Annual President's Report 09.09.02  
President John Wiggan.

1. I have enjoyed being in the chair and thank you for the opportunity.
2. It has not been a full year of office for me as I took over from Ray Dole who bowed out due to family commitments. I thank him for his past and continued support to Bungonia.

The year's activities have been varied;

- **The Easter Market Day** had to be cancelled. Like so many other small communities We were unable to get Public Liability Cover to hold it. **The Quilters** took over the Easter weekend and had great success with their Display .They were able to make a sizeable donation to the Progress Association.

- **The Progress Hall –Work done**

1. has been lined with mesh and Sisalcrafft and re-roofed in colorbond .It has stopped all the leaks and it looks good.
2. New guttering and fascia were put around the building
3. Improvements and repairs have been done to the kitchen ,the hall and the toilets.
4. The gardens have been weeded and some plants added by generous donations.

- **The Progress Hall –Work in Progress! Disability Access and Disability Toilet.**

1. Plans were drawn up for a Disability ramp and entrance as well as modifications to the toilets for Disabled users .
2. A request for funds was sent to Mulwarree Shire .Request was refused on the basis that they did not have funds for this and that ,if they gave us support-other halls would want the same treatment.
3. If they funded the disability facility they could become leaders in local government that listen to the ratepayers.

- **Anzac Memorial –**

Progress Association has helped with morning tea after the ceremony and doing work on the memorial.

- **Progress Supports New Community Groups**

1. **History.**

A group of interested people asked if a **HISTORY** group could be formed .Two meetings were held under the umbrella of the Progress Association .Then they decided that they would form themselves into a **separate Bungonia and District Historical Association** and affiliate with the Royal Australian Historical Society.It is going well and meetings are well attended.

2. **Rural Watch** - A Rural Watch division has been started after a public meeting with our local Police.The AIM is to give a much quicker response if someone sees or suspects a criminal action is being committed .Rural Watch will have its own office bearers but operate under the umbrella of the Progress Association. At this point we are still waiting for the necessary paperwork to be returned to Progress so that a meeting can be held for interested people to form a committee.

- **Tourism**

- 1 Bungonia Progress Association is now a member of Goulburn and District Tourism .This gives us access to the website and allows us to promote village and district events.
- 2 Bungonia Quilters have designed ,made and donated to Progress a delightful “Bungonia Village” Quilt to act as the backdrop for advertising Bungonia information and events in the Goulburn Tourist Centre. Ads and Information will be pinned to the Quilt.

- **Request to Mission Australia**-Progress asked Mission to send its mobile work team to help with clean up areas around the Village and the Cemetery .They came out for x2 days and did a lot of good work.We have asked them to return and do some more.

- **Requests made to the Mulwarree Shire:-**

1. **Bottle Dump**- requested move to a better location ;-completed by Shire and is working well
2. **Road Signs**- requested better road signs including wildlife warnings ,and speed limits posted on the entry and exit to the Village .: Only the Wombat signage has been addressed so far.
3. **Road Safety** – Following several accidents we requested the Woodward/Jones Creek bridge have a proper camber on the Goulburn side.
4. **Road Safety** –Requested Police to actively target weekend 4x4 drivers and others using Marulan Road as a one way road and speedway.
5. **Village Rubbish Bins**-A request was sent to the Mulwarree Shire for one or two large rubbish bins or skips because rubbish is being

dumped outside the Hall and in the Village Park . Large bins are to be placed on the Lookdown Road and on the edge of town as soon as the foundations have been laid.

- **Centenary of Progress Association**

**Centenary Celebrations to be held on the long weekend-5/6 October 2002 are well on the way to being organised.**

**In 1901 the first Progress meeting was held in the Cooper's drawing room across the road from here.**

**We acknowledge the continuous involvement of local people in their local community .Bungonia has many interest groups which contribute to our area. Thankyou to all these groups for your support to the Bungonia Progress Association.**

**I would like to thank all the Progress office bearers and the members for this year 2001/2002 and especially mention the great support of Diana Moran.**

## **President's Report for the Year 30<sup>th</sup> June, 2002.**

The past year was the 4<sup>th</sup> of a 5 year term. We were very sorry to lose yet another Trustee, Karen Fabri. I would like to thank her very much for the services she gave as Secretary of the Trust for the 3 and a half of the last 4 years and the effort she applied to projects undertaken in the Park.

This year has again been fruitful with our receiving a grant for fencing off the erosion areas, once used as tip sites, to prevent any further dumping of rubbish in the park. We have also received a grant to purchase a second rocker to be placed near the play equipment area.

This year has seen the establishment of a garden around the War Memorial with rosemary being planted in it. The plants have been badly grazed by rabbits and ferreters were encouraged to try to decrease their numbers.

