## GARDENING IN SEPTEMBER

Make sure your roses have been well pruned and sprayed with Triforine to prevent Black Spot. Peaches and nectarines are to be sprayed with lime sulphur. Divide and plant out water lilies and chrysanthemums. Plant out gladioli at fortnightly intervals to get a longer show of flowers. Complete the dividing and planting out of perennials such as Michaelmas daisy, phlox, achillea and scabiosa. Plant spring and summer annuals such as sweet peas, snapdragons, stocks and asters. Be careful not to damage lily shoots which are emerging now, and remove the dead leaves from the iris. Cut back buddleia, hydrangea and ceanothus. Complete mulching with compost. Sow new lawns. Plant asparagus, peas, lettuce, carrots, strawberries and globe artichokes.

# LANDCARE

INVERARY CREEK LANDCARE UPDATE

GROWTH RATE AND SURVIVAL IN 1997 PLANTINGS OF P. RADIATA.

## INVERARY TRIALS.

Trial blocks of approx 50 trees were planted to show the effect of weed control, mounding and fertilizing in P. radiata. The 1997-8 summer and autumn was quite severe really highlighting the importance of good ground preparation and weed control.

Grasses and weeds compete with young trees for nutrients and water. Trees deprived of these will show poor growth rate or die as many did in the dry summer. Fertilizing, while encouraging tree growth also favours the growth of competitive weeds, so without spraying will be ineffective. The comparison of mounded versus unmounded tree lines also show both the importance of water retention in the mounds and better weed control.

EFFECTS OF WEED CONTROL. ( 4.4gms of Macspread. Forest Mix Granules.)

PREPARATION	SPRAYED	NO WEED CONTROL
RIP AND MOUNDED	82.3	45.6
RIP ONLY	74.4	42.0
(ALL FERTILIZED)

## EFFECTS OF FERTILIZED.

All ripped, mounded and sprayed.

Height in cms at 12 months

FERTILIZED (150gms of STARTERPHOS) 80.9

NO FERTILIZER. 71.2.

The effects of fertilizer is not so dramatic as spraying, but will improve root growth so will show up more in 12 months.

The results are even more dramatic when considering survival rates.

EFFECTS OF WEED CONTROL AND MOUNDING (all fertilized).

RIP-MOUND-SPRAY	95% Survival.
RIP-MOUND	68% "
RIP-SPRAY	90% "
RIP ONLY- NO SPRAY.	45% "

The results dramatically show the importance of correct preparation and management for good results. The high survival and good growth rates of ripping - mounding and timely herbicide application was also proven in a larger plantation of 16000 where random survival counts exceed 95%.

All plants were locally produced cuttings.

# In Council

## with Inda Evans

### Airports

It looks like State politicians (Government and Opposition) are backing away from the Badgerys Creek airport proposal and suggesting "the Goulburn Option" may be worth looking at.

The airport noise charts developed for Badgerys, and superimposed onto Gundry Plains, make it very clear that Bungonia - village and surrounding areas - would be in for a mighty din of international jumbos if the Mayor of Goulburn and her crew get their way.

If you don't want to put up with that, I strongly recommend you put pen to paper and write to every Member of Parliament you can think of, including the Prime Minister and Premier, to put your views. The address is simply c/- Parliament House, Sydney or Canberra.

I stand for no airport being imposed on Mulwaree. There is no way it could "benefit" tourism or business in the region as claimed. But it would surely destroy my lifestyle!

### Weeds

Crop Care Australasia have advised they will no longer be supplying the imported herbicide, Frenock.

It was just about the only thing that would control Serrated Tussock, expensive though it was.

Council still have some stocks of Frenock available for contract work and if you are interested, please give the weeds section a call.

In the meantime we are

lobbying for a concerted effort by all rural Councils and State/Federal Governments to get involved in a biological control program for this weed.

### No Fishing??

The NSW Government has imposed yet more legislation on us.

This time, it's from NSW Fisheries and is about threatened species (fish and marine vegetation) conservation.

Future proposed developments in the Shire will now need to assess the potential impact of their proposals on threatened species and prepare a "Species Impact Statement".

No doubt it will go hand in hand with Environmental Impact Statements!

So, if you have any water on your property, be sure you check it out for any rare fish lurking under the surface!

### Development Decisions

A subdivision has been approved on Jerrara Road for five lots - three at around 10 ha each and two around 40ha.

An application for a free range poultry farm on Jacqua Road was refused on the grounds that it did not comply with Council's Poultry Development Guidelines which require specific minimum distances in addition to a number of other environmental conditions.

### Roads

In addition to the long list of scheduled works for the year, there will be many more jobs on the agenda as a result of the recent heavy rains. (Wollongong is said to have

experienced a 1 in 300 years flood - does anyone know how heavy or light the flooding was in our area?)

There have been a number of requests for specific road and other works recently and I expect to have a full report to you on these next issue.

### Out of Order

My apologies to anyone who tried to phone me last month.

The phone was out of order during the big wet and it took Telstra eight days to get a technician out to fix it.

### Council Meetings

The fourth Thursday every month is Ordinary Meeting day, starting at 9am. These are open meetings and everyone is welcome to come along and listen - see how your Council makes decisions about your area.

Occasionally there is a confidential meeting (on issues such as staffing or commercial-in-confidence) which may delay the start of the Council meeting proper but usually by no more than half an hour maximum.
