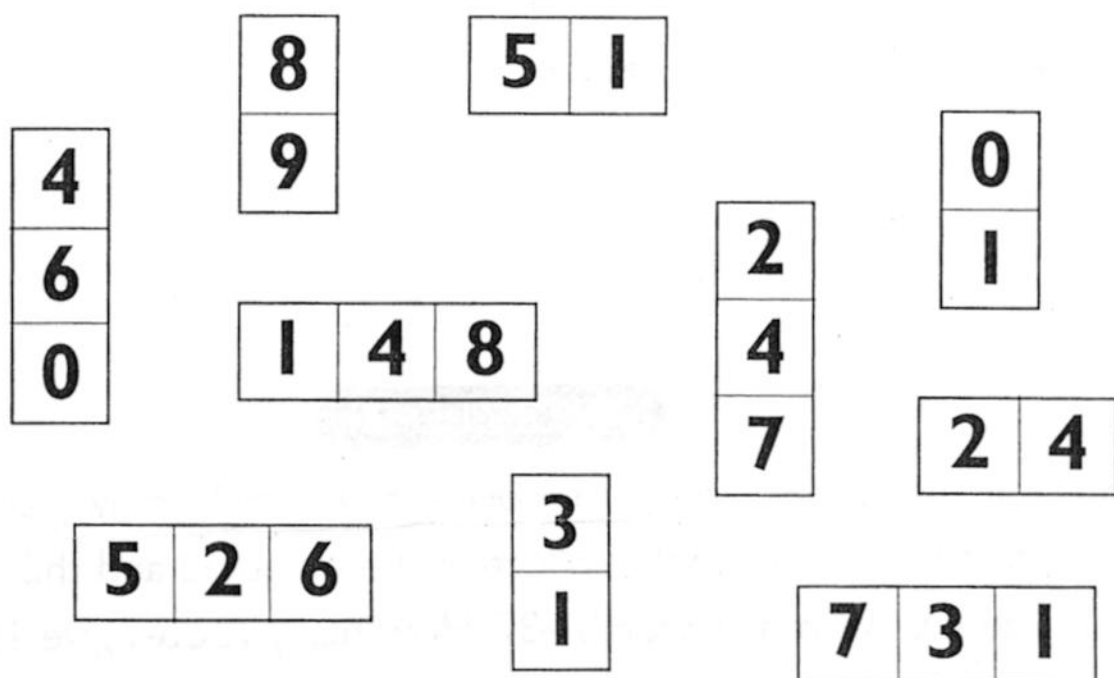

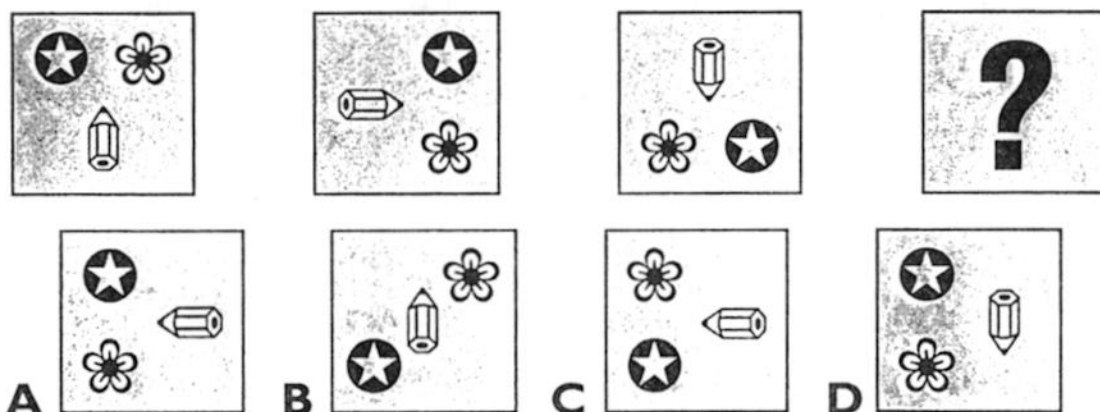