The ANZAC day Ceremony saw the flying of both the Australian and New Zealand flags and was well attended once again. Our thanks go to the Bungonia Progress Association for providing refreshments.

The Trust has developed a Rivercare Plan in conjunction with the Dept. of Land & Water. This has enabled the Trust to put an application in to the Dept. to stabilise Woodward's Creek and to remove the willows from Bungonia Creek. Hopefully, the last year of the Trust will see a start on this major project.

One sad aspect this year was the theft of the donation box from the BBQ area. We are hopeful that a new box will be installed shortly.

We are very appreciative of the MSC who has mown, not only the park, but also the village over the past summer and a 'Work for the Dole' Team who spent 2 days cleaning up the Tennis Courts and surrounding area.

I should also like to mention how appreciative we are to have obtained access to the Bungonia Transit Stock Reserve, which will aid in our attempt to revitalise the flora and fauna corridor through Bungonia village.

Lastly, I thank my fellow trustees for their efforts to create the memorial garden, put up the fence, water the trees, mow the grass and maintain the park facilities. My thanks go to Moira for all her efforts in writing grant applications to try to obtain funds for the projects we aspired to develop in our initial plan. I think it has been another very fruitful year.

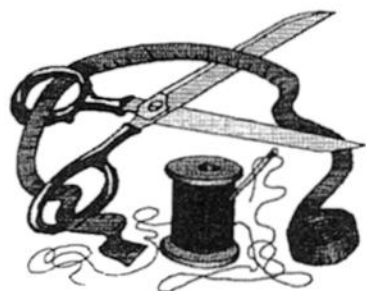

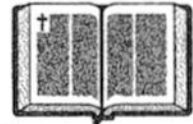

### **A NEW TECHNOLOGY CENTRE PROPOSED FOR THE WINDELLAMA AND BUNGONIA AREAS**

The Windellama and Bungonia Progress Associations are proposing to take advantage of the Shire's policy of establishing community access to email, internet and general computer services. The service would be similar to that offered by the Library.

Johnno's Corner has offered to provide space for the Centre. There would be a number of computers with net access and generally used software for word processing, account keeping, desktop publishing and photo editing as well as some games and scanners and printers. The Committee will also ask for a good fast digital photocopier that would be available for public use and could be used to copy the Bungonia Times and Windellama News if required.

Training would be available in computer skills on a small group basis. The courses would depend to some extent on getting local people to share their skills (a small fee would be involved)

The Centre would be available for public use, but there would be a small charge as the facility has to be shown to be self sufficient after three years.

Before making the application the committee has to know if residents would make use of the Centre.

1. Would you use the centre ?
2. If so what times would you like access ie. Morning, afternoon, week-ends after hours.
3. Would you be interested in being a trainer? (Trainers are paid)
4. Would you be interested in being trained ?

Inverary Creek Landcare has worked closely with Southern Tablelands Farm Forestry Network (STFFN) since its formation in 1996. Anyone interested in commercial tree planting should become a member of STFFN to receive the newsletter and other free services, as well as cheaper tree prices. Membership is free. STFFN is also a RPC (Regional Plantation Committee) which is at present funded by the Commonwealth to help implement the 2020 Vision in trebling Australia's plantation.

STFFN now has over 600 members, and provides a range of services and advice, including 20 different fact sheets on pines and natives species, covering topics from establishing to expected commercial returns. Training is also provided for members at a subsidised cost, covering topics such as the Master Tree Growers course, chain saw training plus other training in topics such as planting, fertilising and weed control.

Additional information is disseminated to members through the quarterly newsletter, the web page, through attendance field days and talks to interested groups. STFFN through a Government grant, produces a farm forestry video "A Winner as a practical guide to farm forestry on the Southern Tablelands. Provision for an extension service to members for establishment and tending of native species plantation and pine plantations, plus prepare management plans for members with native forests.

Assisted landholders to establish between 120 and 180 hectares of pine plantations, and between 10 and 50 hectares of native species plantations each year through provision of extension advice and sale at cost price of native and pine seedlings. These plantations have been established for commercial, aesthetic and environmental purposes, and STFFN encourages all land holders to keep a commercial focus on all plantings through proper management.

Established a number of trials and demonstration sites in the region to demonstrate the effectiveness of trees for windbreaks, for weed control (including serrated tussock and sifton bush), for salinity control, for native species selection and to demonstrate pine management techniques. These trials will be measured and recorded on an ongoing basis, and used for future field days

Provided sponsorship to six ANU Forestry students to undertake an honors degree. These projects have provided benefits to STFFN, as the research is all of relevance on topics such as species selection, assessment of private forests (especially dry sclerophyll forests), understanding the roading costs associated with harvesting and site capability studies for plantation on the Southern Tablelands.

Establishing of a marketing pool for members with existing pine plantations that cannot gain access to markets for their products. This is still in its infancy, but already some timber is being sold on behalf of members, and STFFN is working closely with processors, harvesting contractors and log breakers to establish an ongoing market for private plantations.

Establishment of a markets for native species timbers, including provision of employment and marketing opportunities for small scale portable saw millers in conjunction with private growers. There are developing opportunities for sale of specialty timbers from private native forests.

Provision of work for specialist training through the STFFN training programme, which has allowed a small business to be established, and provision for regular ongoing work for a silviculture which has allowed them to expand their business and employ additional people.

Many of the valuable services provided by STFFN are not available through any other organisation, or are not readily available from the one. STFFN will continue to work closely with other organisations such as Australian Forest growers, Greening Australia, Catchment Coordinating Committees and Landcare Groups to provide farm forestry advice for environmental benefits, commercial benefits, industry development opportunities and value adding.

There are still many challenges ahead for STFFN, with the major challenges being the expansion of the plantation resource (both native species and pines), development of the market for growers with existing pine plantations.

STFFN is confident that it can continue to play a vital and important role in the development of a diverse, economic, viable and sustainable plantation, and native forest timber industry.

# Gardening in October

October is a very busy time garden wise! The worst of the frosts are over and spring flowering trees and shrubs are showing mass displays of blooms. One small tree which is most attractive is the Golden Chain Tree (*Laburnum Vosii*) and it takes 4 or 5 years to reach a height of 3m.

In October some of the climbers come into flower too. The *Clematis montana rubens* makes a magnificent display, requiring only very light mesh to climb over, just make sure the roots are well mulched during the summer as they grow close to the surface.

Vegetable Seeds to sow are: carrots, parsnips, beetroot, peas, cabbage, silver beet, radish, cucumber, zucchini, melons, pumpkins, squash, parsley, capsicums sweet corn, beans, celery and tomatoes.

Tomatoes grow best in a sunny position containing plenty of compost. When planting out new seedlings, apply a dressing of complete fertiliser, high in phosphorous during the main growing season. Fertilise every 2 weeks with a water soluble fertiliser on cool, overcast days or late in the evening. Fertilising during the day can result in the plants being burnt.

Most varieties require staking and in our climate, the strongest prevailing winds come from the west to the north. Drive the stake into the ground first, then plant the tomato on the eastern side of the stake, the reason for this is to that the plant is blown against the stake. If planted on the opposite side the plant can break off at the ties.

Remember, to increase the quantity and quality of the tomatoes, pruning can be beneficial. Remove the laterals which grow from the leaf base.

Flowers: there are also lots of flowers that can be planted now, some can be used as borders to make any garden look stunning or they can be used in groups to act as pots of colour throughout the garden.

By using different leaf textures and leaf colours you can produce a magnificent display in your own garden. Browse your local nursery and colour your garden.

Bulbs: when spring flowering bulbs such as hyacinths, daffodils, jonquils, ranunculus and anemone finish flowering, this is the month to feed them with a complete fertiliser, this assists the bulbs for next years flowers.

Remember, leave the bulbs leaves to die down naturally. This also feeds the plant for next year. Bulbs can also be dug up and kept in cloth sacks in a cool dark place until next winter or they can be left in the ground to flower next year.

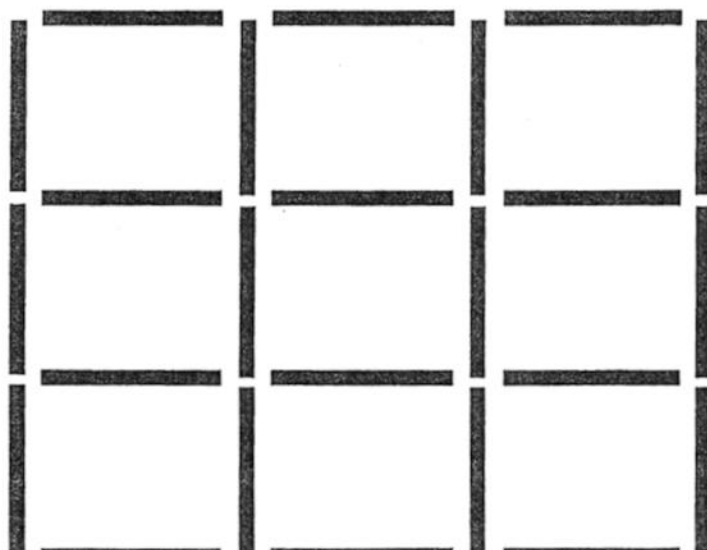
